



## Muscle Cars at the Auto Museum

A lot to report this month, from new cars on display, the museum's 25th Anniversary Gala details, to the new "Muscle Car " display and a bit of history. The new cars include a classic 1930 Cord L-29, a freshly restored 1972 246 Dino GT on loan from Symbolic Motors, and an extremely rare NSU Wankel roadster. The Dino is a 2.4 liter V-6 coupe that Ferrari designed to compete with the Porsche 911S. Despite Ferrari's best efforts, the 911S was the superior road and roadracing car of the early 1970s. Both the 246GT and the 911S are a form of muscle cars, but clearly one thinks of American muscle cars when the term is used. The Automotive Museum display, currated by Kenn Colclasure, the museum's resident Research Director, provides not only the specific information about each display car, but also informs the viewer about some of the people responsible for the creation of muscle cars. Simply put, muscle cars were created in ever-increasing numbers in the 1960s because they sold like hot cakes and offered a good profit margin for their manufacturers. The Pontiac division of General Motors was run by several hot shots who were jealous of being in GM division sales leader Chevrolet's shadow, and decided to do something about it. GM corporate philosophy at the time was not to be involved in racing and to limit larger horsepower and displacement motors to the full size cars, while medium size or "B" bodied cars received the mid-size displacement and horse power V-8s. Compacts received the smallest motors. The story goes that in 1964, John Z. DeLorean, Pontiac's chief engineer, liked to take "experimental" cars up Woodward Avenue in Detroit late at night to see what Chrysler and Ford

had to offer. The mid-size Pontiac was named Le Mans and was powered by a peppy 326cid V-8. DeLorean realized the larger and more powerful Pontiac 389cid motor would fit right in the Le Mans coupe's engine bay. As GM had a policy prohibiting large displacement motors in smaller cars based on a weight to cubic inch formula, DeLorean offered the larger motor package as an "option." This option included a 4-speed manual floor shift and higher ratio rear end gears, with either a four-barrel carburetor or three twobarrel carbs. This option was known as a GTO. The initial plan called for 5,000 cars being thus equipped. Once the announcement was made, the 5,000 cars sold virtually overnight and a phenomenom was created. Each American manufacturer, including small American Motors, soon responded with their own special cars.

The origin of the muscle car could be applied to many different makes and models. Clyde Barrow, the infamous Midwest bank robber of the 1930s, wrote a letter to Henry Ford praising Ford for building such a fine car with a powerful V-8 motor. Barrow informed Mr. Ford that he always chose to steal a V-8 Ford as a getaway car when he and Bonnie were robbing banks. (The original of this letter is on display at Ford's Museum in Dearborn, Michigan.) The San Diego Automotive Museum points to the 1949 Oldsmobile as being a good example of an early American muscle car. A large photo poster of a 1949 Olds two-door sedan in NASCAR trim with Buck Baker at the wheel is on display. GM's Cadillac and Oldsmobile divisions offered an overhead valve V-8 engine as powerplants for their cars starting in 1949. The lightweight and smaller Olds dominated NASCAR racing in 1949 and 1950. In stock trim the Olds displaced 303ci, and with a two-barrel

carburetor it produced 135внр. In 1950, Florida sportsman Briggs Cunningham took a modified 1950 Cadillac Series 61 Coupe de Ville with ону V-8 and three speed manual transmission to France and ran it in the 24 Hours of Le Mans race, finishing 10th overall. In 1955, Chrysler offered their first 300 model two-door hardtop with a hemi V-8 and two four-barrel carbs as an option. David E. Davis, Jr. a former editor of Automobile magazine, joked about being a navigator in a California Mille-type rally in a dual carb hemi-powered 1955 Chrysler 300. The car was very fast, but with the two-speed automatic transmission, the gas mileage was terrible. They were always looking for a gas station in order to refuel. In 1957, GM's Chevrolet division produced a 283cid high compression engine with fuel injection, high compression heads, and Duntov racing cam that produced 283HP, one horsepower per cubic inch. And the horsepower wars were on in earnest. Ford responded with a 312cid V-8 with cam, high compression onv heads, and dual fourbarrel carburetors rated at 270 HP. called the Police Interceptor. Pontiac also put the Rochester fuel injection unit on their Bonneville. In 1958, multiple carburation systems were offered on Chevrolet, Pontiac, Oldsmobile and Cadillac autos.

The growth of muscle cars in the 1950s could be attributed to the fact that gas was cheap, the cars were simple and easy to work on, even for people without any formal mechanical training, and street and organized drag racing was popular. Young people were able to make good money in a variety of jobs after school, or in lieu of school. Remember the lyrics from the Beach Boys song "409"—"I saved my pennies, I saved my dimes, and I bought my brand new 409." By the

1960s, drag racing grew from racing for trophies to racing for prize money, and many new car dealers saw that racing and winning on Sunday sold cars on Monday. The Auto Museum has 15 wonderful examples of various marque muscle cars on display, from American Motors, Ford, Dodge, Plymouth, Chevrolet, Buick, Oldsmobile, and Pontiac. The cars include an early 1964 Ford Fairlane "R code" 289cid HP V-8 and 4-speed manual transmission; 1965 Pontiac GTO; Ford Torino; 1968 Dodge Coronet 440 V-8; Dodge Charger; Dodge Dart GTS; Plymouth Satelite/GTX 440 with a 727 Torqueflite transmission; 1969 Chevrolet Chevelle with a 4-speed and 396cip big block V-8; AMC AMX; AMC SC Rambler (390cid V-8, 4-speed and air induction system in a red, white and blue paint scheme—you definitely stand out in this car); 1970 Buick Grand Sport Stage 1 with a Buick 455cip motor; an Oldsmobile 4-4-2, and several more.

