

I hate deadlines, But here I am again behind and trying to get out this issue of the Witness. I had hoped to be able to get more writing done while I was up at Sonoma Raceway this past weekend, but it did not work out that way. It was a fun time at the track and the World Series along with general fatigue after a track day conspired against me and my writing aspirations. So I did not get started on my Willow Springs article until I returned and now trying to get my column done to finish up this edition.

Sonoma looked good for the most part, but there was evidence of the recent fires as I drove around. The hills above the track were burned but it did not get down to the track. Driving to Napa you could see the bare hillsides that burned and some places where the fire came down and jumped the road and burned buildings but the fires were now out and the smoke and bad air quality were in the past.

I had brought my 968 to the DE event and it ran well and was able to keep up even on street tires. Last year I went up but we had rain both days and the track was never completely dry and I did not get a good idea of the line. This time we had great weather and it was even more fun to drive. Trying to link up turns 1 and 2 was a challenge and with

the walls and off-camber track-out I did not push too hard for turn 10. GGR and Zone 7 are hoping to be able to put together an event with SDR and Zone 8 at Sonoma Raceway to include a club race as well as DE/TT. This event was a NASA event with a GGR DE run group that I was in. There was quite a variety of different cars, with a large field of Spec Miatas and Spec E30 BMW's along with a Historic NASCAR Race group.

Coming up soon will be SDR's last track weekend for the year at Buttonwillow Raceway Park with a Club Race and TT. I am also planning on going to Laguna Seca for a track day with Diablo Region on the Monday before Thanksgiving. I only wish we had a track closer to San Diego.

Speaking of Laguna Seca, Rennsport Reunion VI will be there at the end of September next year. It will be a great event and you should try to get there if at all possible. Unfortunately it is scheduled for the same weekend we had been going to Willow Springs for our Club Race and TT. We were able to move the event a week earlier, but I don't think a Club Race would make sense the week before the Rennsport Races.. So it looks like we will just have the Buttonwillow event next year.





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


I will be the board's non-voting advisor.


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



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## SDR Coffee & Cars Sept. 24





It all started innocently on a clear sunny day in San Diego as the caravan started at Black Forest. Steve was towing the 911SC that he would be driving and I had the 944Spec "Punkin" behind my Expedition. We met up at Gopher Canyon with Cathy Young's Boxster S towing her tire trailer and Mark Rondeau who was driving the "Silver Bullet" his 911SC out to Willow Springs Raceway. the "Fastest

Road in the West", for the San Diego Region's Club Race and Time Trial.

The traffic went smoothly and we arrived at our lunch spot along with John Rickard, Ricardo Olimon and Alain Staid at the Subway where the 138 meets the I15. After lunch it was another easy drive on to

Lancaster although we did see 2 fire trucks driving the other direction which turned out to be for an accident behind us which slowed the later drivers. After a quick stop at the Hampton Inn to register we headed on to the track and unloaded the trailer

and helped Steve set up his garage and the 911SG compound after Ethan arrived with his toy hauler and FrankenBoxster.

Not long after our arrival, the PCA National staff arrived with Allen Shirley as our steward, Pat Heptig as our scrutineer and Chuck Pirelli to handle timing and scoring. With their arrival and

> Phil Strong bringing all the national equipment boxes we could start setting up for registration with Cathy Young assisted by my wife Pat. Although there were no rookie drivers, there were a couple of cars that needed log books to get started for the scrutineer to check. The



since no Orientation Meeting was needed we were done early and headed back to the Hampton to clean up for dinner. Cathy had made reservations



for a large group of 13 to include the PCA National staff at the Black Angus. After a short wait we were led back to a long table and started ordering drinks and then food for the evening. The table was too long to communicate from one end to the other so the conservations were split up into 3-4 threads going on simultaneously. After dinner it was back to the Hampton to turn in for an early start on Saturday.

