Although most people read the *Windblown Witness* in printed form, it is also available on the website in PDF






## First Impressions

This months cover comes from January 1972 and features the 356 Super. The magazine back in '72 was fairly small, being made up of essentially 8 pages of legal sized paper, double-sided. Even so, it still packed in plenty of information -- calendar, classifieds, articles, event ads, etc. -- all the things we are used to today. A few things on the calendar were an upcoming Hare & Hound Rally, a driver's school at the Bob Bondurant School of Driving, a tech session featuring a Porsche powered Indy car, and the '72 winter National PCA Board meeting which was hosted by San Diego Region.


A real interesting read came in the form of a 1954 Road & Track article that was reprinted. It was the road test of the cover model, the 356 Super. With 70 horsepower, it tested out at a 108 mph top speed and they were quite impressed with the 50 to 80 mph acceleration time of 14 seconds in 3rd gear. Equally impressive was the handling and road feel, as well as the low aerodynamic drag factor. "The all-around performance of the Porsche is so good that it makes one wonder why any sports car need have an engine larger than 1500cc." Did you know that in 1952 Road & Track named Porsche "The Car of Tomorrow-The Dream Car of the Century"?

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



The Evans Garage, one of San Diego's hidden gems, is a family-owned museum featuring a world-class collection of classic and antique cars displayed among rare and beautiful period antiques. 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

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


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# SDR-The Way We Were John Straub, Archivist

Well, here we are in the last half of 1980.

In July of that year we had our Zone 8 Concours at Fashion Valley Shopping Center. You need to remember at that time San Diego was much smaller and we could hold Concours events at shopping centers and not be over run by people. Not so today. This event was chaired by Ernie Paschoal and Rich Herzog. We had about thirty-five cars with Norm Wykes' white 1966 911 taking Best of Show.

Also in July was the start of our Autocross series for the year. At this time we decided to try a different location in order to keep the cost to the entrants down. We started running events at the County Annex parking lot at the corner of Ruffin Rd. and Clairemont Mesa Blvd. We would run down the side of the building and around the back, mostly second gear and a little third. These autocross events were chaired by Pete Mathewson, Dave Walker and John Straub. The cost was \$7 for a driver and \$3 for a family member driving the same car. By the way, we did check to see membership cards at that time. We did our registration and tech all in the same day, with that closing at 10:00 AM. Practice in the morning and the timing would start about 1:30 after the lunch break. Pretty laid back, don't you think? Guess who had TTOD at that event, Jerry Sturm.

Next in July, was our Progressive Dinner. Margie Smith-Haas was the chair for this event and it was called "The Hawaiian Maui Wowie." The members offering their homes were Jim and Shirly Douthit, Martha Walker, Dave and Linda Naples, and Steve and Linda Dockstader. Believe it or not we had leis flown over from Honolulu just for this event. And I do remember the Hawaiian dancers! It was a huge success with 100 members attending.

In August we had a Rallye chaired by Art Wrightson and Slim Durham. This really was the "Golden Age" of rallies in our Region. We would hold maybe four to six rallies a year, not tours, but real rallies. This went on for about eight years from 1975 to about 1982. Also in San

Diego there were rallies being held every weekend by other car clubs; this started in the mid-sixties.

Next up in August was another Autocross and then a Dinner Meeting chaired by Flo Dover. At this meeting we had a guest speaker talking about car paint jobs.

In September, another Autocross with some of the members running: John Shirk, Jerry Sturm, John Straub, Joe Weber, Margie Smith-Haas and Guy Finlin. To end the month, we had a Tech Session at Wayne Baker's on transmissions.

October was yet another Autocross and then our "Octoberfest Celebration" at the Rheinlander Restaurant in La Jolla chaired by Margie Smith-Haas. After visiting the restaurant we had a "Surprise Concours." This was like a "Wash and Shine" event, not real serious...but fun. We would do this kind of thing off and on over the years, even at driving events, such as Holtville.

In November, rather than going to Holtville, we ran a Time Trial at Carlsbad Raceway. This event was sponsored by Don Sharp Porsche in Carlsbad And was chaired by Pete Mathewson, Bill Bartee and John Straub. The cost was \$20. We ran Saturday and Sunday with beer at Sharp Porsche on Saturday after running. The track had about a half mile straight going down the dragstrip, then a hard left-hander onto the comeback road, with an up hill section then a down hill section on to a flat, then a steep down hill to a 180 left-hander and back up to the dragstrip. This was really fun, however, one bad calculation and you could really hurt your

Our next event was going to be in January, "The Installation Dinner" at the Town and Country.

