



Plans are continuing for our next big social event—the New Year's Eve Party. We're hoping to make this the biggest year-end bash the Club has seen. It will start with an exclusive after-hours entrance to the San Diego Auto Show (featuring a special PCA-SDR exhibit entitled "Porsche, a 60-year Love Affair"), with a private cocktail reception at the auto show, dinner and dancing in the main ballroom upstairs at the San Diego Convention Center, live music from the exciting "Blues Doctors" (featuring PCA-SDR members Jack Miller on lead guitar and Robert Baizer on percussion). The Pontiac Story Continues

The San Diego Auto Museum's new display features Volkswagen, opening the first week in October. Everyone has owned a VW at one time or another, and one of the features is a short film clip by different owners telling a VW story. At the museum, everyone will not receive 15 minutes of fame but 15 seconds. There should be some great stories. I should have a preview of some of those stories for next month's *Witness*.

The Story of Pontiac continues. The display features an early Pontiac, a 1932 model, and cars through the '40s, '50s, '60s and beyond. Viewers will learn why Pontiacs were known as "Silver Streaks" and where "Wide-Track" came from. Many of the cars on display were ahead of their time. The 1960 Tempest convertible in light blue is a good example. The car is powered by a 4-cylinder overhead cam engine with a two-speed transaxle powered by "rope" drive. The 2009

Solstice coupe is another example. Powered by a blown 4-cylinder motor, only a handful of the cars were built before Pontiac closed its doors. The 1977 Pontiac Catalina/nee Nova represents the painful reasons Pontiac is no longer building cars. In the 1970s, General Motors simply lost its way. Instead of building the exciting cars they had built in the late 1950s and 1960s, GM turned out corporate cars that all looked alike and brand identity and loyalty became a thing of the past.

On Friday evening, August 12th, the museum held a reception for the Pontiac display and to recognize and show appreciation to the many owners who generously lent their cars for the display. Talking to these owners was instructive and a little sad. The owner of the 1977 Catalina had been a life long Pontiac owner and fan and a member of several Pontiac clubs. His Catalina/Nova had been reliable transportation for him and his children after he turned the car over to

them. While he admitted the Catalina was not as exciting as many of the Pontiacs he owned before or since, still the Catalina offered reliable transportation for thousands of miles over many years of use. In recognition of that appreciation, he had restored the car to as new condition. Another owner of the 1960 Tempest Convertible told of his enjoyment of an advanced design car that was near original except for a repaint and still looked near new and was serviceable in every way. Several Pontiac owners lamented at how quickly GM had turned over the chief executives at the various divisions, including Pontiac, so even the leadership lost their identity with the brand and were simply looking to move up the corporate ladder. How do you keep employees loyal to the company when the boss is not loyal to the company or the employees? Sad

Lots of new things at the museum. There is a 1955 Shasta "canned ham" small travel trailer that has become an artist's canvas. The trailer was discovered in a weed patch in Los Angeles and artists asked if they could have it to clean up and use as an easel. The result is Miss Lucy, an interesting series of graphics painted on the side with a video display to tell the story. Also new is a 1911 Ford Model "T" Speedster. It looks very racy in its bright red paint work and varnished wood. Twelve hundred pounds with a 177 CID flathead 4-cylinder motor costing \$850 in 1911 dollars was a bargain then. Even more so today, if you could find one. Gone is the 1948 Tucker. As interesting as the car was to museum goers, it became too valuable and the owner sold it. Pleas to Mr. George Lucas were unavailing.

Another new feature this month is a monthly rotation of a display car from one of the 90 or so car clubs in the greater San Diego area. This month the Corvette Owners Club features a tribute 1963 Corvette Grand Sport. The original car was the brain child of Zora Arkus Duntov, who wanted a lighter and more powerful sports

car to race against the Shelby Ford Cobras. The prototypes were equipped with 377 CID small block V-8s fitted with Weber sidedraft carburetors. The cars showed promise on the track but GM corporate decided racing was not healthy for the corporate image and killed the project.

One area where the museum staff really wants to expand is in interest from the county's car clubs. Very few car club members belong to the museum. So the question was raised: What can the museum do to attract new car club members? Or, what can the museum do to make membership more attractive to the Porsche club? Any ideas? Please let me know. One fact you may not know-the auto museum has really attempted to reach out to all areas of San Diego. One good example was the low rider display some months ago. Despite the fact that the low rider display only lasted two months, it drew more viewers than any show the museum has offered. And many of those attending had never visited a museum in Balboa Park before. I submit that the museum really offers a hand out to young people everywhere. Please support their efforts and let me know how we can improve your enjoyment of this great facility. Shop tours of the restoration facilities in National City maybe? Your input is needed.

