
Let me be the first to wish you a Happy 4th of July.

As an added note, be prepared to sign an insurance waiver at all PCA/SDR events.




Newsletter Editor



I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of our guests to Parade and hope that they have a great time in San Diego. I look forward to going to next year's Parade in North Carolina.







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
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
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




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PORSCHE CLUB OF AMERICA ZONE 8 SANTA BARBARA REGION 1000 CHARITY TOUR REGISTRATION FORM

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

This months cover comes from July 1977. This was the month of our first Parade in San Diego. The featured car was Wayne Baker's 914, obviously photographed in front of a San Diego landmark, the Star of India. (Not far from where our Victory Banquet will be held on the USS Midway.) Wayne was credited with being a frequent top time of day winner at Zone 8 Time Trials. In July of 2005, this column featured the Witness cover from July 1992, the month of our second Parade in San Diego. That was the year that PCA approved our bid for this year's Parade. Looking back, it's hard to believe that it was June 2003, when I was region president, that I appointed Paul & Ruth Young Parade Chairs. More than four years in the making and now it is here! Back to 1977 -- what else was going on that month? This sounds familiar -- the Witness editor was looking for his successor. There was also a lot of concern of the new vehicle emissions laws, laws to which we have long since become accustomed. This is also the second issue of the Witness to have a full color cover. The first issue was the previous month, June 1977. That issue had the honor of being first because a copy of it was mailed to all the Parade entrants that year. See you at the Parade!

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


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Porsche sweeps the field at Monterey! OK, maybe technically this is not true. Porsche only won three of the four races contested at Laguna Seca during the U.S. Sports Car Invitational delivered by Luggage Express in mid-May. But since they don't even compete in the Koni Challenge ST division, and this is a Porsche Club, I will count it as a sweep as a Porsche 997 driven by Spence Pumpelly and Peter Ludwig took the Koni Challenge GS race, a 997 GT3 Cup racer driven by Andy Lally and R.J. Valentine won the Rolex series GT race, and finally Jorg Bergmeister and Patrick Long won the Rolex Daytona Prototype race in a Porsche-powered Crawford!

No more suspense as to who won, but there was plenty of suspense at the track. I had not been to a GrandAm race since the 2003 race at California Speedway during the Speed Festival. Laguna Seca is a much better track for spectators, but the racing has also improved in the past 4 years. This year they were running all of the different series as separate 2.5 hour

races. On Saturday were the Koni Challenge ST and then Rolex GT in the afternoon. On Sunday the Koni Challenge GS was in the morning and then the Rolex DP race in the afternoon. Although the fields were large enough for each race, I would have liked the Rolex and Koni fields to have been combined. I think the speed disparities coupled with the difficulty of passing at Laguna Seca would have made for some interesting races.





I flew into San Jose early Friday morning and drove my rental car over to the track and arrived just before noon. The practices were running and at the end of the day there were qualifying sessions for Koni ST and Rolex GT. It was a great view from the Corkscrew as they were working on their hot laps.

Saturday morning was more practice, but the weather was typical Monterey as there was fog in the morning that was so thick climbing up to the Corkscrew they had to red flag one of the practice sessions. Later in the day it cleared and was sunny for the rest of the day.

The Koni ST race started just after noon and included the sedans, both foreign and domestic, with BMW 3 series, Acuras, Subaru, Chevy Cobalt, Mazda MX-5 and RX-8 and Honda Accord (but no Porsches). The winners were Karl Thomson and Billy Johnson in an Acura TSX and a best lap of 1:41.59.


Next up was the Rolex GT with the Porsche GT3 Cup cars running against the Pontiac GXP-R and last year's GTO-R, Mazda RX-8 (which was leading the series to this point), Chevy Corvettes, Nissan 350Z and a Mustang Cobra GT for variety. The Mazda RX-8 was on the pole at 1:29.05, just ahead of the Tafel Racing





GT3 at 1:29.19 and the Farnbacher-Loles GT3 at 1:29.28. At the beginning of the race the Mazda was doing well along with the Porsches and Pontiac but after the first set of pit stops it was the Farnbacher-Loles Porsches up front. The TRG Porsche of Andy Lally and R.J Valentine started in 16th position and slowly moved their way up through the field as the race progressed.

Lally ran up front all day, breaking into the top five shortly after taking over the car during the first 15 laps of the race. He also didn't drop too far from the leaders after his second stop on Lap 36, returning to the track in ninth. Lally then quietly worked his way into the top five with patience. He used passes on Lap 61 (Jean-Francois Dumoulin) to take sixth and Lap 73 (DiLeo) to take fifth. Then he reaped the benefits of late pit stops from two drivers and made a daring inside pass on Collins for the victory. The win put Lally and Valentine into a ninth-place tie in the latest point standings.