On the IMSA racing scene, San Diegan's Dick Barbour running his 935 in GT, Bill Koll's new GTU 911 and Wayne Baker's 1,700 lb 914/4 also in GTU were giving it their best and were pushing the factorybacked Mazdas out of the way for the last half of the year.

# SDR-50th Anniversary John Straub, Archivist

While digging through the archives for information to put in the display cases at this year's Parade, I came upon some information that I thought would be fun to share.

Most of this is from Keith Ewton and Wally and Bea Cole and was done for our archives back in 1965 and was titled "Profile of a Region."

They wrote, "If we had to describe in one single word the formation of the San Diego Region in 1957, we would say, "Porsche." You would understand much better what we have to say if, by some twist of the imagination, we could turn the hands of the clock and the pages of the calendar back eight years. Porsches were just beginning to be noticed in California. Trying to find the needed ten charter members was a difficult problem for Paul Madigan, the founder of our region. Some were called; others just heard of the charter meeting to be held at the Golden Lion Restaurant on a cold night on March 12, 1956" (that restaurant was on El Cajon Blvd. about 59th street, it became the Aspen Mine Company Restaurant for some time, and now is a mortuary). They continued to write, "We did manage to get the required number and received our charter on December 26, 1957. The San Diego Region was on its way to fun with our Porsches and our fellow members." (Jack Case presented the charter to San Diego on March 8, 1958 at a Dinner Meeting with 34 members almost two years later).

"Our yearly activities are orientated around the almost ideal climate....one can travel from the sandy beaches of the Pacific, through mile-high forested mountains to a desert and cactus land one hundred feet below sea level in less than one hundred twenty miles. South from San Diego, Old Mexico is less than thirty minutes away and to the north is Palomar Mountain."

"We have one event a month. These monthly events offer a variety of activities. There are three to four dinners per year which prove to be our best attended events, drawing seventy to eighty people to each. Turnouts to other events average 25 to 35 cars. All events are "closed" to all except PCA members and prospective members" (back at that time you would have to attend three events with a host before you could join the club).

They continue, "Some of the events initiated by the original group continued as annual events for many years. One such event was our early morning drives to the top of Palomar Mountain. When we broke out of the fog into the beautiful sunshine and fresh air, we would find waiting an early-rising group of husbands and wives, who had a wonderful breakfast cooked for us."

"And the desert...In the spring we hold our annual "Run-to-the-Sun" to Casa del Zorro, a resort motel at Borrego in the Anza Desert. This is a predicted economy run. The point of departure is a filling station where gas tanks are topped off. On the basis of mileage given, you predict how much it will cost to fill your tank

at the end. Cars leave at intervals and follow the predetermined route. At Borrego you fill your tank— the "amount of the sale" counter on the pump being covered. The amount is recorded while you stand by weeping quietly and wondering how you could have been so far off on your calculations. After some cooling drinks and a refreshing swim in the motel pool, a buffet lunch is served and the prizes are awarded to the lucky winners" (we continued these events until the early 70s).

"Another popular event is our weekend in the desert at Brawley in the Imperial Valley. The members check into the Imperial Valley Inn on Friday evening. Saturday is spent golfing and swimming. On Saturday evening the Porsches "caravan" to Mexicali, Mexico and enjoy fabulous Chinese food or steaks at the "Alley 19" restaurant. On Sunday we have a high-speed autocross at the Brawley Airport. After a lunch of tacos, tamales, and enchiladas at a local Mexican restaurant, prizes are awarded to the fastest drivers in each class" (these week-end trips became our events held at the Holtville Airport from 1966 to just a few years ago, we would head out twice a year).

They continue, "Other events include local parking lot speed events, interesting rallies, Saturday night "Hare-and-Hound" rallies and our annual progressive dinner to members' homes".

"The thing that really put San Diego on the sports page was the initiation of the Porsche Weekends. This all developed over a few cold beers one afternoon in 1959 between Keith Ewton and Bill Knoll. We hosted the first weekend in 1959 and again in 1963. Over 80 cars attended this event in '63. This month we will attend the 7th Porsche Weekend hosted by Orange Coast Region in Riverside, where we will have the pleasure of driving on the Riverside Raceway. Other weekends have been hosted by San Joaquin and Golden Gate Regions" (so, as you can see, San Diego being the oldest region on the west coast started those events in 1959).