Recently the museum has expanded its gift store both in space and type of merchandise handled. The museum is now a licensed distributor for Griot's Garage car care products. So you will have another reason to visit the museum. Hurry down to visit the Pontiac collection, as it will end soon. And tell them you are from the Porsche club. More news on the VW display next month. X

Shelter Island Concours

The weekend of August 6th, 2011 will go down as an absolute feast of Porsche events for San Diego Region members. If you love concours cars you could have attended the PCA-SDR Concours at Shoreline Park on Shelter Island in San Diego, as well as the 912 Registry Concours adjacent to the SDR event on Saturday, August 6th. On Sunday, August 7th, you could have attended National City's Automobile Heritage Day event at Kimball Park where 27 Porsches were displayed, or you could have autocrossed your car at the "Q" with 100 or so other SDR drivers. And if you were really energetic, you could have trailered your Porsche back to Savannah, Georgia for the Porsche Parade. All on the same weekend.

But let's talk about the club concours at Shoreline Park. Concours Chairs Steve Lopez and Araceli Lopez have selected a number of beautiful locales around Mission Bay in recent years for the annual concours. Based on comments from this year's crowd, Shoreline Park on Shelter Island was the best site yet. The cars were surrounded with clear water views and San Diego and North Island in the background. Trees sheltered the cars and the lawn where the cars were situated offered a beautiful green blanket. The biggest challenge was loading the cars onto the lawn over a high concrete curbing. Steve Grosekemper was up to the challenge and offered custom made ramps that allowed even the lowest cars to safely navigate the passage. (Watching a pristine 1959 Convertible 'D' inch its way up the ramp was a real heart stopper.)

The concours crew consisted of the Lopez family, Steve, Maria, Araceli, and Anysse. They were assisted by volunteers John Straub, Michael Harris and Anton Davison. Setting up in the dark at 6AM was a challenge. Easy ups for the registration and judges tables were set

up, followed by the setting up of tables for breakfast and lunch. Car placement was to commence at 7:00am but early birds started arriving at 6:20. John Straub set up a chair and sign along Shelter Island Drive in order to direct cars. Araceli and Steve Lopez directed cars over the ramps to ensure safe navigation from street to park, while Maria Lopez was the registrar. Michael Harris and Steve Lopez then directed cars to appropriate locations along the Park and placed signs for the different classes. There were a total of 21 judged cars plus 20 Porsches for display only. While the cars were still being placed in position, the judges meeting was held.

The weather could not have been nicer. A cool morning gave way to sunshine with a nice breeze blowing off the water. While the judges were going over procedures, participants were busy with polishing rags, q-tips and the usual detritus of concours prep. Tom and Bev Gould helped out by offering car care products for sale from TCs Garage at a tent they had set up. They even sold out of their tire dressing spray. Many concours participants use a dressing that becomes sticky and oily in the heat and results in a noted infraction. The TC Garage spray does not produce a sticky film. The event produced many spectators, including President Carl Scragg, Charity Chairs Kathy Alnwick and Martha McGowan, Membership Chair Angela Avitt, Keith Verlaque, Jim Binford, Al Schlegel, C.J. Caccese, George Alspaugh and many others. Monica Bockman was chairperson for the 1912 Registry Concours next door, but she and Dan Chambers did stop by to say "hello." Several regular participants at the concours were missing, such as Skip and Leslie Shirley, Paul Young, Tom and Susan Brown and club photographer Greg Phillips as they were all in Georgia attending the Parade.

Judging started around 10_{AM} and continued until noon, when a catered lunch from Pat and Oscar's was served. Many of our readers are unfamiliar with

Porsche concours prep and tend to shy away from participating. Why? Well, you probably have read too many stories about concours prep at the National/ Parade level. While it does take a lot of hard work to prepare your Porsche for competition at the Club/Zone level, it is also very rewarding, and once your car is properly prepped, it is not that difficult to keep up. Every Spring the Zone offers an all day class in concours judging, which is an excellent way to learn the ins and outs of what needs to be done to prepare and show your car. Local and Zone 8 Concours judging standards emphasize the need to keep people interested in competing. As a result, judges try and educate participants in ways to make their cars better.

