

Each of the garages had a classic factory Porsche racer along with more museum quality presentation and information about each of them. Besides the cars, Porsche had brought many of the past and present racers to attend. Pat Long, Hurley Haywood, Derek Bell, Vic Elford, Mark Webber, Jackie Ickx and Brian Redman were just a few of the attendees.

At the end of Friday, it was time to get cleaned up and attend the SDR event at Turn 12. The social team had put together a great event, and many of the SDR members who made it to Monterey were in

attendance. They were happily sharing their memories of the day along with the drinks and hors d'oeuvres.

Saturday was another early start and back to the Corral. It seemed to be the busiest day of the weekend as Porsche owners arrived from California and points east. More racing on the track, exhibits, vendor displays, and racer interviews continued through the day. The end of the day was capped off by a Concours d' elegance with many of the racers displayed on the front straight for judging. It was another great photo opportunity!

Sunday the weather finally returned to normal for Monterey with cooler weather and fog. The club racers had another great race with locals including Jerry Hoffman, Frank Powell, Shahin Mobine, Bob Mueller, Chris Pedersen, Paul Young and Bill Dawson driving hard.

Next up was the PDS. With the Friday chalk talk at Black Forest and then off to Qualcomm for skid pad and exercises on Saturday and the autocross on Sunday. ## Heads up From The Hot Seat!

There are many events that cause excitement among event chairs and SDR members throughout our typical calendar year but this year there have been several that have exceeded our best efforts to date and, in some cases, our highest expectations. The 140 car Concours, the two back country road tours with more than 90 Porsches on each, 200 Porsches at Coronado Speedfest with the Porsche Hospitality Tent then of course, the Festival of Speed at Fontana and the Tech-Session at CPR Classic Restoration in Fallbrook to name but a few. All of these would not be possible without the involvement of our generous sponsors who include Porsche of San Diego, Hoehn Porsche, Black Forest, CPR Classic and many others.

This year I have to say the jewel in the crown, to date, has been our Performance Driving School sponsored by Black Forest led by our three Chief Driving Instructors Christopher "Iceman" Riordan, Dave "Maddog" Malmberg and the inimitable Peter "Archibald" Carides, supported by an elite cadre of instructors and volunteers. One volunteer was running to pick up cones at one exercise and on Saturday alone his pedometer registered more than 10 miles!!

To me, the PDS is by far the best thing San Diego Region offers our membership. I have learned that people buy Porsches for many and various reasons, some for the prestige of owning a recognized icon of prosperity, others because they like the striking looks of the car. Still others bought them because they experienced a Porsche some time early in life when they were beyond reach, and have now gained sufficient resources to own one themselves.

I have a strong engineering background and personally appreciate the whole technical aspect from concept through design, build and, above all, function. When all is said and done, a Porsche is a tool for a job - which, I may add, it does exceptionally well - and that is, of course, driving. It doesn't matter why you got it in the first place, you will soon realize that the car is incredibly good at giving you feedback - for this reason, many first-time Porsche drivers state that they feel really connected to the road. Which brings us to the objectives of our PDS which are to teach members how to read, understand and respond to the feedback their Porsche gives them in a safe, controlled environment under the guidance of an instructor. Over the vears huge numbers of students have admitted that until they attended the PDS they had no idea of the capability of their Porsche. Our PDS shirts bear the slogan "Sometimes, in order to find your limits you have to exceed them". This is not a careless comment suggesting

that you continually strive to drive at, or near, either your or the car's limits, it is more a statement that the school offers a safe, instructional environment in which to experience how your car reacts at, near and <u>sometimes</u> beyond its limit - which is typically significantly higher than the limits of the vast majority of even professional drivers.

Porsche cars once published in one of their magazines that more than 90% of their cars are never taken to any kind of performance driving class, driver training, autocross or track event. To me that is like paying top dollar for a thoroughbred racehorse and then keeping it on a lead rope in your back yard. We offer you a chance to get even more enjoyment out of your Porsche by working to become the best driver you can be. In the true spirit of SDR generosity, when a student had a mechanical problem with their Boxster, Sara Gengler (our famous volunteer chair) did what she does best and volunteered her Cayman so the student could continue with the school.

