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

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


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Something Special Happened in 2010

The efforts of Kathy Alnwick, under Curt Yaws' ever-watchful eyes, demonstrated that it is possible to have a wonderful gala without breaking the bank. It will undoubtedly be the most costeffective Installation Banquet in recent memory, and in my opinion, one of the most enjoyable. On a personal level, I do have some concern about that huge grin on Curt's face as he handed the gavel over to me. What does he know?

Special Awards

Each year there are a few "special awards" presented at the installation dinner, recognizing exceptional individual efforts and contributions over the past year. The outgoing Board is faced with the very difficult task of deciding which members are most deserving of these awards. I'd like to take a few moments here to introduce some of our most outstanding club members.

John Straub was selected as the 2010 Enthusiast of the Year. If you haven't met John yet, (or least read some of the articles he writes for the Witness) you probably haven't been with the club very long. I think of him as the collective memory of PCA-SDR: Club Historian, Vintage Racing Chair, driving force behind the Club's presence at the Coronado Speed Festival—quite a contribution from a long-standing and very active member. And if you haven't checked out his blog, *Along for the Ride* (johnstraub. blogspot.com), you're missing some very educational and entertaining articles on the history of hot-rods, dragsters, and of course, Porsches.

This year, Steve and Araceli Lopez were the recipients of the Family of the Year award. This father/daughter team cochaired the Concours Committee and put on another successful concours at Spanish Landing. They approach concours with seemingly boundless energy and enthusiasm. They were also active in organizing instruction on concours preparation and judging. Oh, and did I mention, they also won their class at this year's concours?

Steve Snedeker, who took on the Goodie Store with drive, determination, energy and fresh ideas, was awarded the Porsche Spirit Award for 2010. He managed to move out the old "tired" stock and began to acquire new, appealing items that revitalized interest in the Goodie Store. Sadly, the Porsche Spirit Award had to be given posthumously as Steve passed away unexpectedly at the end of November.

This year we reinstituted an old PCA-SDR tradition by awarding Katie Kinninger a special Porsche Spark Plug award. By carefully selecting the venue, the caterer, and obtaining event sponsorship for the Volunteer party, she was able to host a fantastic event while coming in way under budget. She sets an example of thinking outside the box (or should I say "driving a different line?") that each of us can learn from.

Community Service

A special Community Service Award was given to Mike Dougherty for his efforts in organizing and conducting the first ever PCA-SDR Street Survival Teen Driving School. In my opinion, this has the potential to become the most socially significant program that I have seen during my tenure with the Club.

If you know Mike, you know that he's what I call a "below-the-radar" kind of guy. He's always been willing to pitch in and lend a hand at club events, but he's not the type to ever grab the microphone in an attempt to draw attention to himself. A couple years ago, Mike became concerned, as did so many people in San Diego, about the rash of fatal highway accidents involving local high school students. Mike is a competitive driver on the big-tracks and a long-standing instructor within PCA. He's taught at

our Performance Driving School (PDS), at autocrosses, and at time trials. He knows that when something unexpected happens on the track, or on the highway, the driving skills taught at our PDS can literally save lives. He wanted somehow to help our young drivers acquire those skills—skills they are quite unlikely to learn in a conventional driver's education program taught within our school systems.

Mike discovered a program conducted by the BMW Club and sponsored by the Tire Rack. He volunteered to instruct at their teen driving school in Los Angeles, and then he encouraged several other PCA-SDR driving instructors to participate in a BMW/Tire Rack event in San Diego. Last year, Mike felt it was time to establish a similar program within PCA-SDR.

When Mike came to the Board with a proposal to establish the first PCA-SDR/Tire Rack Street Survival Teen Driving School, his vision, dedication, and passion was so strong that everyone wanted to help. That first event was conducted in the parking lot at Qualcomm Stadium back in September and is nicely described in detail in a November Witness article written by Martha McGowan. Mike relied on quite a number of other PCA-SDR volunteers, but there's no doubt in my mind that without Mike's leadership, the event would not have occurred.

As a Club instructor, I participated in the Street Survival Teen Driving School and it was surely the most gratifying thing I have done within the Club. I never felt more proud to be associated with PCA-SDR. My hats off to you, Mike.

