
Up FrontWhere the Engine Belongs







September Board Meeting

September 7, 2016

2016 Board - Call to Order at 7:13pm Board members Present: Dan Carusillo, Matt Schiller, Keith Verlaque, Rick Richardson, Sara Gengler. Absent: Bruce Wing, Karen Garcia Raines

Secretary: Approval of prior meeting minutes. M/S/P. There were two email votes between meetings: Tech Session with SD Wrap, Elite Finish Detailing and AutoArmor approved as a club supported event on 10/8/16, and Bev Gould appointed as Sponsorship Chair.

Treasurer: Report as submitted. M/S/P. **Old Business**: **Dan Carusillo** reported that
Director Javier Varon was hired at Porsche of
San Diego. The Board of Director annual election
will include ballot submission via mail and event
ballot box and votes will be tabulated via the
Tabulating Committee. The Grand Prix Region is
hosting a Driver Education National Instructor
Certification and region DE/TT instructors must
nominate candidates. The idea of the Windblown
Witness Editor Trophy/Plaque is still being
evaluated.

Tech Session: There is a tech session 9/10/16 from 9:00am to 12:00pm. There will be a tech session at Elite Finish Detailing and AutoArmor on 10/8/16 from 10:00am to 12:00pm. Approval for Porsche San Diego Tech Session for 12/11/16. M/S/P.

Rally: The Casino Rally had 21 participating teams and it was an excellent event. A future event date will be proposed, possibly 12/3/16.

Speed Fest: John Bell reported Coronado Speed Festival planning continues and the budget changed from \$7000 to \$6000 with removal of live TV feed from plan. The event has a good supply of volunteers including local students from university engineering departments.

Autocross: Mark Curran provided reconciliation for AX on 8/7/16, 94 drivers, and 8/28/16, 91

drivers. The AX team, always innovating, brought in a shaved ice truck to both events during hot summer months. Discussion occurred regarding cross training of software manipulation. Orders have been placed for additional medals and autocross team shirt resupply. The next autocross events are 10/22/16 and 11/20/16. Discussion ensued about post-autocross celebrations and for post AX Social Event club will provide limited beer and wine only. Standing rule: An autocross event is over when track is cold and trailer packed and the event chair declares the event is over. Then the event transitions to a social event and the standard social event guidelines apply about food and drink. M/S/P.







Space and timing are still in the planning stages but look for an exciting exhibit early in 2017. More news to follow.



The wonderful family that owns the 1966 Bizzarinni P538 V-12 race car that has been a long

standing featured display at the Automotive Museum were invited to display the car at the August Concours in Pebble Beach. The family had displayed the car at Pebble Beach twenty years ago when the car was awarded a third place trophy in its class. This past August the Concours had a special display featuring Bizzarinni cars and the P538 was one of ten on display. The family requested that the Museum Executive Director and her assistant attend the event. The Museum's hard working volunteer staff helped prep the car for display, including replacing the rear tires. It made for a long day but everyone associated with the car were thrilled at the honor.

The new display at the San Diego Auto Museum features a model of automobile that has become nearly extinct in recent years, the station wagon.

Was it because of the movie "National Lampoon's Vacation" featuring a putrid green 1970ish Ford LTD Country Squire wagon with faux wood siding? Was it because of too many real family vacations without DVD players that screened child fare cartoons and movies in newer mini-vans? Or was it because too many mothers found it much easier to be able to step up and into a van at waist height rather than bending down into a too-low car with too much stuff and difficult



access. Whatever. As one of the BMW Club columnists was noting in the recent September edition of The Roundel, even mini-vans have largely been replaced by SUVs and "crossovers," that is smaller and sportier models of the SUV. Even Porsche has done it with the Macan "S" and Macan Turbo and Macan GTS. If you have noted Porsche auto sales figures lately in "Panorama" you will note that more than half of Porsche sales now are Macans and Cayennes. Before one criticizes the marque too much, it is suggested that you actually drive a Macan. On a recent Alpine Tour driving from the Zuffenhausen factory through Bavaria into Austria, Switzerland and Italy with Porsche Travel, four of the ten cars were Macans including two that were used for everyones' luggage and the Macans handled, accelerated, and cruised well enough to keep up with the Cayman GT-4, a 911 Turbo, and other performance Porsches. But I digress.