"It is a huge deal," said Lally, whose only lead came in the final three laps of the event. He was also the final of nine drivers and nine lead changes and did not stop during the final 66 laps. "The really cool thing is, this is my first win here. I've had two second-place finishes in Rolex and I had a third-place finish here in Barber

Dodge a long, long time ago. I just mentioned to (team owner) Kevin (Buckler), we've got two seconds and a third, and we really need a win here. It was wonderful to come through. It's one of those things where it clicked just right and our guys just did an awesome job. I've got to thank RJ, my engineer, and Kevin for the three of them getting together and helping me build a real good car this weekend. I've got to say the handling was just unbelievable. I've also got to thank the guys who raced me clean, because the last three guys that we picked off were all very much gentlemen, and nobody was trying to cut my nose off."



The race was not won just with speed but great tactical calls by TRG and Kevin Buckler. The suspense was whether they would have enough gas to make it to the finish after passing the Pontiac GXP-R with 5 laps to go. But a late caution was the break they needed. Their endurance racing experience helped and with that little bit of luck they finished on the top of the podium with their TRG teammates, Daniel Dileo and Ross Smith taking second, and Dirk Werner and Bryce Miller's taking 3rd in their Farnbacher-Loles for a Porsche Rolex GT sweep. The average speed for the race was 82 mph and the winner's best lap was 1:29.48 on lap 76 of 92.

The race was also special for TRG owner Buckler, a former resident of Monterey, Calif. and whose shop is now headquartered not far away in Petaluma, Calif. TRG put four cars on Saturday's grid and the other two cars finished 12th and 14th.




"Special is an understatement," Buckler said. "When my wife, Debra, and I moved here from the Midwest, we moved here to Monterey. We lived here for almost four years, right across the street in those hills. We started our company here in our garage and I did some of my very first racing here ever. I love this place, so from that side, it's special. I love coming here; I couldn't be more proud."

Sunday started out bright and sunny and was warmer. After the final practice sessions, it was time for the Koni Challenge GS race. This series has a very eclectic group of cars. It is for "street" cars and the GT3s are excluded but the 997 and 996 are allowed along with BMW M3, Ford Mustang GT and Nissan 350Z with 41 drivers on the final grid. I had talked with one of the 997 racers on Saturday about the durability of the 996 motor in



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competition and running on race tires (spec Hoosiers). He said that overall they had been very reliable, with the added benefit of being much cheaper to maintain (or replace with crate motors).




This race also turned into a Porsche sweep with the Marcus Motorsports 997 of Pumpelly and Ludwig finishing ahead of the TRG 997 of Ballou and Lally and the Fiorano/C-Max Racing 997 of Riddle and Wilson. The average speed for this race was 74 mph and the winner's best lap was 1:36.06 on lap 75 of 83.



Now it was time for the Daytona Prototypes. With 19 racers on the grid, although the majority of the cars were Riley chassis, they were powered by engines from BMW, Pontiac, Lexus and Porsche. Along with the Ford Doran and the Porsche Crawford and Porsche Fabcar, there was a variety of cars to watch and root for. If only they did not all look so similar.

In the end it was the No. 23 Ruby Tuesday Championship Racing Team Porsche Crawford codrivers Jörg Bergmeister and Patrick becoming the fifth different winners in five races to start the season in



Sunday's U.S. Sports Car Invitational delivered by Luggage Express at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca.

Bergmeister claimed the lead from Jon Fogarty with 32 laps remaining when Fogarty brought the No. 99 GAINSCO/Bob Stallings Racing Pontiac Riley onto pit lane for its final pit stop and to turn the car over to codriver Alex Gurney. With the second, third and fourth place cars filling his mirrors throughout the closing laps, however, Bergmeister was forced to conserve fuel in order to make it to the finish.




Bergmeister's big break came on Lap 89 of the 91-lap race, when Matthew Alhadeff brought out the day's seventh and final full-course caution period when he slid the No. 05 Luggage Express Team Sigalsport BMW Riley into the gravel trap at Turn 4. However, there were still a few nervous moments for the team as Bergmeister still had to make it to the finish line without running out of fuel, but the German did just that to make it five winners in five races, topping the previous record of four to start the 2004 season.



"We were rolling the dice," Bergmeister said. "I really don't know how much fuel we had left in the car. I got a low fuel warning on the white flag lap and I was pretty sure we were going to make it there. When I knew it was going to be about six minutes left, I thought, 'Wow, this is going to be close.' But it worked out well, even on the last restart. I was really lean on the fuel and trying to conserve as much as I could. We had great strategy today and we really needed this. We've had such a tough start to the season and it's good to be back."