One final note: The biannual PCA-SDR Performance Driving School (not the Teen Street Survival School) has been scheduled for the weekend of March 4-6. We expect another sell out, so sign up early. See ad in this month's *Witness* for details.



Glitz and Glam

The new display at the San Diego Auto Museum is entitled "Glitz and Glam," and features significant custom coach work and classic cars from the 1920s, 30s and 40s. Back in the day when only a few people had lots of money, and those who had it were not ashamed to show it, or even flaunt it. When one thinks of custom coach work on European and American classic cars, one usually thinks of the "Roaring Twenties" and into the 1930s. One such classic is the 1929 Cord L29 on display. Several of the Museum's Cadillacs also qualify in this category, including the gorgeous 1931 Cadillac 452 Roadster in glistening crimson and ebony. Powered by a 452 cubic inch V-16 that produced 185 horsepower at 3,400 revolutions per minute, the approximately 5,000 pound car could accelerate to a top speed of 85 miles per hour. Another Cadillac dream car is a bright green and tan 1932 Cadillac powered by a 368 cubic inch V-12 that produces 135 horsepower at 3,400 rpm transmitted through a fourspeed synchromesh transmission. Built in Detroit, Michigan, the car would travel at a maximum speed of 85 mph. Looking at these beautiful cars one can easily understand Cadillac's claim to have been "the standard of the world."

Cadillac Versus Lincoln

An interesting comparison with the Cadillacs is a 1935 Lincoln V-12 Sedan de Ville. The Ford Motor Company created Lincoln to compete with Cadillac for high-end clientele. But Cadillac always had the advantage of better design and far superior marketing. The forties cars are represented by a 1949 Rolls Royce Wraith and a 1941 Lincoln V-12. Lincoln also introduced the Continental, which was a real automotive tour de force. Museum staff are presenting the cars in several diaramas, in addition to static displays. Anyone who has ever visited the BMW Museum in Munich or the Peterson in Los Angeles will feel right at home. You really get a better feel for the car and the times by being able to see the car in a period setting.

The rest of the regular collection is still on display including the English cars, an extensive classic motorcycle collection, and a variety of early "horseless carriages." There is also a small section for children who can watch the animated film "Cars" while coloring "draw within the lines" drawings of some classic cars. The Museum's library has an extensive collection of automobile magazines, advertising brochures, and assembly and

repair manuals on a wide range of vehicles. The library is always worth a visit. Museum staff have recently enlarged the Museum's gift shop section and offer auto motif clothing items, model cars, and an excellent collection of automotive books. One of my favorite books on sale there is "The Speed Merchants," which offers chapters on many of the pioneers in Southern California speed equipment manufacturing from the 1940s and later. Included in the book are chapters on Chet Herbert of roller tappet cam fame, Ed Iskendarian, another cam grinder, Offenhauser, Edelbrock, and many more.

In talking to Museum Director Paula Brandes about the Automobile Museum, she assures me that her dedicated staff have done a terrific job to create interesting displays and to continue to bring visitors into the museum. As we all know, these difficult financial times have created many layoffs, reductions in staffing, and reduced hours in many areas of the economy. Fortunately, the Auto Museum has thus far managed to weather the financial storm and is doing better than the previous year. But the Museum still needs financial and volunteer support as well. If you have a few extra hours, please come down and volunteer. Membership fees are very reasonable, especially with a car club membership, and you have unlimited access to the Museum. Next month I will have photos of the new display vehicles and dioramas and details on these lovely cars.





Our serving crew of John and Monique Straub, Eleanor Myrus, Bob and Yvette Gilman, Lori Chesley and Mike Brown, Steve Lopez, Keith Verlague, and Kathy and I unloaded the food and set about making the preparations for serving. Roberto had his staff prepare a wonderful Mexican dinner of enchiladas, tamales, rice, beans, and chips and salsa. Kathy provided the cakes for dessert, and Keith and I donated the water and sodas.

The kids and their families had gathered early, and eagerly lined up for the food upon its arrival. The children were all polite and well-mannered, and within about 30 minutes, we had served the delicious Mexican cuisine to about 100 children, most of them ranging in ages from 5 to 12 years old. Many came back for seconds.