Saturday was an early start with the drivers meeting and then the club racers were out first to warm-up. Since there was only one racer group there was a good 15 seconds between the frontrunners and the 944Spec racers. I gridded up near the back and kept my eyes open as I tried to see how the track was in my 944. The good news was that the cornering speeds were good and close to the other groups, but the straights were another story. I started on scrubbed tires and slowly worked my times down and was down to a 1:41.59

97 cc.09

on my last lap. Unfortunately I was still behind a couple of the 944Spec racers of Isabella Busalacchi and Tim Meyer, but at least ahead of a 944Spec and a Spec911. At least those were the times from the lap timer; I had no official timing as I forgot to flip the switch for the transponder for a rookie mistake.

Steve was up in Red and he enjoyed being back in the 911SC and while using up some old tires he was down to 1:38.80 with Mark's 911SC just ahead at 1:37.28 and Jad Duncan's 996 was leading the group at 1:32.30. Don Middleton was aptly named as he was in the middle of the pack at 1:35.69 in his 911.

We were back out for another practice session and my times were more consistent and improved to a 1:41.24 but still behind the front-runners. It was an interesting session with the closing speeds on the front straight and then the exhaust backfire from the turbo as Dan Davis passes you by and then brakes for turn 1. I tried to keep my head on a swivel as the there were several of the cars under 1:30, including Davis in GT1, Dave Elsner in GTC6, Nathan Johnson in GT3 and Sohaib Kureshi in GTA1. There was also a large GT4 contingent with Dan Carusillo, Frank Powell, Peter Czajkowski, Bruce Wing and Jeff Schmidt in a tight group 1:32 to 1:33.

Steve was up again in Red and improved to 1:34.82 but the group leaders were now Alex Marmureanu's X-class Evo at 1:28.44 with Rick Levenson's CC15 GT3 at 1:28.96 and Jae Lee's CC16 911 at 1:29.56. Jad was next in his CC13 996 at 1:30.59, just ahead of Mike Avitt's CC15 GT3 at 1:30.62. Ethan's CC11 Boxster was improving to a 1:35.45, just ahead of Mark Rondeau's CC08 911 at 1:36.30.

Our third practice session was before lunch and although the temperatures were rising my times were about the same with a best of 1:41.83. I was still trying to find a good landmark to set up turn 9 and carry enough speed onto the front straight, because it was all about momentum in the 944.

Our next session was scheduled for practice starts, but since there were no rookie candidates, it was changed to a qualifying session and so we

went green from the first lap. Over lunch we had swapped tires and put on a new set of Toyo RRs for qualifying. I was gridded behind Isabella and tried to hang with her as far as I could and ended up with a best lap of 1:41.55 which was again 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 944Spec group.

After qualifying we had a short break and it was time to set up my cool-suit for the race. We added the ice packs to the cooler and put on my cool-suit T-shirt when it was time for the sprint race. I was gridded near the back and behind Isabella and Tim but in front of Randy Bergum's 944 and Paul Friedman's Spec911. As we left the grid, there was some confusion as there was no splitter on the grid for the later cars and we had to try and figure out which side we belonged on.

At the green flag my luck continued as Paul was able to pull ahead before braking for turn 1. I was able to get back around him but Isabella and Tim



and the rest of the field had pulled away so I just kept my head down and worked on running clean laps. It started well and my second lap was down to a 1:40.90 before settling in to a stretch of 1:42 laps before the leaders started coming through and I was concentrating harder and my best lap dropped to 1:40.85 on lap 12 (actually matching the transponder time to Harry's Lap Timer to the hundredths).

In front of me Tim Meyer had pulled ahead of Isabella at the start and she spent the next several laps working hard to find a way by before finally making her pass stick and she stayed ahead to the finish with Tim in  $2^{nd}$  and I was in  $3^{rd}$  in 944Spec. Isabella ended up winning the Corner Worker's Choice Award for her drive.