Again it was great strategy by the experienced Alex Job Racing team that made the difference. They made the right calls and again had some luck with caution flags to bring home a Porsche win and complete the sweep. The winner's fastest lap was a 1:21.44 on lap 79 of 91. Surprisingly, and due to the number of caution flags, the average speed was only 81 mph, slower than the GT race on Saturday.

It was a bittersweet race for Alex Gurney. His father, Dan Gurney, had been honored on Sunday as the first inductee to the Legends of Laguna Seca and many had





hoped to see Alex on the podium, but they ended up 6th after a late stop for fuel.


It was also bittersweet for the Red Bull Brumos Porsche Riley of David Donohue and Darren Law that just missed the podium in 4^{th} place and was carrying badges in memory of Bob Snodgrass who had recently passed.

After the race and the victory celebrations, it was time for a quick drive back to San Jose to catch my flight back home. It was another fun race weekend with hundred of pictures to sort through. Laguna Seca is a great venue; check their calendar for upcoming races. They have the Monterey Historics in August and the ALMS races in October. 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

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

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


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SDR-The Way We Were John Straub, Archivist

Well here we are at the last half of 1979.

In August of that year we held our first Wine Tour at Mount Palomar Winery in Rancho California. This also had a picnic at the end. Sally Whitlock was the chair and we started at the May Co. parking lot in Mission Valley. We had about 25-30 cars make the trip.

In September we started our second Autocross Series of the year. Back at that time we did two of these a year (a Spring and a Fall) rather than just one series all year long. This was to let those that needed to work on their cars do so without missing too many events to get an award for that year. Anyway, this was the first of the Fall series. It was held at San Diego Stadium and the chairs were Bob Bertrand and Dave Walker. Some of the members running were Jerry Sturm, Joe Weber, John Straub, Doug Clarke, John Shirk and Carol Freitas (Carol was to become our third woman President a few years down the road).

Also in September we held our San Diego Region Concours at Fashion Valley Shopping Center. This was chaired by Ernie Paschoal and Pat Scanlan. Some of the members showing were Lee Hurty, Art Wrightson, Dave Astor and Pat Scanlan. I believe that at that time Pat was showing his red Porsche Speedster. He had sold his black 911L that he had won so many awards with.

In October we had our second Autocross in the Fall Series with over 100 entrants. This series was being sponsored by Dennis Sherman Foreign Car Service. Also in

October was our Holtville Driving Event chaired by Bob Muzzy. Some of the members running were Bill Shaffer (a charter member of SDR), John Shirk, Art Stanten, John Straub, Paul Haas, Peter Stacy, Volker Bruckmann, Margie Smith-Haas, Steve Miller and Tom Hauseur, Jr. One of the other things that happened at that Holtville was that Bill Koll brought his GTU 914-6 out to run. Bill had started his driving at Holtville many years before and he was now competing in the GTU Class in IMSA. Some of the races he ran that year were the 24-Hour Daytona, 12-Hour Sebring, 6-Hour Riverside, Sears Point, Mexico City and others. He was the highest placed Porsche in the class that year. Not bad for an SDR member!

November of that year we had another Autocross and our Third Turkey Tear Grand Prix held at Malibu Grand Prix.

Just to put a timeline on the Porsche Cars at that time, Dr. Ferry Porsche turned seventy that year.

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

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Our May Tech session brought us to Autopia Car Care. For the uninitiated, like me, Autopia offers simply the best car care products available.

A rather neat car care presentation was given over breakfast where Autopia new Ultima product line was introduced. It is just amazing how much is involved in car care.

For the actual clinic, a dingy 2000 black Boxster was selected, mine. The long and short of it was the gauntlet was thrown down. The PCA-SDR members were broken down into teams to detail and or experiment on my car. Detailing naturally include power polishing. I was just thinking please don't rub the paint off my car!

Ultima is a complete car care product line designed to clean, protect and maintain exterior and interior finishes. The Ultima line consists of:

- The Elastrofom Paint Clean System, consisting of a rubberized foam block and cleaning lubricant that smoothes and cleans paint.
- Paint Prep Plus, designed to restore paint gloss, color and depth.

- Paint Guard Plus, a polymer sealant and coat which maintains the shine.
- Paint Guard Wash, high suds capacity car soap.
- Detail Spray Plus a high performance quick detailer.
- Tire & Trim Guard Plus a polymer protector for tires, trim and wheels.
- Interior Shampoo Gel and Interior Guard Plus that providing a complete system for cleaning and protection of cars seats and inside trim.