Kathy, always striving to make everything as fun as possible, had arranged for Santa Claus to show up and spend some time with the kids. When Santa arrived, the children were completely surprised and delighted to see him. They were so overjoyed, they got out of the dessert line, and soon there was a line of excited, chattering children waiting to talk to Santa. They younger kids were most thrilled. They climbed up on Santa's lap and told him what they wanted for Christmas. Everyone enjoyed watching Santa and the kids.

The family dinner was a resounding success, and virtually all of the dinner was consumed, with only a bit of cake left. In short order, everything was cleaned up and we said good night to the children and their families. We thanked Santa for taking time out of his busy schedule to talk to these wonderful children. Thank you Roberto for your continuing generosity to provide food. Thank you Kathy for the time and energy you put into making this event so special. And thank you servers for taking time out of your lives to give the Monarch School children a little something special.

Since first opening in 1954, nearly 2 million sick and injured children have been treated there. Rady Children's Hospital is the county's only hospital dedicated solely to pediatrics, and is the region's designated pediatric trauma center. I'm sure we all know a family that has benefited from the care and treatment there.

SDR's Charity Chair, Kathy Alnwick, coordinated a toy drive during November and December where members were asked to take a toy to any club event that occurred during those months. In that time frame, many generous club members donated hundreds of toys at the various club events.

Kathy also organized a breakfast for December 19, where members met at Miguel's in Old Town before delivering the toys that had been collected. The day was rainy, but that didn't deter 35 club members who showed up with their children (and more toys) to spend some time together and enjoy each other's company before heading out to the hospital. As we were all finishing breakfast, and to everyone's great surprise and delight, particularly the children, Santa Claus showed up. The excited, eager children had a chance to sit on Santa's lap and tell him what they wanted for Christmas. The only thing missing was Rudolph, who Santa said had a little nose cold and was at home in the North Pole.

After breakfast, and in spite of the light drizzle, Santa climbed into the rumble seat of a 1931 Model-T Ford, owned and driven by past club member Tom Eggert, and led a procession of 20

Porsches to Rady Children's Hospital. We were met by Lori Mathios, the Annual Giving Director. All of the toys were unloaded and placed around the fountain in front of the Hospital. Everyone gathered around the fountain to admire the cavalcade of toys. We were very lucky as the rains held off during the toy delivering ceremonies. After we loaded all the toys into the hospital bins, and Lori thanked the club for our generosity, the rains came. By then, we didn't mind.

Kathy and I would like to thank all the club members who donated toys and participated in the caravan. We very much appreciate your thoughtfulness and generosity. Thanks to you, the club had a very successful toy drive and a lot of children will receive a gift to help make their stay at Rady Children's Hospital a bit more bearable. Don't forget, March 8th is when Parade Registration opens. Ready for a Savannah Parade?














January Meeting

Board Minutes

The January 2011 Board of Directors meeting was held at the Brown/Chesley home. Board members in attendance were Carl Scragg, Bill Behun, Monique Straub, Cathy Young, Terry Barnum, Leigh Rayner and Greg Phillips, along with Curt Yaws as advisor. The meeting was called to order at 7:01. Minutes from the December 2010 meeting were approved unanimously.

President's Report

Carl Scragg reported that 220 new members joined in 2010 and congratulated Angela Avitt for her efforts. Primary: 1416 (+25 over 2010), Affiliate: 1063 (-1), Total: 2479 (+24 over 2010).

The April board meeting may be a Saturday breakfast meeting. Kathy Alwick is investigating venues with Miguels in Old Town as a possibility.

Curt Yaws reported that David Waxman from Tesla Motors will generously make two cars available for test drives at the January autocross and will also be donating \$500. A recommendation was made to notify press of the event.

Pioneer Porsche will not be donating to the Installation Dinner. Children's Hospital/Monarch Schools will not attend the Installation Dinner but will be present to process the silent auction.

All committee Chair Positions were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

Cathy Young reported that all accounts are reconciled as of the end of December. Expenses exceeded income resulting in a net decrease in cash.

Major expenses included DE, Time Trial, Autocross and Witness printing and mailing. Major income sources included Witness advertising and the Autocross.