They continue, "The club has grown from the original ten to eighty-five members. Of the original charter members four are still active in the club—Ewton, Madigan, Shaffer and Zongker" (that was in 1965, the club now has over 2500 members).

And to end it they wrote, "The San Diego Region has taken its share of honors in speed events, rallies, and concours, and we are rather proud of the fact that we have been represented at every Porsche Parade except the first two (and that still continues to today). Our members find, in their Porsches, a renewal of their individualism, an opportunity to express and demonstrate their skills, and a chance to escape from the "work-a-day" world we live in. The history of the region has always been one of fun and action."

Well, that's a little snap shot of how life was in 1965 in our Region, as you can see somewhat simpler. I hope you have enjoyed it.

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
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On 7/7/7 (ok, 7/7/07 if you want to be picky), David Kochanek and the AX team created a novel track that was highly acclaimed by the end of the day. Over 110 drivers showed up in beautiful weather for what turned out to be a very fast and exciting track.

After the drivers meeting, the student-instructor pairings were announced and I was assigned Jim Walsh. Jim was doing just his third event in his 1999 Boxster, but he proved to be a very fast learner (and he had a couple of excellent previous instructors).

After getting the corner workers out, Jim and I hopped into my Boxster for the first instruction runs.



We warmed up the tires on the first lap and checked out the approaches to the different turns.

The track opened with a very interesting "gate" leading at right angles into a 5-cone slalom – but a slalom with a twist! The first three cones were placed together near the start of the slalom, then the last two cones were quite a ways further down the track. It was still a "single" slalom, which caught a few drivers by surprise – you needed to take each of the five cones in sequence, just as with the usual slaloms. If you treated it as two separate slaloms and failed to alternate sides on every cone you would be DNF'ed in the timed runs. Luckily that only happened once.

Jim picked up the line almost instantly during his practice sessions, and showed far more skill than I would have expected from a relative newcomer. Several times he recovered from incipient spins with a nice smooth application of more throttle, where many drivers would have probably needed to put "both feet in". His times kept coming down throughout the day, and he finished with an 83.28 – a very good time for his third Autocross, and only one second out of third place in the competitive LSS class.

The track was very fast, with some "cute" tricks.

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The start was a hard right, then a quick left 180 into an exit gate that led into the five-cone slalom at a right angle. This was probably the trickiest part for many people. Most drivers quickly figured out that if you ignored the 1st (left-most) cone, the slalom became a 3cone slalom, but many tried to aim too sharply at the second cone. Since you were running downhill at about a 60-degree angle and turning off-camber as you rounded the second cone (on the left), if you tried to aim too sharply and/or tried to accelerate at the second cone too much, you wound up sliding past the cone and got way out of shape for the third slalom cone, forcing you to back off the throttle there. If instead, you aimed a bit further left and approached a tad slower in more of an arc, then you could get on full throttle earlier and get around both cones 2 and 3 without difficulty. The large gap between cones 3 and 4 gave you plenty of time to get back to the left for cone 4 and shoot through between cones 4 and 5, so that cone 5 wasn't a factor. With this approach, I was able to get into third gear as I was passing the 4th slalom cone.

After exiting the slalom, you needed to get back to the left side of the track to open up the right hand sweeper over the swale. This was the most exciting part, as it was a full-throttle, high-speed sweeper which was off-camber, and the tires were really singing here. With different gearing, some cars were in 4<sup>th</sup> gear around this



sweeper. At the end of the sweeper, there wasn't much room to get straightened and brake hard before a sharp left, which was slightly off-camber, but uphill. Ideally, you turned in very early, accelerated hard, and let understeer and momentum carry you past the apex cone into your track-out point.

A large right-hand 180 turn was perfect for throttle steering and then accelerating down into the very off-camber big left sweeper. From talking with others, I am not sure any of us found the "ideal" line on this one. Steady throttle steering all the way around didn't seem to give me the exit speed I wanted, so I tried double-apexing the turn, and finally found that if I lifted fairly sharply and started the car rotating about 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the way around the turn, I could then get on the throttle fully and maximize my exit speed. Since this lead into the second longest straight, exit speed was very important here.



At the end of the straight along the top of the course, there was a slight left-right chicane. Early in the day, the left jog seemed to be much more pronounced, but by timed runs the chicane entry was a non-event – just a slight turn-in to the left to shoot through the entry, then tap the brakes and downshift for the right jog and then back on the accelerator to throttle-steer around the very big and wide nearly 180-degree left hand sweeper. This was very open and fast, tempered only by the (did I mention this before?) off-camber slope, and the need to brake for the sharp right-hand turn into the big downhill straight.