Opening day for this event was Friday, 7 February, at the museum in Balboa Park. Kenn Colclasure took the Museum Docents around the car displays and explained some of the history. A number of the owners were there as well. Of the four owners who told us about their cars, all now live in the San Diego area and were longtime car enthusiasts. All had drag raced their cars in the past, and one still took his car out to Barona Raceway for fun drags against other car club members. He was a MoPar (Chrysler Motor Parts) man and had a hemi-Charger, 440 wedge Plymouth Satellite, and a Plymouth Road Runner, Most of his cars have automatic transmissions except for one manual 4-speed car. In his teens he had drag raced at the track under dealer sponsorship. He opined that manual 4-speeds were more fun to drive on the street, but the 727 Mopar Torqueflight automatics were faster on the strip because they launched better, faster, and with less wheel spin than the manual transmission cars. Your reaction time and launch time were faster with the automatic. He also noted that he was sold on MoPar products because after years of drag racing, he had never suffered a failure with a Chrysler product. Several of the cars were low mileage examples with only one or two prior owners. All of the owners there with their cars were relatively handy with tools and had done some of the restoration work themselves.

You will note that most of the muscle cars on display are mid-60s to very early 70s. Why? The 1960s were the days of stock and super stock drag racing. As competition grew tighter, more tricks were used to increase speed and reduce elapsed times higher compression, larger motors, multiple carburation, and lighter cars. Some cars had aluminum and fiberglass parts. These parts were technically available to the public as factory parts, but unless you were "Dyno Don" Nicholson or "Grumpy" Jenkins, you could not find them at your local dealer. The 1970s saw a huge change in car manufacturing. Beginning in 1968, increased federal legal pressure created new safety standards, reduction of smog output and an eye on improved vehicle economy. Porsche was always ahead of the big American car companies. While GM complained that it was impossible to make cars emit fewer emissions and be more fuel efficient, Porsche was able to increase their vehicles' performance while reducing emissions and improving fuel economy. GM continued to build large, heavy cars with huge inefficient engines, but reduced compression and horsepower, in order to comply. Federal standards also mandated the elimination of lead from fuel. By 1973, performance "Muscle Cars" were pretty much in the past. Even Chevrolet eliminated the four-speed manual transmission from the Corvette and horsepower numbers continued to decline. The 1970s was the most difficult decade for American car companies. Next month we will have more of the history of the muscle car and more complete descriptions of the specific cars.

New to the collection this month is a stunning 1930 Cord L29 four-door Phaeton in pristine restored condition. With the 1931 and 1932 Cadillacs, and the 1935 Lincoln four-door sedan and 1937 Lincoln Zephyr coupe. you can see some outstanding examples of 1930s luxury automobiles. As the decade of the 1930s saw continued unemployment and growing poverty in America, luxury car manufacturers were closing their doors. Auburn, Cord, LaSalle, Graham, and Pierce Arrow were just some of the builders that closed their doors in the thirties. Another new vehicle is a custom built off-road replica racer similar to Parnelli Jones' Oly Racer. This thing is huge. A viewer the other day asked if it were a prototype Hummer. Be your own judge. A most interesting vehicle indeed.

With the completion of the museum's 25th Anniversary Gala on Saturday evening, 18 January, the museum staff will all have an opportunity to draw a deep breath and relax a bit. Not only was a good time had by all, attendance and purchases set a record. Over 180 people attended. The big sale item was a nicely maintained 1967 Morgan +4 two-place Tourer that sold for \$34,000 after a lot of spirited bidding. Speaking of Morgan, a lot has been going on at the Morgan Company in Malvern Link, England, in recent months. Morgan is a privately-held company with most of the shares being held by members of the Morgan family. Grandson of the founder, Charles Morgan, is the largest single shareholder with 30% of the shares. Charles had brought the company into the 21st Century by building a successful racing program that united Morgan with BMW and resulted in aluminum supercars in the Aero 8 and GT, wherein the cars

are the first Morgans to be built of aluminum chassis and bodies with modern alloy V-8s, being either BMW quad-cam 4.4 or 4.6 engines, and 6-speed transmissions. After increasing production of the four-wheeled cars, Charles also brought back the famous Morgan Three Wheeler as a modern sports car. Sales numbers have been consistently higher than ever before, with modest net profits showing an increase. The most shocking news was that the board joined together to remove Charles from any

management responsibilities. The justification, or reasons, dealt with Charles' alleged failure to follow the board over the company's racing program and refusal to follow the board's directions. What does this have to do with the museum's sale of the 1967 Morgan? With real uncertainty over the future of Morgan Cars, there has been a recent trend in increased values for older and newer Morgans. In 1967, Morgan sports cars sold new for less than an MG-B or a Truimph TR-4a in England. The new Morgans

are priced in the 911 range, and more. Better hang on to your Morgan. Talk to you again next month.