Chair Reports

Autocross. No report. Tom Brown noted that 2010 classes will be continued through 2011 with a change to the new classing system in 2012.

Auto Museum. Michael Harris reported that January is the last month for the Rolls Show of custom and classic cars. A Glitz and Glam exhibit of 1920-40's cars will be held in late January. 2010 museum attendance improved over 2009. Michael will provide details to the Witness team.

CDIs. Joel Bowman and Sean Molloy reported that they have created a preliminary budget for the Performance Driving School and will email it to the board in the next two weeks. Core costs have increased, so they are getting competitive bids from other caterers and proposed the possibility of replacing full breakfasts with continental style instead. Keith Verlaque suggested that to control cost, many instructors already have shirts and may not need new ones. March 4-6 for the Performance Driving School was approved unanimously.

Charity. Carl's motion to amend the standing rules to eliminate all but non-cash items and goods and services of a nominal value less than \$100 for charitable purposes was unanimously approved. This will prevent the club from exposure to charitable tax liabilities. Carl stated that all future charitable events should be clearly separate from the club, with no contributions from a sponsor flowing through the club. Bill Hartsock further advised that the club not be listed in charity event advertisements in the Witness.

Martha McGowan and Kathy Alwick's requests for a Toy Drive and Sock and Underwear Drive were unanimously approved.

Concours. Steve and Aracelli Lopez presented the budget reconciliation for 2010. There was a slight loss due to low turnout, inclement weather and a poor economy. The reconciliation was unanimously approved with the addition of a refund from the Port and the inclusion of Zone 8 fees.

Goodie Store. Monique reported that Skip and Leslie Shirley have agreed to take over the Goodie Store. Terry will assist in the transfer of Goodie Store items.

Membership. Tom Brown requested approval to print the Membership Directory at a cost not to exceed \$500. The motion was unanimously approved. Standing Rules and By-Laws will now be online rather than printed in the Directory.

Military Liaison. Don Auten is pursuing the possibility of developing relationships with the new Del Mar race track owners in the hopes that the club may have access to the parking lot for events.

Region Rules. Tom Brown will email proposed changes of the Standing Rules to the Board in the next week.

Social. Dates for the Last Tuesday Socials were approved unanimously. A Father's Day brunch/tour on June 19 was unanimously approved. Kathy Alwick reported that she is considering a Mystery Weekend and a Progressive Dinner tour and will submit a budget request at a later date. Village Walk in Otay has once again invited members to bring their cars to an event and will pay the club \$200. Date to be determined.

January Meeting, continued

Chair Reports

Tech Sessions. Martin Lipp & Jim Binford will coordinate with Carl to determine dates. Keith Verlaque suggested these events occur on third Wednesdays.

Time Trial. Robert Baizer was praised for the meeting he hosted to answer questions regarding the new Time Trial and DE formats. September 24-25 at Willow Springs and November 12-13 at Buttonwillow dates were unanimously approved.

Tours. Mike Brown requested February 27 for a North County tour and April 30 for a Palm Springs tour. A motion to add these dates to the calendar was unanimously approved. Keith Verlaque offered to assist with flyer creation.

Vintage Racing. This year's Coronado event conflicts with the September 24-25 Willow Springs event, and Carl has asked board members to help John Straub find volunteers since there is a likelihood that many will opt for Willow Springs.

Web Team. Tom Brown requested the final chairperson updates and photos from new board members. Tom reported that March 1 is the scheduled launch for the new website. There is a suggestion that negative discussion on the forums be policed more actively by the moderators.

Witness Team. Everyone present is extremely pleased with the new look of the Witness.

New Business

Cathy Young described the proposed 2011 budget with the goal of each event covering expenses with the exception of the Vintage Racing event, the Windblown Witness and volunteer appreciation gifts. Carl stated that currently there is no subsidy for the 2012 Installation Dinner and described the difficulty in budgeting events in light of lower attendance and increased costs at all events. Much spirited discussion ensued with suggestions including combining the Driver's and Installation dinners, enlisting a sponsorship chairperson to

find sponsors to help defray costs, looking at new member registrations after the Coronado event to gauge its effectiveness, and allowing other marques at Autocrosses and DEs. The budget was approved unanimously with the inclusion of an updated Concours budget. 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
