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



This month will again be busy with lots of events, but one will not be the Krispy Kreme & Cars. Until we are able to come to agreement with the management of the shopping center it is on hold.







Charity Committee: PCASDR received \$450 national subsidy.


Museum: The star cars as seen on TV and the Movies exhibit continues.

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
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

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Dateline: EL CAJON California, 14 August 2016
The current rally committee has a not very well hidden agenda of bringing more participants into the potentially challenging Time Speed Distance (TSD) area of the rally world. This Casino Rally was planned as a mellow, fun event that would include both a mix of TSD and "gimmick" compo-



The TSD components included;

- an odometer zero waypoint
- an interesting / challenging test where participants were asked to maintain two separate average speeds between Checkpoint 1 (Time Out) and checkpoint 2 (Time In) in order to arrive at Checkpoint

2 at a specific time interval measured between their Time Out and Time In waypoints. Rallyists have points added to their score for every .01 minute (one hundredth of a minute!!) differential from the ideal transit time. The goal is to have the lowest total in this event.

The casino-themed gimmick components included;

- Roulette wheel spins at the start and two checkpoints
- A Poker hand draw at the start / finish and 3 checkpoints
- A dice throw at one checkpoint, that's as close as we could come to emulating Craps.

Scoring the gimmick components was interesting.

For roulette, each team was asked to select their bets for each of the three stations. Paul Young created some ingenious score cards that allowed each team to select and record their bets. They could choose either; a single number which if they hit paid 36:1 or zero, or Red / Black which paid either 2:1 or Zero, or any number between the segments; 1 – 12, 13 – 24, 25 – 36 which



paid 1:1 or zero. Yes, it sounds complicated, (this is NOT a technical service / repair article), but thanks to Paul, it was actually pretty simple to score. Teams either received; 36 or 2 or 1 or 0 points at each of the checkpoints for the roulette portion. At the start the team used a spinning roulette wheel placed in front of the right front wheel of the Rallyist's car. Wherever the roulette wheel stopped, the number on the wheel that aligned with the car wheel's valve stem was the winning number. Poker was much easier. Since we had 5 cards in play, the Rallyists were playing 5 Card Stud (no wild cards). Scoring was as per Hoyle, but would have needed a bit of consideration if any team ended up with five-of-a-kind.

Dice (Craps) was simple. The Rallyists threw 5 dice and their score was totaled and recorded.

Whew, that's out of the way, I did say that this was a non-techy article, right?

Forty "rallyists" (Drivers and Co-Drivers) along with seven rally committee members participated in the Casino Gimmick Rally. The route was in South East San Diego County and covered nearly 95 miles, which took most teams about 2 hours and 15 minutes to complete.

The day started early (for a non-track day event) as the rally committee arrived by 7:50am to setup the registration table and sort out the various inevitable last-minute details that appear at

any event, no matter how well pre-planned.

We were a bit surprised to see how many participants showed up early, but we thanked them for their punctuality and put some of them to work in helping the committee perform registration. We also had the chance to chat with a few PCAS-DR Tour organizers who were out test-driving the tour route which just happened to use the same starting point as the rally. As the sounds of the Tour organizers GT3s and a certain example of a British marque faded in the distance, Eric Marc-Aurele and Tom Gould provided the general rally instructions. Their instructions must have been pretty clear, because the first Rallyist team went off nearly 5 minutes ahead of schedule. That ahead of schedule thing would prove to be a common theme.



All the Rallyists got off without incident and the committee dispersed to the various checkpoints. Remember that I said ahead of schedule was a common theme? The first two teams were nearly 10 minutes ahead of the most ambitious anticipated schedule and arrived at Checkpoint 1 just as the checkpoint was being assembled. Fortunately, Bev and Tom Gould were managing Checkpoint 1. Bev and Tom have scouted / organized and managed several PCA Parade rallies and there is little they have not seen in the years they have been rallying. Handling a few teams that were early was easy for them and co-worker Michael Pykelny.

The Rallyists circulated through the course and the committee members had the chance to see the Rallyists' looks of hope as the roulette wheel spun, the Poker cards were drawn and the Dice were thrown. The committee members also had the pleasure of hearing many flat sixes pass us at full chat since the course had a few out-and-back sections.

Everyone made it back safely to the start / finish location and headed into a convenient TGIFridays for food / camaraderie and the all-important score totals.

Yes, the driving was much fun, but this was a competitive event also.

The TSD event was crushed by uber experienced TSD Rallyists Jack Rabell and Dick Rafter, second place was won by Carmen and Ricardo Olimon, in third place was the team of Maria and Joseph Wiest.

Roulette high score was won by solo entrant Jason McClure. He hit his picked number on the spin at the start and scored 36 points right there!

High Poker hand was the team of Carmen and Ricardo Olimon (again) and Low Poker hand was the team of Maria and Joseph Wiest.