One student at the PDS thanked me and said she was amazed at how much she learned about her Porsche, herself and San Diego. I understood learning about herself and her car, so I questioned her as to what she had learned about San Diego. She said "I had never realized that there were so many late

apexes in San Diego" – take the school, trust me, it'll make sense.

After completing the Friday evening Chalk talk at Black Forest's facility and performing some exercises on driving the correct line through a series of turns throughout Saturday, I had to smile when I heard a small group of students talking on Sunday morning about how the majority of the public "have no idea how to drive a freeway on ramp". As a Porsche owner, you pretty soon realize that \$400 does not go a long way, so, if you can find better value for money than our PDS you owe it to us to tell us about it.

I have published a few examples of member feedback regarding the PDS and also our Tech Session at CPR in this month's Witness, which were received via the Feedback@ pcasdr.org e-mail address which is available to all members to make suggestions, and provide comments on things our region does well and not so well. Please use it – if you are unhappy, please consider suggesting a way to improve whatever it is that bothers you, if you are happy ... spread the word! Share the things vou have benefitted from with other members. Remember "Practice, with feedback, makes perfect".

Please take a look at the proposed changes to the Region By-Laws which the Board of Directors have worked on adinfinitum and have put together for a vote of our membership.

Then ... PLEASE VOTE! By-Law changes require a vote from the membership and do not come into effect until the following calendar year so we are intending to implement these changes beginning Jan 2016.

By the time you read this we should have the candidates for the 2016 Board of Directors selected – so please watch for the PCA-SDR Group e-mails for the results. If you are not already included on the SDR group e-mails please notify our e-master at <a href="master@pcasdr.org">emaster@pcasdr.org</a> this will ensure you get timely e-mail reminders of upcoming events.

Our calendar for November shows we are now on the run-up for the holidays and commencing our Toy Drive for Rady Children's Hospital where we will be collecting new, unwrapped toys at all SDR events from Nov 1 to Sunday Dec 13<sup>th</sup> when we will meet for breakfast and form a caravan of Porsches led by Santa himself!! up to Rady Children's Hospital to deliver the toys. Bottom line ...... BRING TOYS!!!

Bring a toy (or two) to Mike and Carmen Brown's house for the monthly board meeting on the 4<sup>th</sup>. The 7<sup>th</sup> is our Volunteer Appreciation Party to thank the teams behind the scenes who put all our events together throughout the year. 



### October Board Meeting

**2015 Board - Call to Order Board members:** Keith V, Dan C, Bruce W, Rick R, Javier V and Jim B

**Minutes Approval:** A motion was made to approve the September minutes. M/S/P

Treasurer's Report: Bruce W submitted the monthly treasurer's report. M/S/P. A motion was made to reimburse costs for Rennsport V day camp support to attending members. M/S/P.

Bruce discussed inventory of equipment and goodie store in progress and how to proceed. Equipment that is four years old or newer must be inventoried. The goal is to identify number of items and who has them.





Hoehn Porsche provided about 55 SDR club members an informative 13 September Tech Session on E-Hybrid technology. This technology comprises combining gas combustion and battery engine power to provide both improved gas mileage and a more environmentally friendly Porsche which is why these Porsches have green badging identification. The E-Hybrid engine can be ordered in the Panamera, Cayenne and for those lucky few, the advanced engine technology associated with the hybrid 918 Spyder.



Upon arriving at Hoehn, we were treated to a catered buffet of delicious sandwiches, assorted fruits and pastries which we quickly downed

as we viewed the beautiful Porsches on display at the dealership. However what immediately caught our attention was the special ordered black grey 918 Spyder with its engine cover removed to better view the hybrid engine. This is going to be a good Tech Session I thought.