Fifteen "station wagons" are on display ranging from Henry Ford's first production wagon, a 1929 Model A "Woodie." Oh, you say, Ford started years earlier building Model T wagons. That is correct, but you had to add your own wagon body to a Model T chassis if you wanted a wagon. The Model A was ac-tually built at the Dearborn factory with a wagon body in 1929. Next in age is a 1940 Ford woodie. There are five 1950 steel wagons ranging from a 1953 DeSoto Firedome, a 1955 Studebaker Conistoga wagon, a 1957 Chevrolet two door Nomad,

a Ford 1957 Ranch Wagon, and a 1957 Dodge Sierra Custom. Four American wagons from the 1960s include a 1962 Nash Rambler, a 1962 Ford



Falcon Squire, a 1963 Chevrolet Bel Air, and a 1968 Pontiac Bonneville. The European wagons include a 1964 Mini Countryman, a 1970 Saab ex-rallye car, and a 1973 Volvo P1800 ES Estate wagon. There is also an AMC 1976 Pacer which is a kind of 1970ish version of a crossover. Except it doesn't handle real well and does not have much sportiness, although AMC tried to boost sales late in the production run by offering a V-8 motor.

A reception for the cars and owners will be held October 20th at 6-7:30pm in the Museum.

Over 40 PCA SDR members attended the tech session at Charlie's Foreign Car in Encinitas.

There were a variety of cars on the lifts and on display including a couple Porsche cars from Charlie's personal collection.



There was an excellent line-up of cars to showcase the nuances of select generations of Porsches. Niko Sougias and his crew selected three lucky attendees' Porsche cars and put them up on the shop lifts. The cars selected were two older model 911s (a euro spec 930 and a 993





Carrera 4) and a Cayman. There also happened to be a 996 in the shop that was undergoing some repair.

We learned about oil leaks and maintenance items that owners should be vigilant about when examining their cars, especially for the air-cooled 911s.

Our attention turned to the water-cooled generation. We talked in depth about the dreaded Intermediate Shaft (IMS) bearing and water pump failure. The bearing used on the Intermediate Shaft was first used on marine motors and


originally spun via the inner bearing race. In the Porsche set up, the bearing is spun via the outer race.

Water Pumps in our water-cooled Porsches have been known to fail. The plastic impellers on the water pump can wear out and cause major problems for your beloved Porsche. Make sure you get those checked every 50,000 miles or so!

Key takeaways:

- Consistent oil spots in your garage warrant a check up with your mechanic
- Your choice of oil is really important, check the bottle and make sure the Porsche specification is listed on the bottle. (I.e if you buy Mobil 1, check the label so that you are not purchasing and filling your car with a blend meant for BMW motors)
- Before springing for that shiny water cooled
 Porsche check with the owner about maintenance and find out whether the IMS has been serviced/replaced





It has been a long summer away from the big tracks so the Zone 8 autocross was a fun event to exercise the 928 and keep the driving skills fresh. I have most recently been using the 968 at the Q so it was fun to bring out the big dog to play. Power oversteer is always a fun condition. After getting through tech and my numbers in place it was time to socialize and catch up on club gossip before the drivers meeting.

With the other Zone 8 drivers we had a good turnout to enjoy the track. At the meeting we also had the instructor pairings and I found I would



be working with Sunny Rickard in her Spec 944. Actually it turned out I would be instructing Sunny in my 928 but since I did not fit in her passenger seat she would be on her own in the 944. this ended up working out well as she mainly wanted to get another perspective on the track. After the meeting there was time for the parade laps to help learn the track and also acquaint drivers with the new track marking scheme. Andrew Simmons and Marcus Kramer have been adding elements from SCCA and OCR in their track designs to minimize the sea of cones that can be intimidating and confusing for new drivers. Although it can also sometimes be frustrating for experienced drivers as they try to learn the new system.

On the parade laps there seemed to be a couple of the gates that were confusing and after discussion some more pointer cones were added to try and ensure everyone stayed on track. I thought it would be clearer using yellow cones to mark each side of the gate but the AX chair felt that the yellow cones were best used as apex markers. After the final adjustments it was time to start the practice sessions. I was in Red and we were

up in the 3rd practice session. Although the parade laps were a help in learning the track, it always looks different at speed and from the driver's seat so I started out slowly to heat up the tires and get a better look at the track. It was a fun and fast track that flowed well, although the bumps in the NE corner of the Drive-Thru made getting the power down difficult and the off-cam-

ber corners were also tricky. The next couple of laps went well with Sunny in the passenger seat: but on my last lap after she left to get her car ready it all went wrong coming out of Bow-Tie and into Sunrise. The camber was taking away my rear grip and as the 928 rotated it finally went too far and I could not bring it back so I just kept my foot in it and did a 360 between the gates and kept going. Not the fastest technique but still fun and since I was between gates, no cones and I was still on track! In my second session I started smoothly with the cold tires but as the tires warmed up and I started pushing it got more complicated. The run started with a