Turning downhill was another off-camber turn (how did David make every turn off-camber?) at full throttle while trying not to drift off the track. Then into a little left jog that was still full throttle, then brake and turn left into a short straight (another corner to turn early and accelerate, using understeer and momentum to



slide past the apex), then brake and rotate early for a sharp right, an even sharper left, and finally a three-point turn into the finish. Ok, so it wasn't a three-point turn, but it was so tight that the only way I could get through it with any power at all was to downshift into 1<sup>st</sup> (yes, that \$2 ribbon IS worth a new transmission).



The timed runs were punctuated by lots of applause from the "home team" crowd, particularly when Erik Kinninger in the blue AR1 car out-dueled Steve Eguina's GT2 of OCR to take TTOD with a 70.97 to Steve's 71.81. Erik's first time was behind Steve's best, but Erik followed it up with two winning runs, to cheers from the whole family. Mark Kinninger brought in the third best time at 71.95, 14/100<sup>th</sup>s behind Steve. The usual AM and KI suspects rounded out the top ten with alternating places – Clark Smith was top in AM





with 73.81, while Bill Ibbetson took tops in KI with 73.91. Dan Andrews (AM) had 74.30, just ahead of Martin Reinhardt (KI) with 74.68. Carl Vanderschuit (AR1) ran a 74.93, Austin Smith (AM) close behind at 75.06, and Bob Gagnon (KI) took the 10<sup>th</sup> spot at 75.21.

In the 944 Spec class, Chuck Sharp turned a very fast 77.71, edging out Sean Steele at 78.53 and John Kinkaid at 78.81. In AI, George Copelin turned a 76.32 over Herb Meeder's 79.48. In CS, Jess Osterberg ran a 78.21 over Tyler Hauptman at 80.95. In FI, Gordon Carter's 85.39 won over Jason Scheffer's 88.97.

In FS, Gary Burch's 82.91 dominated the class (of one). In GP, Jackie Corwin ran a 79.97 ahead of Debby Sharp at 83.08. In GS, Jerry Mize's 81.88 took top spot, but the big news was Grant Rayner taking second with 84.08 over his dad, Leigh Rayner, with 84.60. In GSL, Laura Fulbright ran an 87.42.

In HI, Margie Smith-Haas ran a 77.10, while in HP, Bob Pachorek had an 81.75, and in HS, Dick Schroeder had an 81.75. In the IM class, Christy Copeman and Tom Liguori dueled it out in the same car, with Christy getting the win – 75.89 to Tom's





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76.34. Mike and Angela Avitt ran in IP, with Mike turning a 78.15 and Angela an 85.10.

The IS class was very competitive, with Steve Grosekemper winning with 77.17, followed by Paul Young, Jr. at 77.58, Dan Chambers at 77.76, and Paul Young, Sr. at 78.27.

All us old f..., er, fogeys, may need to gang up on these kids. With Erik Kinninger beating Mark, Grant Rayner beating Leigh, Paul Young, Jr. beating Paul, Sr., Austin Smith gaining on Clark, and Greg Sharp gaining on Chuck, we need to remember the old adage – "Experience and treachery will defeat youth and skill every time."

In ISS, Michael Monaco ran an 83.29 ahead of Lori Scheussler at 87.65. In JP, Thomas Hofmann's 81.45 won over Bill Wong's 84.51. In JS, Terry Barnum had it all to himself at 83.70. In JSS, Kevin Moore's 84.39 won over Cathy Young's 85.86.

In KS, David Kochanek ran an 84.05, while in KSS, Mark Matsumoto had an easy win with an 83.03. In LP, Steven Weiler finished with a 78.48, and in LSS, I won with a 77.80 over Charlie Kleinhans' 79.85. In MS, Refugio Delgado's 76.95 won over Akira Kogawa's





77.92, while in MSS, Steven Kennison's 81.01 won over Katina Gonzalez' 85.34.

In NP, Shannon Johnson turned a very fast 75.26 – he missed 10<sup>th</sup> TTOD by just 5/100ths of a second – to beat David Gardner's 76.32. In NS, Tawfik Benabdeljalil's 76.37 won over Kris Scheussler at 81.58. In NSS, Kevin Morse had an 80.67 ahead of Mark Rondeau at 81.50, while in OS, Wayne Begg finished with an 81.43.

