



# Protoyp Automuseum, Hamburg

This month we have something completely different. An introduction to the Prototyp Museum in Hamburg, Germany, a fascinating small jewel of a Porsche-featured car collection and museum in the richest and one of the most beautiful cities in Germany. The museum's literature states the purpose is to display works of art (Kunstwerke), racing atmosphere (Rennatmosphare), and display "early post-war sports and racing cars, early Porsche designs, self-made constructions, and record cars with important racing history, unique design features and zeitgeist." The owners have done a beautiful job in collecting specific vehicles and creating a comfortable atmosphere of white walls and fixtures with polished wooden and clean white flooring, interesting car displays, a small open theater, art work and information concerning the cars, designers, drivers, and racing history. Familiar names include Dr. Ferdinand Porsche, Ferry Porsche, Butzi Porsche, Erwin Komenda, Walter Glocker, Alex von Falkenhausen, Hans Stuck, Hans Hermann, Otto Mathe, and others. Pre-war Hamburg was noted for its huge seaport and large legal brothel area near the docks. Modern Hamburg retains its huge seaport and legal brothel area near the docks, but the city itself has been transformed since the end of World War II. Leveled by British and American bombers, Hamburg has been totally rebuilt, featuring new and old styles of architecture. The old City Hall has been rebuilt as it was in the late 1800s but surrounding it are some of the most contemporary and interesting architectual designs in modern Europe. The per capita worth of Hamburg's citizens exceeds all other German cities, including Berlin, and the city hums with activity day and night. Surrounded by water, including lakes and water ways, and possessing an

excellent transportation system of buses, trains, trolleys, and cabs, it is easy and enjoyable to get around the city.

The Prototyp Automuseum is easily found, being located next to the nine story, one square block Maritime History Museum located near the pier. Having taken one of the city doubledecker tour buses that offered an excellent English speaking guide, the Prototyp was pointed out as an interesting stop. It also helped that a Porsche 917 in John Weyer Gulf racing colors was on display outside the museum. As one is drawn to the 917, signage indicates the museum is upstairs. Downstairs is a night club and upstairs is the Automuseum. Museum literature directs visitors to experience the world of German racing history through about 40 antique early post-war sports and racing cars, to feel the thrill of wheel to wheel racing and smell the oil, fuel and burnt rubber via film, still photos, and the cars themselves. Films feature the looks and sounds of race cars at full song. Filmed interviews feature some of the greats of the past and contemporary Porsche personalities, owners, designers and entertainers (including Jerry Seinfeld talking about his collection). The entry area is all white, with many windows and light. Being so close to the open sea, the weather is quickly changable and the many windows take advantage of the light that is available. There is also a small Museum Store next to a Cafe with bar and stools. A limited but appetizing menu is listed, together with coffee, tea and cold drinks. Entering the display areas, one is again impressed by the feeling of light with walls, ceilings, and flooring all in white with ample lighting and windows. There is a semi-enclosed area for viewing films, and though the wooden, white, modern designed bench seats do not look inviting, they are in fact comfortable. The first display car is Dr. Porsche's

Type 64 Berlin-to-Rome racer built in 1938/9. The sleek black paint is too perfect for a late-30s race car but the sleek, airstreamed design is still breathtaking. Three such cars were built, but the race never took place due to the outbreak of World War II, when Germany invaded Poland. The Type 64 and early 356 Porsches are also featured in a new book, Porsche by Design: Seducing Speed, edited by Ken Gross. Auto journalist Dan Neil pens a section titled "Porsche and the conquest of air" where he summarizes how the Type 64 and early Gmund coupes were designed with aerodynamics in mind to increase fuel efficiency and performance. He describes the Type 64 thus: "The car's canopy is a mere blister, designed to minimize drag. The wheel openings are enclosed with fender skirts for the same reason. The car's conformation is dictated by its mechanical starting point, the Volkswagen Type 1, which began as Hitler's 'people's car.'"