This is not to say they are "easy" judges, it means they will not rip your car apart if it is not perfect. They will take off appropriate points ranging in the tenths, but point out ways to improve your car's appearance. Two good examples are Steve Lopez's 1986 930 Turbo and Mike Mansolino's 1989 Carrera. These are near perfect cars with years and miles of use, but Porsches that look like they just rolled off the factory floor. Both men will also gladly educate you in ways you can improve your own car. And your car always seems to run better when it is clean. And there are a variety of ways you can get started in show car prep. Many people start by washing and waxing their cars and presenting the cars for display. You get a chance to see other cars, talk to their owners and measure your car against their car. Next time you can show your car in the Wash and Shine category where only the exterior and interior of the car is judged. Then you can move up to the 'Street' category where the exterior, interior, engine, and storage compartments are judged. The pinnacle of concours is Full Concours where the entire car is judged, including the aforementioned areas, together with the wheels, suspension, chassis, and transaxle.

After lunch the awards were announced.

The Full Concours winner was Mike Holly with his fully restored 1959 356 Convertible 'D.' This car has a history with SDR as its prior owner was the late Paul Davis. When Paul owned the car it had a number of modifications including front disc brakes, 12 volt conversion, and a modified 912 engine with Weber carbs. Mike bought the car, including the original engine case. He located engine parts including Zenith carbs so he was able to rebuild the motor to original specifications. He returned the car to its original 6 volt electrical system as well as restoring the original drum brakes. The banjo steering wheel was restored and the front seat is an unusual bench seat, which was available on the car in 1959. 'Stunning' understates the description of the car. It really needs to be seen. Another wonderful 356 restoration of an original owner car was Jack Brauer's 1964 SC coupe in Light Ivory/white. Jack purchased the car from the family of the original owner last year. The car has been fully restored and looks as if it just rolled off the dealer's floor. The red upholstery with the white exterior is most handsome. Jack took first place in Street Division 1, and was tied with Ben Wainscott's 1965 SC sunroof coupe in Ruby Red. The 356 class has become one of the closest divisions in our concours, as there are a number of outstanding cars. We need George Alspaugh to bring his 356 Speedster next year for a shoot out, although his is a full concours car.

Top award in Unrestored Class went to Steve Lopez in his 1986 930 Turbo. Best in the Street Division award went to Louise Bent in her '98 red 993 coupe. She rolled in at 6:30AM with a perfect car and kept "dusting" (a work of art) until judging started. Top prize in Street 7 went to Dale Summerfield in his 2007 911 Coupe; second place to Frank Lanza in his 2001 996 Carrera; and third to Randy Pickering in his 2007 997 4S coupe. In Street 9, Michael Harris won with his 1973 914/4 2.0 Targa. Three outstanding Porsches were judged in the Special Category Class, with Tom and Lucy Haines winning in their early 911R 'tribute' car, created from a '79 911 SC. Steve Grosekemper took first in SC 2 with his highly modified 911 race car. and Robert Derose took a first in SC 3 with his 2008 GT3RS in wonderful green, a color that Porsche once named 'Irish Mist.'

A number of standout cars were displayed in the Wash and Shine Division. First in W/S 1 was Dick Douglass in a 1965 356 coupe. Second in class was Ted and Eleanor Myrus in a 1964 356 C coupe in Signal Red with a Leitz luggage rack on the engine lid, complete with a period correct "Dan Gurney for President" sticker on the suitcase. Top prize in W/S 2 went to Hal Lewis in a 1983 911


SC coupe; second to Jason Sheffer in a 1973 911 coupe; third to Shannon and Joel Bowman in a 1970 914/4 1.7 Targa; and fourth to George Ochtun in a 1970 911T. Shannon Bowman had recently acquired the car from Washington. She and husband Joel "drove" the car from Washington in fits and starts. When the starter didn't work she would push the car while Joel would steer and pop the clutch once speed was up. When asked why tiny Shannon didn't steer while buffed out Joel pushed we were told the shifter was not working and only Joel knew how to work it. Likely story! First in W/S 4 went to Gregg Stavros in his 2006 997 Carrera S and second to Jim and Joann Hyldahl in a 2009 C4S. Buck Bitting took the Boxster/Cayman class with his 2005 Boxster. In W/S 6, Rich Cacesse took top prize with his 1994 968 Cabriolet in Amazon Green. Rich had just returned from a business trip on the East Coast and as tired as he was, he still managed to produce a winning car.

Concours Chair Steve Lopez thanked everyone for attending with special thanks going to all the volunteers, judges, and timers. Most of the judges came out early, spent the morning judging, and did not even have a car on display. Rich Fatuzzo was a first time judge, enjoyed the experience, and will be back. Hope to see you all next year.