Everyone real pitched in being guided by the experts from Autopia. The Ultima products were found to be straight forward to use and easy to apply. I had a few scratches on my car which were also easily buffed out (although I cringed a bit). After detailing I was left with a bullet proof shine, that is still obviously protecting the finish from things like bird droppings after thirty days (don't stick). Ultima is designed to stand up to 15 to 20 washing, just don't use dishwashing detergent.

Guess what my car is no longer dingy, in fact except for a few door dents from parking lot encounters it look

brand new. I could not be more satisfied by the detailing job done. Thank you Autopia and PCA-SDR!

A couple of other interesting things occurred during the session. Like, what's a good way to bring out the luster of rubber bumper inserts? Answer, peanut butter.

Also, Ted had a stubborn ring stain on the roof of his Ferrari, which he could not get out. Autopia spent about twenty minutes on it, stain gone! Amazing what you can

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I have been a Porsche fan since I was a teenager and have been fortunate enough to own three 911s. In the back of my mind I have always wanted to get a chance to go to the factory in Stuttgart and see where these great machines are made. I had even got as far as looking into one of the most common trips to Germany that included a factory tour and was interested to see that you got to drive a Porsche in Germany for a couple of days. This piqued my interest, but the overall cost always seemed prohibitive.

Two years ago at PCA Parade, I was talking to a couple by the name of Mark and Tina Trewartha and they told me about a trip that they were putting together driving through Germany for ten days in rented Porsches. The destinations they described sounded really interesting and included a tour of the Porsche factory in Stuttgart. The thought of having a 997 Carrera S for ten days and getting to tour the factory got me really interested and I was eager to find out more.

I broached the subject with Martha, my significant other, and as she is also a Porsche fan with her own Porsche, she was interested in doing such a trip. In fact, she asked me why I had been dragging my feet in making the decision to go.

We got a lot more information from Mark and Tina and they invited us to come to the last group's post trip get-together so we would get a better idea of what these trips were like. We decided to go and we got to see lots of pictures and videos of the trip and heard numerous stories about how much fun it had been. Needless to say, that night we signed up to go on the next tour.

The thing that appealed to us most, was that with hotels, breakfasts and most evening meals taken care of, and each car having an onboard navigation system, you were free to visit what ever you wanted during each day – be it a castle, a museum, a particular town or the twisty mountain road of your choice. Each Porsche





having a navigation system eliminated any concerns about being lost in a foreign country where we were far from fluent in the language.

The more we thought about it the more this appealed to us because this meant that although our itinerary was organized such that the group visited a few predetermined sights, for example, the Porsche factory, the RUF production facility, Neuschwanstein Castle (the one Disneyland is modeled on), for the rest of the trip we would go exploring wherever we wanted and would meet the group for dinner each evening.

With ten months to go, we decided we wanted to plan our trip. We started buying books on things to do and sights to see in Germany. We even plotted our scheduled hotel stays on a map and started researching what sights there are between hotel A & hotel B. Gradually, we got a good understanding of things we wanted to see each day and were able to add a little more meat to our itinerary. It was actually fun deciding, for example, whether we wanted to take the cable car to the top of the Zugspitze – the highest mountain in the German Alps, or to drive the Deutsche Alpen Strasse, which is the German Alpine road internationally acclaimed as being one of the best driver's roads in

Germany after all ... we would be in a 997 Carrera S which is all about the driving experience.

Mark and Tina arranged a group get-together one month before we were due to leave, which gave us a chance to meet some of the group that we would be traveling with - including some who had been the year before and enjoyed it so much that they were going again. It was a great evening, we met some really interesting people from different walks of life, all with enthusiasm for our upcoming trip as a common denominator.

At the get-together Mark and Tina gave each couple a personal trip binder with a more detailed itinerary including a day-by-day schedule with an approximate timeframe for each part of the trip. There were plenty of free days with nothing organized except cocktails and dinner at the hotel that evening which enabled us to work our plans in nicely.

Finally, the date for departure arrived and, is often the case, there was a last minute rush to get everything taken care of before we left.

We took Tina's advice and packed light as we knew that everything we took would have to fit in a 997 and we wanted to be comfortable while traveling. You drive one of the finest engineered vehicles in the world.

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








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We had our maps and guidebooks and a list of useful phrases in German (which we never needed) ... we were ready!

- Viewing the ancient walled city of Rothenburg from the top of the church tower in the market square



Three awards were given out by Bill LeMasters, the event master. San Diego Porsche Club won "Best Sports Car Club" for the third year in a row. We had the most cars.