As one moves into the next rooms, one views several single-seater racing cars and a Porsche Spyder type sports car. The sports roadster is a 1954 Denzel 1500 S, being the creation of Wolfgang Denzel of Vienna, Austria. Denzel used a modified VW engine with twin carburetors in 1,100cc and 1,500cc configurations. The cars were built from 1948 until 1957. The display indicates that Denzel sports cars were successful in European sportscar races. Attendees at the Monterey Historics/Reunion may have noted some of these cars on the Streets of Carmel Concours and at the races at Laguna Seca. The single-seat race cars are a Cisitalia D46 and a 1950 Polensky Formula 3. The Cisitalia was driven by two different drivers, Hans Stuck (the elder) and Otto Mathe. This car is painted red and wears car number 11 on the side. The most famous Cisitalia race car is the type 360, commissioned by Count Cisitalia and designed and built by Porsche at the

Gmund, Austria, site. Porsche earned enough money from the commission to be able to start building 356 sports cars on a limited basis. The type 360 was built for Formula 1 racing. The car was years ahead of its competition, with all wheel drive and a 1500cc engine that produced an incredible 285bhp. It was also incredibly complex. Cisitalia ran into financial issues, which precluded full development of the car. It was trailered to several F-1 courses but never ran in competition. A 1966 VW bus painted to advertise Mathe's products is also part of the display. Several early Porsche pre-A 356 cars are also displayed. A black coupe was one of the first coupes to be built in the Stuttgart factory and also the first 356 coupe to be sold. The purchaser is listed as "an American writer." The car is an 1.100cc 356 with chassis number 5047, and is the oldest surviving Stuttgart Porsche coupe, having been manufactured 4 August 1950. Another VW-Porsche car is a 1947 VW beetle sold to an American major in 1947. No chrome but all the bright work (trim, hup caps, bumpers) were painted the same color as the body work.

Being a racing car collection, there are many interesting racing cars. Modern cars include the first Formula 1 car driven in competition by Michael Schumacher, a 1991 Jordan F-1 191 that he drove at the Belgian Grand Prix in September 1991. Schumacher was then driving for the Mercedes Junior Team, and Norbert Haug granted Schumacher permission to drive for Eddie Jordan. Schumacher qualified the car 7th but mechanical problems forced his retirement after running as high as third. A 1964 Porsche 904 GTS designed by Butzi Porsche was former French F-1 racing driver Jo Schlesser's rally car. The 904 was Porsche's first racer not built from aluminium but fiberglass-reinforced polyester resin. One of the displays features Porsche's last F-1 effort from 1991, the unsuccessful V-12 racing motor developed for the Footwork Formula 1 Team. Porsche had designed and built a

water-cooled turbocharged V-6 for Team McLaren in Formula 1 from 1983-1986. Sponsored and paid for by TAG, the motor was badged as a TAG and carried Team McLaren drivers to three driver's championships. Porsche dropped the turbochargers in 1991 and put two V-6 F-1 engines together to make the V-12 racing engine for the Footwork Team. The result was an engine that was too heavy, too underpowered and too unreliable. The Footwork Team was under-financed as well, and the union was a brief one. There are more racing vehicles, including a BMW LeMans prototype and a Sauber-BMW F-1 single seater.

In addition to the displays, there is a bright orange (non-factory color) Porsche 356A cab in a corner that also has a TV monitor in front of it. On closer inspection, one sees it is a full size video game for young "drivers" to try their luck behind the wheel of this iconic sports car without need for a driver's license or mega bucks to buy the car. The museum store also offers a wide range of model cars, books, posters and other car memorabilia for visitors to purchase as a momento of their visit.

Another interesting group of vehicles are two military off-road vehicles, one built by Volkswagen, the 1942 VW Type 166 Schwimmwagen, and the other by Porsche in 1958. The German Army sought bids from suppliers for an all-purpose vehicle. Porsche's offering was a 1958 Type 597 powered by a 356 50bhp motor with 4-wheel drive. The German Army chose a prototype by DKW instead. Porsche had sufficient parts to build and sell 70 of the vehicles as hunting cars or Jagdwagens. The 597 could handle a 45 degree slope. Porsche had had lots of experience developing such vehicles for the Afrika Korps.

Even though the museum is small, with the films, photos, cars, and information about the cars, drivers, designers, and teams, one can easily

spend a very enjoyable half day here. Add a little time for lunch and going through the museum store, even a whole day would be well spent here.

And now back in the U.S.A. for something new and different. The San Diego Automotive Museum in Balboa Park currently features "Lead Sleds and Custom Cars." The exhibit has been put together by Research Manager, Kenn Colclasure. The exhibit is defined by Executive Director Paula Brandes: "A lead sled is a hot rod consisting of a stock vehicle (usually 1949, 1950, or 1951) that achieved its unique look by the application of molten lead to body panels. The cars were often chopped (cutting down the roof), channeled (cutting down the underside of the car), Frenched (recessing headlights, tail lights, and license plates). In addition, emblems, trim, and door handles could be removed. 'Lead' referred to the material used to add weight. 'Sled' referred to the lowering of the vehicle, giving the cars the appearance that they are slip-sliding down the highway." The museum reception to honor the owners of the display cars will take place on Thursday evening, October 16th, at 5:00pm. The party will have an Octoberfest theme and appropriate beers will be available. These are always fun events, with food and drink and an opportunity to meet the owners and hear their interesting stories about their cars. We will have a full photo display of the cars and details next month. And even though there are no Lead Sled Porsches, the main display features some interesting German cars, including an NSU Wankel-powered spyder and an East German Brabant. Both of these cars are rare and were trend setters in their time. The NSU was an engineering tour de force showing the strength of West Germany industry, and the Brabant was an ecological nightmare that took a well-to-do East German 8-10 years to order and pay for. Fascinating. Please visit. You will enjoy the displavs.