Further ahead the winner was Dan Davis (GT1) with a best lap of 1:25.32; Dave Elsner (GTC6) was next with a 1:25.779, then Nathan Johnson (GT3) at 1:25.254, then Sohaib Kureshi (GTA1) at 1:28.787 in 4<sup>th</sup> overall. Next was Dan Carusillo (GT4) at 1:1:32.047, Frank Powell (GT4) at 1:31.702, Phil Strong (GT3) at 1:31.866. Other class winners were Charles Wirken (GTD) and Sean Neel (SP911) and Joe Wiederholt (SPB).

I was done by Steve had some more fun to go. He was taking John Rickard out in the 911SC and then it went all wrong. They got loose in turn 8 and then went off into the tumbleweeds with a nice 720 spin. Unfortunately the also lost the throttle cable and needed help to get back in and when they



did arrive the car was dirty and they were full of tumbleweeds under the car. It took a while to get cleaned up and running but no major damage was done except maybe to John's confidence in Steve's driving. And it made for some good video.

So for the last session of the day he ended up taking out the 944 to help refine the handling with the new tires. He did better in the 944 and turned a best lap of 1:39.76 in his last lap. It was mid-pack of Orange with Mike Rozenblatt leading in his CC13 Cayman R and Alain Stad next at 1:34.88 in his CC16 GT3. Angela Avittt's CC14 GT3 turned a 1:38.84 and Cathy Young's CC08 Boxster turned a 1:42.92.



At the end of the day it was time to head over the Happy Hour Social sponsored by Vision Motorsports. It was good to meet with the other drivers at the end of a good day at the track. Share stories and excuses about our driving exploits. After the social it was time to check the cars and pull the memory cards from the video cameras to download. The 911 had plenty of good video, but there were no files from the RoadHawk HD in the 944. Another rookie mistake, the lighter plug was not fully inserted for the camera and so it was not turning on when the car started.

Next it was back to the Hampton to clean up and then Cathy and Mark joined us for a quiet meal at the Round Table Pizza in Lancaster. Craft brews and pizza along with lots of water helped to rehydrate from the desert air. After dinner it was another early night. Although the racers had a later start, I needed to get in early to get the radios charged and handed out to the corner workers to get the day started.

Red was out early and Steve took advantage of the cooler weather and turned a 1:33.00 and was just behind Ethan at 1:32.46 and just ahead of mark at 1:33.26. Rick Levenson led the pack at 1:28.52, just ahead of Jad at 1:29.34.

We had a warm-up session and I just worked on my line and trying to carry more speed out of turn 8 and into turn 9. First few laps were slower and then the next few were at 1:41 and then I came in to save the tires.

Steve had another Red session and turned a 1:34.31. Jae Lee from Mirage International was picking up the pace and led the group at 1:27.56 followed by Jad and then Mike Avitt.

Now it was time to get ready for the second points sprint race. I had set up the cool-suit again as the temperatures were still warm in the race suit and it was soon time to head out onto the grid and then out on the track. This time the splitter was working and we were lined up for the start and got the green flag.

I was immediately passed by one of the faster cars who had a DNF in the first race and started at the back and then I came up on Isabella as she had a big wiggle in turn 1. I followed her up and around the Omega and then passed her on the back straight which told me something was not right with her car. Then in turn 8, I looked in my mirror and saw that she had some smoking and I thought she had a broken suspension and tire rubbing.

Now I looked ahead and tried to catch up with the rest of the pack. But as I came down the back straight I could see that there was dust in turn 9 and yellow flags were waving. I slowed and drove through dust cloud carefully and there were a couple of the front-runners off in the dirt. We kept going and I was catching up and then found we were under double yellow. As we came though



turn 8 the next time the safety crew had cleared the cars and I expected we would be going green soon. But the next time through the crew was busy working on an oil slick in turn 8 and then we were black flagged and brought into the hot pits and stopped. The smoke from Isabella was not a tire rubbing, but a blown motor and an oil slick that caught the leading cars as they came into turn 8 on their second lap.