Sean Conner (dealership General Manager) welcomed us aboard and introduced Shaun Puno (new Service Manager) who provided us an overview of the E-Hybrid technology adapted to Porsches. The E-Hybrid is the first plug in from Porsche and utilizes a full parallel hybrid system. We also gained additional insight from Brent Marsh, PCNA field service representative who

was knowledgeable from actually driving the 918 Spyder and who had to field several question of what is was like to drive the super car. By the way he grinned when he gave his answers, you could tell the experience was all good.



Sean Conner then surprised us with the prize of the raffle tickets that had been previously provided when we arrived. He announced the lucky winner would receive a paid customized package of 90 minute track driving, lunch at Restaurant 356 and tour of the Porsche Experience Driving Center in Atlanta. Wouldn't you know it, the lucky winner was Jad Duncan who can certainly do justice to driving a Porsche on any track.




After the drawing, we then got to view up close the E-Hybrid cars on display and were treated to Shaun starting up the 918 Spyder and the sweet sounds of its engine. Understandably, since the car owner graciously lent his car for display, we couldn't talk Shaun into any test drives but we could dream as we listened to the exhaust and viewed the lit up dash.

Afterward we went to the service bay and viewed an E-Hybrid battery pack lowered from a Panamera. That is one huge battery weighing about 500 pounds. Shaun also briefed us on the safety procedures required to do any battery related maintenance on such a high voltage battery. You want to treat any E-Hybrid car with respect for safety working around the battery electronics, but I gained more confidence in Hybrid maintenance from the training required by the Hoehn technicians to qualify to work on such E-Hybrid cars.



I want to again thank Hoehn Porsche and in particular Shaun Puno for conducting the tech session. While the E-Hybrid technology embedded in the Panamera and Cayenne models is well engineered, the 918 Spyder is truly impressive. Since I won't ever be able to purchase such a super car, I can at least look forward to knowing much of the advanced hybrid technology of the 918 Spyder will continue to migrate to the other Porsche E-Hybrid cars.







Our progressive dinner began in Vista, at the home of Craig and Maya. We filled their circular driveway with an assortment of Porsches, and everyone delighted and appetizers and wine before the tour and moved to our dinner location.

Dinner was served outdoors, in the beautiful Home of a pair of our newest members, Greg and Jeni in Scrips area. We had a Mediterranean themed dinner consisting of Greek salad, Pastitsio, and orzo with feta, tomato and dill. Everyone enjoyed their meal under the stars.

Finally we arrived in Rancho Santa Fe for dessert inside one of the biggest garages around! Bill and Vida were our gracious hosts and we got a chance to visit their garage full of various models of Ferraris and Porsches. Dessert wine and dessert bites were served, and we were seranaded with a wonderful acoustic performance by a very talented performer.

The event's goal was simple and unique: create a live race event to pay tribute to the nation's military, and better connect the military personnel to the San Diego community.


Vintage cars from around the country raced at Naval Air Station North Island, on a track that was created in days – a spectator-friendly 1.7 mile course, constructed on an busy runway and taxiway at an active military base. Over the course of two days, race fans, military families, and community members gathered to watch different race groups speed around the track. Guests experienced auto racing's rich history during tours of the race car pits, spoke to the drivers of these unique machines, and toured the Car Club Corral.

The Fleet Week Coronado Speed Festival is Fleet Week San Diego's marquee event. The event features fast-paced, thrilling auto racing and exhibitions for car enthusiasts of all ages at one of the most distinctive race track locations — Naval Air Station North Island, the birthplace of Naval Aviation. Nowhere else can you see a variety of cars racing on a live runway used by the U.S. Navy.

This is the only Navy Open House on the West Coast. Naval Base Coronado is home to over 20,000 active duty military and over 4,000 civilian employees. The general public only gets a glimpse of the daily activities happening at the base.

The Fleet Week Coronado Speed Festival is produced by San Diego Fleet Week Foundation and hosted by the Naval Base Coronado and the Morale, Welfare and Recreation Program (MWR) which benefits military personnel and their families. They in turn provide positive support for the active duty military community and their families.