# Performance Boxster GTS Tech Session

On Sunday, 24 August, a group of 55 PCA-SDR members attended a Tech Session hosted by the Porsche of San Diego dealership to view and learn more about the features of the new 2015 Boxster GTS. The new Boxster/ Cayman GTS are similar in their performance features, with the Cayman engine achieving about 10 HP more. These GTS cars don't stay long on the dealership floor and are basically delivered to the dealerships already sold. We were fortunate to be able to view a new Boxster GTS, made available by Porsche of San Diego and attended by its proud owner, Stuart McRobbie, who graciously agreed to delay delivery of the car until the following Monday so we could have it for the Tech Session. More about this Boxster shortly but let me put the Tech Session events in chronological order.

Upon arriving at the dealership, we were greeted by Samantha Razoky, who coordinated the Tech Session and directed us to a catered food and beverage tent where we were able to socialize and enjoy the company of our fellow members. We then proceeded into the maintenance shop, where our eyes feasted on Stuart's gorgeous Carmine Red Boxster (special order paint), with black sport seats sporting Alcantara centers, outlined with red stitching and GTS headrest emblems. Truly a stunning car. I had to pry our members away from examining it to kick off the formal part of the Tech Session.

We were fortunate to have Joe Allis, part owner and manager of Porsche of San Diego, attend our event. I was able to present him with a glass trophy that recognized his dealership as being the key sponsor for our recent successful August Concours event at Spanish Landing. Joe then gave us a brief overview of the ongoing facilities remodeling plan at the dealership. This is quite an extensive effort, with the first phase, the showroom area, to be completed in January and then proceeding to a second phase of updating the service bay areas and parts stowage. Of interest to our older car model owners, Porsche of San Diego will be our SoCal dealership distributer of Porsche Classic Genuine Parts. I also think our club will be impressed when the "Phase 1" remodeling is completed, and we plan to have an open house tour of the new showroom, probably sometime in Feb 2015.

Joe then introduced Daniel Lewis. from Sales, and Chase Stephenson, Shop Foreman, to brief us on the features of Stuart's Boxster GTS. The car's performance specifications are as impressive as its looks. Daniel described the performance of this 3.4L engine—developing 330 HP and 273 Ib-ft of torque, with a 0-60 mph sprint in the 4.1 to 4.3 range, depending if one has the launch control option, while still having an EPA rating of 30 mpg for highway driving. Porsche's Sport Chrono package with dynamic engine mounts is included in the basic price, along with Porsche Active Suspension Management (adaptive damper system), sport exhaust, and 20 inch wheels. Daniel noted that these standard features would be over \$5000 extra in options on the Boxster S model.

Chase then elevated the Boxster GTS on a lift so we could see the

undercarriage and walk around and under the car. Stuart was naturally interested, as we all were, in seeing the underside of his car. The undercarriage is naturally streamlined, but we were able to see the brake cooling ducts, an extra center radiator for added cooling, and the sport exhaust, which opens up in a similar fashion to my GT3 when in "sport plus" mode to produce that glorious sound of a Porsche under full throttle. You may not feel the five-percent power boost, but your ears will certainly hear it and love it. Looking at the lower body panels and new front intakes and rear bumper and taillights give the impression of a car in fast forward motion. I like the looks and performance and if I hadn't just reacquired my RSAmerica, I would be standing in line for a Boxster GTS. Stuart you are a lucky guy, so I guess I will just have to wait for an offer to go for a ride.

In closing, I want to thank Joe and Samantha for hosting the Tech Session. It was also good to learn about Porsche of San Diego's plans for building what I perceive will be the premier dealership facility in San Diego. Also thanks go to Daniel and Chase for enlightening us on the performance capabilities of the Boxster/Cayman GTS. Lastly we may see Stuart and his Carmine Red Boxster GTS at future PCA-SDR events, since he requested information on how to become a club member!




















# September Board Meeting

instructors monitor and evaluate it.