National City Auto Heritage Day

PCA-SDR sponsors a number of car displays, tours, shows and a concours now and then during the calendar year. From time to time, our Club does not sponsor an event but is invited to participate in another group's Porsche display. This has happened in recent times at the San Diego Auto Museum at Balboa Park, the SD Auto Show at the Convention Center, and most recently at Kimball Park in National City. For the past 20 years, the National City Chamber of Commerce has sponsored a classic car, hot rod and low rider auto display in National City on the first Sunday of August, or August 6th as it turned out. SDR was asked to provide some cars for the event several months ago. Little did anyone know at the time that Porschephiles would have three competing events on the same day and five competing events if you included the day before! But supportive Porsche owners came through and by the end of the day on Sunday, August 7th, 27 fine Porsches had filled the principal auto display area at Kimball Park.

The Heritage event starts with a Parade of Cars that includes sports cars, foreign cars, classic cars, hot rods, low riders, mint old cars, trucks and motorcycles. The National City Police Department provides a number of motorcycle officers with other officers staged at

intersections to stop traffic while the parade rolls through the various intersections on the way to the park. Kimball Park is a large public park located behind City Hall. There was a large grandstand with an excellent rock and roll band that reminded one of a young Jerry Lee Lewis sans the 13 year old female cousin. A Master of Ceremonies directed the festivities including the introduction of the various categories of cars and announced the trophy winners at the end of the day.

The Porsches were divided into five different groups. Group A was for early cars from 1955-1967; Group B for Porsches 1970-1974; Group C 1984-1994 for front engined water pumpers; Group D for 1980-1988 SCs and Carreras; and Group E for 2000-2011 986, 987, 996, and 997 Porsches, with a GT-3, a Turbo and a Speedster added to the mix. All in all, an outstanding collection.

To complicate matters further, only some of the cars would be judged, those 1984 and earlier models. Due to a lack of sufficient volunteers, only some of the Porsches were actually judged. The request from the Heritage organizers was for a representative display of Porsche automobiles. Originally, the Chamber of Commerce had requested that PCA-SDR provide club judges, but with all the other events being held this time

of year, that was impractical. Heritage Organizers promised to provide their own judges, but that proved illusive. Some Porsches were judged, and it is a shame that more were not, as the cars were really outstanding.

The Group A cars included Jack Rabell's 550 Beck Spyder in a silver blue finish. The quality of the finish on his "550 Jr." was the best we have seen. Porsche 356s were well represented with Ted Myrus' '64 C coupe in Signal Red, Ben Wainscott's Ruby Red 356 sunroof coupe, and Michael Harris' 356 Champagne Yellow C coupe. Early and rare 911s included Tom Kerfetz's 1967 911 S Targa, and Bev Gould's 911 T Targa. A rare 1970 race car was John Straub's Porsche 914-6GT. An unusual 914/4 2.0 liter was displayed by Jeffrey Harris in his unmolested 169,000 mile Targa. Front engined water-pumping Porsches featured Raffi Sayahian's immaculate 1984 944 Turbo and Rich Caccese's 968 Amazon Green cab. The 1980s cars were among the best maintained cars in the display. New to many of us was Skip Holloway's 1981 silver SC coupe. The car had undergone a complete restoration and was better than a new car. Several beautiful 911 Targas were also displayed as was Steve Lopez's 1986 930 Turbo in Guards Red and black interior.

Moving into the current era of Porsches,

Charles LaGreca brought his lovely 2001 Boxster S in red and black. Charles has placed small Porsche crests on top of each front fender back alongside and near the windscreen. The complimentary color of the crests and car really make a statement. A 2008 Cayman in Macadamia and tan was shown by Vickie Brosnan. Ralph and Carol Turner brought a brace of high powered Porsches with a Turbo and a GT-3. Ralph likes to drive the GT-3 and Carol prefers the Turbo. Red and white. The last car to join the mix was Lawrence Gitman's ultra rare 2011 Speedster.

After we put the 27 Porsches in place, we took a stroll around the Park to look at some of the other vehicles. A group of low riders was staged together, including a beautiful 1964 Chevy Impala owned by Ms. Diaz. Several times she turned on the hydraulics and had the car "dance" for the crowd. Another low rider Chevy was painted in Charger colors of blue, yellow and white, also owned and

displayed by a lady. There was a group of nicely maintained and/or restored mid-'60s Buick Rivieras. Hot rods were interspersed with some '50s and '60s American customs. Most of these cars had late-model high horsepower motors, some supercharged. There were many European sports cars and sedans built by Jaguar, Mercedes, MG, Triumph and others. A 1955 silver Gull-wing Mercedes with fitted luggage was one of the nicest and most unusual cars. Motorcycles were also very well represented with older Nortons, Harley Davidsons, BSAs and Triumphs.