In OSS, Tom Meissner's 79.71 took class honors over Brendan Fowler's 82.68. Neil Heimburge in PP finished with an 81.44. In PSL, Lisa Eguina ran her GT2 to a best time of 75.61. PSS was hotly contested, with Ted Drcar's 78.24 winning over Curt Yaws' 78.76, while Janet Yaws took PSSL with an 82.52.

In the BRI, Jess Osterberg continued his domination, edging out Steve Eguina by 6/100ths with a corrected time of 78.21.

After the track was picked up there was lots of bench racing over drinks, as everyone complimented the track design and tried to figure out where they could have picked up another few hundredths of a second. Everyone concurred that this track was a definite keeper – it got all the adrenaline junkies going pretty good, and threw plenty of fun twists at you all around.





As always Hoehn Motors served as a perfect host; good folks and good food. Matt O'Berry Hoehn's Service Manager hosted the session. Porsche Cars of North America was well represented by Ian Ritchie Regional Service Manager and Terry Wells Regional Parts Manager. Ian provided a detailed presentation on the 911 GT3 RS followed by Terry who conducted a question and answer period resulting in some great prizes.

# Volunteer Committee Descriptions

**Archivist** – Responsible for maintaining club records and an inventory of such. Also is our Agent for the Service of Process.

Autocross – Responsible for planning and running competitive & non-competitive entry to medium level driving speed events, including track design, setup, cleanup, and trophies. Auto Museum – Club liaison to the San Diego Auto Museum, reports to the Board on issues and events, attends Auto Museum meetings.

Charity – Makes suggestions for charities worthy of our support to the Board. Responsible for managing charity events, collection of funds, and coordinating with sponsors/donors.

Chief Driving Instructors – Responsible for instructor training and certification and student driver training. Designs and manages the Performance Driving School. Manages the instructor volunteers.

Club Racing – Responsible for planning and managing the Region's club race events (wheel to wheel racing).

Concours – Responsible for planning and managing the Region's concours events (a contest based on vehicle cleanliness and originality).

**Corner Working** – Responsible for managing track corner workers at speed driving events when necessary.

**Drivers Education Events** – Responsible for planning and managing Driver Education events.

**Driving Event Logistics** – Responsible for insuring adequate beverages, ice, lunch, and porta-potties at driving events.

Q Driving Event Registration – Responsible for registration at speed driving events, including collection of funds, assignment of run groups, and assisting in assigning students-instructor pairings.

**Driving Event Pre-Registration** – Responsible for registration at speed driving events, including collection of funds. **eMaster** – Responsible for alerting the membership via email of upcoming events and information that may be of interest.

Equipment – Responsible for maintaining the club trailer and all equipment stored within. Responsible for ensuring that it is delivered and retrieved from club events that require it or the equipment it contains.

Event Insurance – Responsible for communicating with PCA National to obtain event insurance for all events that require it. This position is also our Stadium liaison, responsible for event date coordination with the Stadium.

Goodie Store – Stocks and sells club and Porsche paraphernalia to the membership. Maintains inventory of goods, including financial records and purchases of replacement inventory. Attends major club events to offer goods for sale. Legal Affairs – Provides informal and unofficial counsel to the Board of Directors on legal matters.

Membership – Maintains membership records and provides monthly reports of such to the Board. Mails out welcome packets and renewal packets to the membership as needed. Maintains mailing list for our newsletter.

New Member Liaison – Contacts new members to welcome them to the club. Explains club events and answers questions.

**Porsche Historian** – Researches & writes articles pertaining to various phases/events/autos relating to Porsche.

Rally – Responsible for the design and management of our rally events (a competitive timed touring event on public roads).

Rules – Interface with membership & rules committees for current competition rules and evaluating new rules proposals. Maintains Region website rules page. Technical expertise required.

**Safety** – Responsible for checking track design at parking lot events for safety issues. Makes recommendations, when necessary, to improve driver training, performance, and safety."

**Social** – Responsible for planning and managing our social events.

**Sponsor Liaison** – Acts as liaison between the club and sponsors, finds new sponsors.

**Tech Advisor** – Fields members' technical questions and answers or directs to appropriate resource.

Tech Inspection – Responsible for the mechanical inspection of cars for safety issues at club driving events that require it.

Tech Sessions – Responsible for planning & managing Region tech sessions, typically held at local car related businesses for the purpose of sharing technical information.

Time Trial – Responsible for planning and running competitive & non-competitive medium to advanced level driving speed events, including track design (or scheduling at race tracks), setup, cleanup, and trophies.


#### Kim Crosser

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


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