The good news was that the race was just before lunch as it took awhile to get the oil cleared and to send us back onto the track and then another lap before the finally gave us the green flag to start racing again. It was déjà vu as I was passed by one of the cars who had gone off and tried to keep up with Tim's 944 but he slowly pulled away and I was holding down the back of the pack. I was trying to pinch turn 9 and stay out of the oil-dry and still carry speed onto the front straight.

Then the leaders started coming through to lap me. Thankfully they were spaced out and passed quickly on the straights. The last excitement came as Charles Wirken was limping home and I passed him on the final lap on the back straight and then took the checkered flag.

Dave Elsner (GTC6) was the winner with a best laps of 1:24.885 and followed by Nathan Johnson (GT3), Sohaib Kureshi (GTA1), Charlie Persico (GT3) and then Dan Carusillo (GT4) in 5<sup>th</sup>. Rounding out the top ten were Frank Powell (GT4), Philip Strong (GT3), Peter Czajkowski (GT4), Mark Davidian (GTA1) and Bruce Wing (GT4). Other class winners were Joe Wiederholt in Spec Boxster, Sean

Neel in Spec 911 and then Tim Meyer in Spec 944 and I was in 2<sup>nd</sup> in Spec 944 with Cahrles Wirken finishing last but taking the top spot in GTD. The fastest lap went to Dwain Dement with a 1:24.795 but he was a DNF along with Roland Schmidt, Randy Bergum and Isabella who now had a hole in the side of her block with parts falling out.


The rest of the afternoon went quickly and we were soon ready for timed runs. The big dogs lined up first and after the first group was flagged off it was Jad Duncan (CC13) for TTOD at 1:28.21, just ahead of Rick Levenson (CC15) at 1:28.43, Mike Avitt (CC15) at 1:30.35, Robert Forrester (CC14) at 1:31.88 and then Ethan Dahlkamp (CC11) at 1:32.32. Rounding out the top ten was Mark Rondeau (CC08) at 1:32.93, Ricardo Olimon (CC11) at 1:33.23, Steve Grosekemper (CC09) at 1:34.11, Bruce Wing (CC12) at 1:34.46 and Don Middleton (CC12) at 1:34.58.

My timed laps went well and I came through at a 1:42.19, but was nipped by Dave Diamond who took the top spot in 944Spec at 1:42.07. CC04 went to Mike Miller at 1:44.95, CC05 was Diane Cafferata at 1:47.49 and CC07 went to Dave Hockett at 1:36.72. CC16 went to Alain Stad at 1:39.60 and SS04 went to Anastasia Berta at 1:48.09. In the X-men Russell Shon nipped Robert Bazier 1:34.76 to 1:35.53.

Then it was time to pack up the trailers and head for home. We ended up taking the I405 home and made good progress and started planning for our next events at Chuckwalla and then Buttonwillow.









The current exhibit at the San Diego Automotive Museum in Balboa Park truly fits the description "and now for something completely different." The display features off road vehicles ranging from major manufacturer's trucks that are capable of being driven off road, such as a 1970 Chevy Blazer previously owned by racer/actor Paul Newman; an early Meyers Manx Dune Buggy, a VW powered fiberglass special capable of being driven on the beach or in the desert sands of Baja California; or full on off road racing vehicles such as SoCal builder "Corky" McMillin's Beagle Two SCORE off road Baja racer and a 2010 Geiser/TSCO 455cid displacement Desert Racing Truck from El Cajon. The latter racer has to be seen to be believed. The owner is TSCO which stands for Tube Specialty Company that fabricates pipes and tubes. This



truck has raced from Las Vegas to Reno, off road, in the Baja 1000, Parker 425, SCORE San Felipe in 2016 and the 2017 Mint 400. This monster truck weighs 6,000 pounds and is powered by a 455cid American V-8 producing about 850hp. The truck's panels have been removed on one side to view the chassis and reinforced cage and header. The engine is still concealed. With the matte gray finish, the truck looks like what one would imagine as being from an invading force from outer space. Motorcycles have always been well represented off road and this display is no exception. One of the rarest bikes is a 250cc CZ 250 from the Czechoslovakian Weapons Factory. CZ started bike production in 1932. After WWII the bikes won seven Motocross Championships with East German riders. This bike was displayed and featured in a Paul Newman film, "Sometimes a Great Notion."