Of the Porsches displayed, in all only six were judged. First place went to Tom Holloway for his 1981 SC coupe. Second went to Tom Kerfetz for a 1980 SC coupe. Third place was awarded to Bev Gould for her 1970 911 T Targa. No one can believe her Targa has gone over 400,000 miles. The People's Choice Award went to Jack Rabell and his 550 Jr. Other winners were Ms. Diaz and her 1964 Impala Low

Rider, which she danced for the crowd as she drove up to receive her award, a 1932 Ford roadster with big modern V-8 power, and a 1931 chopped and channeled Ford coupe powered by a late model Chevy V-8 with a 671 style blower mounted on top. Quite a show.

After the event, one of the organizers, Reid Carroll, apologized for the confusion. Apparently some of the paperwork for the entries was flawed and the turnout was disappointing as not everyone came as promised. Personally, I thought the show was a big success. We had a great variety of beautiful Porsches from the early days to modern, high performance and limited production super cars. Thank you all for sharing your wonderful cars with the people in National City. I know they appreciated your efforts. And we have many more options for the New Car Display at the Convention Center in December.



August Board Meeting

Board Minutes

The August 2011 Board of Directors meeting was held at Dave Gardner and Susie Amundson's home. Board members in attendance were Terry Barnum, Bill Behun, Leigh Rayner, Carl Scragg, Monique Straub and Cathy Young. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 P.M. Minutes from the July 2011 meeting were approved unanimously.

President's Report

Carl stated that he and Kathy Alnwick have the Marriot contract in place for the New Year's Eve Party and registration has been opened on motorsportreg. com. The Marriot has offered 100 rooms to Club members at reduced pricing before December 1.

Carl turned the floor over to Keith Verlague, volunteer coordinator for the San Diego Auto Show, who would like a kickoff meeting to present ideas and hear questions from SDR members at a meeting at his home on Thursday Aug. 25th. The date request was approved unanimously. Keith proposed that over the three day event, members volunteer for one or more 4-hour shifts with 4 volunteers on the show floor at a time. All volunteers will be allowed free entry to the show. He would like the Club's involvement with the show to be advertised in as many places as possible including print, web and broadcast. Carl and Curt Yaws are attempting to attract sponsorship for the event and requested that others also working with potential sponsors please coordinate with them.

Vice President's Report

Greg reported via email that the nominating committee has the following can-

didates for the 2012 Board of Directors: Bev Gould, Araceli Lopez, Steve McKay, Don Middleton, Russell Shon and Rick Sylvestri.

Treasurer's Report

Cathy reported on the Special Budget meeting she hosted June 30 to perform a mid-year review of the Club's finances. She explained that finances are positive overall but recommended maintaining current expenditure levels.

Cathy presented in detail the Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss for the month of July and Profit & Loss Year-to-Date comparison. The comparison with this time last year was shown to be positive and encouraging. Cathy's report was approved unanimously.

Carl chronicled his efforts to obtain a raffle permit for the Club which apparently requires a California Franchise Tax Board Exemption Letter. Cathy offered to look at the forms needed to obtain the Letter. Carl recommended that the Club's tax advisors be consulted before proceeding with a raffle for the New Member Social.

Accounts are reconciled as of the end of July. Cash in was less than cash out which resulted in a net decrease in cash. Major expenses included an AX, Tour, Concours and Windblown Witness printing. Major income sources included an AX and Windblown Witness advertisers. (See Treasurer's report for details.)

Chair Reports

Autocross (AX, pre-reg, reg, CW, equip, logistics, safety, tech inspect, tech adv, timing). Jennifer Reinhardt described some of the problems she's identified regarding instructors at AXs and expressed concern about instructor burn out. Carl agreed that volunteer

appreciation is key to retention and asked for ideas to expand the instructor corps. Spirited member discussion and ideas followed such as instructor rotation, instructor pricing reduction and instructor-only events. Carl and Leigh stated that they would discuss it with the CDIs and Jennifer was thanked for her ideas and efforts. Jerry Bumpus reported that the visiting 912 owners have increased the August AX to 130 preregistered participants, the limit approved at the last Board meeting. Jerry was given approval to close registration should he choose to do so. Leigh volunteered to modify the mostorsportreg. com pre-registration text to more clearly describe the participant limit. Jennifer volunteered to bring assorted refreshments to welcome the 912 owners.

Auto Museum. Michael Harris reported via email that the Pontiac Exhibit is still in progress until September 24, with a Pontiac reception on Friday, August 12. On Monday, August 29, there will be an evening with automotive artist Art Fitzpatrick who penned the wide track Pontiac look in '60s magazines. A Volkswagen display will open September 26. Michael will be looking for cars that may be display candidates for the New Year's Eve Auto Show.