High Dice throw was the team of Doug and Jack Dill, while Low Dice throw was the team of Katie and Ray Cheney, (in this reporters opinion, they did win the un-official award for best sounding car though).

It was a good day; the Rallyists had fun and the Rally Committee organized a successful event that snuck in some TSD elements.

Look for the next event late in 2016 which will be a bit more TSD focused. Hope to see you there.







Hopefully, by now, you will have heard the term "Performance Driving" – even if only because PCA-SDR conducts a **Performance Driving** School (PDS) twice a year at Qualcomm Stadium.

First and foremost our Performance Driving school is not a forum for students/attendees to learn how to drive. In fact quite the contrary, one of the requirements of attending the school is that you must already be a fully competent driver. The PDS is also **not** a racing school. There is no aspect of competition in any portion of the curriculum and all driving during the school is done with one car driving at a time. Additionally, to attend you are required to be a member of PCA and have a valid driver's license.

If you're a member of PCA, you must have acquired a Porsche at some point and, as we all know, the primary function that all models of Porsche perform best is to be an excellent driving tool. Porsches are recognized by many as some of – if not "the" best tool for the job of driving.

Some may think owning a Porsche has other important advantages – perhaps for demonstrating wealth, letting everyone know that you have "arrived". Still others may see the Porsche as an

objet d'art or, as I heard it recently referred to ... fine garage furniture. We believe that owning a Porsche and **not** taking it to any kind of driver training or car control clinic, is akin to paying top dollar for a thoroughbred racehorse and then keeping it in your back yard on a lead rope.

The fundamental reason behind the success of the brand has without doubt been the way in which it fulfills its design intent of providing the driver with feedback. It is this feedback and the way it is delivered which causes first time Porsche drivers to say things like "Wow! It really hugs the road" or "It corners like it's on rails." It is this same feedback that instills the driver with confidence and enables them to comfortably drive at a higher level than lesser marques. The cars' capability is so much higher than the majority of drivers will ever be aware of - let alone achieve, the thought occurs that to some extent, this superior vehicle is not only not being used properly, but to varying degrees ... wasted on all but the best of drivers. This definitely does not mean that "mere mortals" can't truly enjoy learning to drive a Porsche well.

So we come to the question what IS Performance Driving?

In San Diego region of PCA we define Performance Driving as "Having the knowledge, understanding and ability to safely and expertly drive any vehicle." Please note there is no reference to driving at speed, or to driving at, or even near a limit (be it your limit, the car's, or the legal limit).

The reason performance driving is described so concisely that way is as follows. The goal of our PDS is for participants:

- to know how their car will perform or react under several sets of conditions e.g., in a tightening turn on a wet road on a step hill.
- 2) to have a clear understanding why the car will behave in that way and
- 3) to be able to safely drive the car under those and many other conditions.

This begs the question "How on earth do PSDR Performance Driving school students get to do all this?" The answer is - for the past twenty plus years we have run our PDS in three distinct sections, each of which is intended to isolate various aspects of normal driving and to analyze, discuss and experience these aspects first hand – in a safe environment with the aid of an experienced instructor.

The three PDS sections are:

- An evening in a classroom environment with a presentation including videos and detailed descriptions of the fundamentals of driving, including such topics as understanding vehicle safety, understeer, oversteer, tire contact patches, driving "the line", car control up to, at and beyond the limit. This of course leads into accident avoidance, correct braking technique, proactive safe driving techniques and elimination of bad habits.
- 2) A full day performing several custom exercises designed to isolate and demonstrate your Porsche's handling characteristics with the aid of an instructor. To enable students to feel their Porsche near or at the limit, we perform most exercises on a wet skid pad. This means that the way the car behaves at 60 miles per hour can be demonstrated at 20 miles per hour and has the additional bonus of a significant saving on tire wear.
- Another full day where students drive a course laid out with cones, which is intend-

ed to demonstrate how the skills they have discussed and learned during exercises can be put to use to expertly drive their Porsche. The Sunday track is a non-competitive autocross which means that students drive the track with no timing system running and, as a consequence, both drive and learn at their own pace - again with an instructor.

So all of the above is a fairly logical, factual description of what goes on at a PCA-SDR PDS, however, none of the above even begins to express how much fun it is driving your Porsche in a controlled environment and seeing how it really handles.

To put it mildly, this school is an absolute blast! It doesn't matter what type of driver you are, whether you have had your Porsche for ages, or are brand new to it - you will learn so much you will wonder how on earth you have been driving for so long without knowing this "stuff." It will make you a safer and much better driver and without doubt increase your capacity to enjoy the pleasure of Porsche ownership.


Bottom line... you have paid for this amazing machine and owe it to yourself to learn to use it properly.

Our PDS is conducted twice a year – once in the spring and again in the fall and the price for the whole weekend (including meals) is \$475. 



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