## **Bylaws Change Proposal**

On Thursday, October 15, 2015 the PCASDR Board of Directors and I met to hammer out the details of the proposed changes to the bylaws.

First of all, the primary goal was to change the bylaws to be consistent with those of national PCA. In the national bylaws, only Active, Life and their Family members are allowed to vote in elections or hold elected office. Our bylaws currently allow for any type of member to vote and hold elective office. This proposal changes our bylaws to be like national's, limiting voting and office holding at our local region level to those member types listed above.

The second goal was to make our bylaws clearer, more comprehensible. The bylaws as they stand today define several different terms, such as "primary member, secondary member, voting member and non-voting member." As the board sat down to address this issue they found these terms confusing and vague. Additionally, none of the definitions of membership from the national bylaws appear in our current bylaws (these are the definitions that we are bound to observe), further confusing the issue. If you didn't have a copy of the national bylaws handy, you had no idea what the member types where or how they were determined.

So, what was changed? First of all, the majority of the changes occurred in Article III, the section about membership and privileges. There were a few changes throughout the document, of course, to maintain consistency, but the meat of the matter is here. Both the current and the proposed versions of Article III are reproduced here.

#### **Current:**

Article III – Membership, Dues, and Privileges

- 3.1 Requirements Membership in the Club shall be limited to members of PCA. Membership includes all categories of members as defined by PCA.
- 3.2 Classes of Membership The Club shall have the following classes of membership: Voting (consisting of Primary and Secondary members) and Non-Voting. The PCA member of record who is currently assigned by PCA to the San Diego Region is called the "Primary member." Any Family or Affiliate member of the "Primary member" (as defined in the bylaws of PCA) is referred to as a "Secondary member." Members who are currently assigned by PCA to a region other than the San Diego Region are Non-Voting members.
- 3.3 Privileges All Voting members shall have full privileges, rights, and duties of membership, including the right to vote and hold office, and all other rights afforded members under the California Nonprofit Mutual Benefit Corporation Law. However, the Club's newsletter and other materials mailed by the Club, including election materials and ballots, will be mailed to each Secondary member at the address of record of the related Primary member. Non-Voting members shall have all privileges, rights and duties of membership except that they may not vote or hold office, and shall not receive the Club's newsletter and other materials mailed by the Club, including election materials and ballots. Non-voting members may convert to voting members by changing their Region affiliation with PCA.
- 3.4 Dues There shall be no dues beyond those for membership in PCA, unless the membership votes otherwise. However, the Club may charge entry fees for events.
- 3.5 Voter Eligibility Eligible voters shall include all Voting members of the Club whose dues are current. To allow for mail delays, lapsed Voting members whose dues have expired not more

than 30 days before the ballot deadline or meeting date shall be considered eligible, as shall prospective Voting members whose applications and dues are received by the Club before ballots or meeting announcements are mailed, even though PCA has not yet acknowledged them

#### **Proposed:**

Article III - Membership, Dues, and Privileges

- 3.1 Requirements Membership in the Club shall be limited to members of PCA currently assigned by PCA to the San Diego Region. Membership includes all classes of members as defined by PCA.
- 3.2 Classes of Membership The Club shall have the following classes of membership: Full, Family and Guest.
- a. Full Members– Any member who is registered with PCA (possesses a PCA membership card) as an Active or Life member. They must own, coown or lease a Porsche, or be a substantial owner in a franchised Porsche dealership or distributorship, be 18 years of age or older, having paid club dues and fees as required. Full members are allowed to vote and hold office. Full members may request either a Family member or a Guest member but not both.
- b. Family Members— A Full member may request a member of their family who is 18 years of age or older, to be their Family Member (in lieu of a Guest member). This is a member who is registered with PCA as a Family Active or a Family Life member (possessing a PCA membership card). Family members are allowed to vote and hold office.