Something more familiar to Southern Californians who may occasionally go off road for recreational purposes is Bruce Meyers' Manx #1 "Old Red." Bruce Meyers grew up in Southern California during the days of hot rods, rock and roll, and surfing. He saw some heavy and ungainly vehicles being driven off road with heavy clunky engines and thought a small air cooled opposed four cylinder Volkswagen engine would work a lot better. He took a modified VW Kombi bus with wide rims off road, calling it "Little Red Riding Bus." His next try was with a metal frame molded inside a fiberglass body to attach



the metal suspension parts and engine to. This process was heavy, complicated and expensive. Old Volkswagen beetles were plentiful and he redesigned his fiberglass bodies to fit on a shortened VW floorpan. The process was simple and light, reduced the cost of assembly and the cars were incredibly quick and fun to drive. Almost like a Porsche. Meyers designed other dune buggies including a "Towed" built to be towed by ones passenger car and only fit for off road driving and without all the features required for road vehicles. Bruce and his wife still live in SoCal and will be attending a book signing party at the Museum in November.

This is but a taste of the wide selection of commercially available off road vehicles and several home built "one off" creations on display. Several new vehicles have been added to the permanent display side including a 1957 Cadillac Series 70 Eldorado Brougham, a 1970 Buick GS high performance coupe, a 1969 Jaguar XK-E 2+2, and a 1969 Impala Low Rider. The most unusual of the four is the 1957 Cadillac Brougham. Cadillac had

claimed the title "Standard of the World" for their vehicles for decades and 1957 was the 50th Anniversary for the marque. General Motors with chief stylist Harley Earl were at the top of the automotive kingdom and the Brougham model was a special order handmade edition limited to 400 cars. The model offered over 45 leather trim interior combinations alone. The 365cid V-8 produced 325hp. Luxury features were years ahead of its time with an automatic trunk lid release, automatic memory seats, cruise control, high pressure cooling system, electric door locks, power windows, six-way power seats front and rear, and air conditioning. The transmission was a four-speed Hydra-matic automatic. Luxury and exclusivity did not come cheap. Original price was \$13,074. The owner of the display vehicle recalled that the first time he saw such a vehicle was in the early 1960s where he was working as a car washer at a hot rod and muscle car shop in the San Fernando Valley. He stopped and stared. He never saw another until he found this one several decades later. This car has been lovingly restored to factory specifications including the original power train.

The 1970 Buick Grand Sport GS 455 represents a different love affair with power. GM had downplayed high performance cars since around 1964 when they decided not to pursue the Corvette Grand Sport as a possible Cobra beater in sports car racing. GM had a policy of not putting the largest V-8 engine in that line into the lighter bodied cars. So Pontiac's John Delorean instead offered an engine "option" of a 389cid V-8 in lieu of the smaller 326cid V-8 for the lighter bodied Pontiac two doors and the option sold like hot cakes. Thus the Pontiac GTO was born in 1964. Late 1968, 1969, and 1970 was the end of the Muscle Car era (okay into 1971 but they were dropping compression ratios to conform to lead free and low octane fuel by then). This Buick is one of the few factory hot rods that

Buick built and it was a beauty. Offered in two stages with even more power with Stage II, this car has been modified by the owner with larger pistons, hotter camshaft, high performance heads, and larger carburetor and MSD electronic ignition; an excellent example of the breed.

These are but a few of the many outstanding display vehicles in the Museum. The visuals that accompany the Off Road vehicles are worth your admission price alone. Open daily from 10am.