short straight and then quickly started turning left and a shift to 2nd before we started turning through a set of esses leading to the swale. The swale crossing was very good but after the swale the track went around the Budweiser paddock and there was a patch with a good bump in the middle of the sweeping right as we headed into the "Trouble Brewing" section that was downhill and off-camber and then led into a set of gates and the "Morse Cones". These offset gates kept

shifting the track left then right then left and right before taking us in the "Drive-Thru" hairpin with the bumps from patches worse on exit when trying to accelerate out and then turn right into the "Speed Slalom". I could carry lots of speed through here but had to slow to make the final section into the "Bow Tie" hairpin especially since the exit was off camber and the tail wanted

to slide away. Just enough acceleration would catch the tail but too much would make the slide worse and I would have trouble getting into the "Sunrise" gate with any speed. After the gate it turned right and down the hill into the "All Downhill" section with acceleration before the braking cones at the "Snout" and a sharp left and then right out of the gate and leading to an offset gate "Airlock" with a quick right-left and then into the final gate for the last corners trying to accelerate through without sliding and then the timing lights. Individually the sections were not too bad, but all together there were lots of places to make a mistake and lose time in another 360 spin be-

tween gates. I was faster on my second 360 and lost less time but felt it would not work well in timed runs.

After my practice session I had a short break for lunch at the truck and even time for a Hawaiian Shaved Ice that was sponsored by Curran Pools for the driver's enjoyment. After the snacks it was time for my corner work session at the start of timed runs, but first there was delay for the final safety check. After the track was inspected





and cleaned up the timed runs began. I was working corner station 2 before the swale and thankfully it was mostly quiet during timed runs. AT the end of my work session I was able to walk in to the pits and take a break before my timed session.

Red was running last but we were early enough that there was no problem with a low sun. First lap went smoothly on cold tires with a 1:41.32. The next lap I was pushing harder and with warm tires dropped to 1:39.12. The next lap started poorly as I spun my tires off the line and then over-cooked a corner and ended up with a 1:39.92. Last lap was my best and ended up with a 1:38.94, but at least no spins during timed runs and all the cones stayed upright. Sunny had run in Blue and did well with a best of 1:38.63 and consistent laps all within 0.37 seconds, I should probably ask for her instruction next time. TTOD was between a pair of 2105 991 GT3's with Tom Tweed's CC15 beating Mike Avitt's SS09 car 1:26.10 to 1:26.98. But you did not have to drive Porsche's latest and greatest as 3rd place went to Kathy Smalley in a CC09 200 Boxster at 1:27.44; which also took top BRI honors. Next were the CC10 Cayman GTS and S of Jack Brennen and Marcus Kramer at 1:28.10 and 1:28.12. Rounding out the top ten was Bill Thorp at 1:29.23 in the shared 2000 Boxster then Douglas Blake in a SS06 Cayman S at 1:29.96, Keith Verlaque in a CC13 GT3 at 1:30.36, Ricardo Oliman's

CC10 Cayman S and then John Kinkaid's SS04 Cayman S. Yes all of the top ten were from the 21st century and water cooled with 5 Caymans, 3 GT3's and a Boxster.

In 944 Spec Dave Diamond was fastest at 1:34.29 and Adrian Bortolino's 944 took CC02 at 1:34.12 over David Witteried's 911S at 1:35.60. CC03 went to Gary Burch's 911 at 1:32.29 and Blake Bastain too CC03 in his Boxster at 1:34.52. CC05 had Ryan McClune's C4 winning at 1:33.45 and in CC06 it was Mark Curran's 911SC at 1:31.43. In CC07 Terry Barnum's 911 just nipped John Rickard's 914 1:30.87 to 1:31.31. In CC08 Benjamin Fruehauf's C4 was tops at 1:32.64. CC12 had Craig Hill on top at 1:31.10 and CC14 went to Diane Cafferata's GT3 at 1:35.08.

On the SS side SS01 went to Charlie Kleinhans' Boxster at 1:38.00 and SS02 to Jay Gedanken's Boxster at 1:33.94. SS03 was Brett Goldstock 's C4 at 1:35.05 and SS05 was Tom Sharp's C4S at 1:33.47. SS07 went to Kevin Sechrist's GT3 at 1:3140 and SS08 went to Greg Burnett's Turbo S at 1:31.31. Top X cars were Robert Joe's 2012 MX5 Miata at 1:27.56 and Carl Lewis's 2006 Miata at 1:27.91. Yes, those momentum cars are very fast in the right hands.


The next SDR autocross will be October 22 at the Q West Lot so start planning now.






