



President (Tom Gould): Summarize procedure for tonight's meetings of the 2018 & 2019 Boards. Summary of Zone 8 Presidents' meeting.

Secretary (Keith Rampmeier): Approval of November Board Meeting minutes. M/S/P. Ratify E-votes: (Karen) Sponsor appreciation gifts. M/S/P.

Treasurer (Tom Brown): November financial report submitted. M/S/P. Concours accounting complete except \$250 from one delinquent vendor: LUSO car rentals. Attempts made to collect by phone and mail was returned undeliverable, despite the business location being staffed.

Wine Tasting (Tom Brown): PCA National sponsor Penfolds hosted a wine tasting on December 4th, which was a big success with 51 attendees and sold out in 2 days with 20 people on the waiting list. Thanks to Ilko for helping with the initial contact with Penfolds.

Club Race (Tom Brown): Buttonwillow Club Race had lower attendance than last year and some expenses were up (Club Race qualified corner workers, extra scrutineer).

Membership (Gisele Gonzalez): Primary/Affiliate/Total: 1730/984/2714, YoY: 10/-21/-11. Discussion of driving higher event attendance by new and inactive members. While driving event attendance is down, social events are seeing strong attendance.

Charity (Lori Chesley): Toy Drive for Rady is now through December 16th. Breakfast with Santa is December 16th, 9-11:00_{AM} then caravan to Rady.

Tours (Keith Verlaque): The Nov 17 Back Roads Tour had 98 cars, 148 participants and had to be divided into 2 separate routes. Also, tons of toys were collected for the Rady Toy Drive.

The parking lots are full by 3PM so taking a taxi/Lyft/Uber is a good idea.



If you have an interest in the Porsche Cayenne and Macan SUVs, December was an action-packed month for SDR members and their families, starting with a Cayenne and Macan-focused Tech session, then a week later was the Cayenne and Macan Off-road Adventure driving tour. The tech session was on Sunday December 2nd, 2018, where Porsche of San Diego graciously hosted the "Cayenne and Macan Off-road Technology Education Session". Dealership General Manager Shawn Evans went all out as usual and hosted a fantastic event with a catered breakfast with a delicious hot buffet of all kinds of breakfast foods. They also had a couple fire pits set up outside with marshmallows, chocolate and graham crackers to cook up your own s'mores. After the breakfast was an hour long slideshow that was displayed on the new showroom wall displays which covered the various technologies that the Cayenne as well as Macan utilize to make them surprisingly capable off-road machines. While it is true that the majority of Cayenne and Macan owners will never dare take their beautiful machines off the pavement, the Porsche engineers didn't hold back, as the Porsche SUVs possess significant technology that allow these models to make off-roading not only possible, but fun and safe.

The tech session slide show covered the different Cayenne generations and their various drivetrain, brake and suspension systems, and the control systems and strategies that the vehicles utilize to handle the unique traction and handling challenges that occur when off-roading. After the slide show, attendees were ushered outside where Camp Cayenne was

constructed by Shawn Evans and his Porsche San Diego dealership team. There were three 3rd Generation New Cayennes available for attendees to watch or ride in and even drive on the obstacle course laid out in the parking lot of the dealership. The two-part obstacle course had offset dirt ruts which lets the Cayenne teeter diagonally on two wheels and still progress despite the limited traction available. Then there was a graded hill that felt like you'd fall out the side of the vehicle if you weren't strapped in.

The course ended at the recently renovated workshop where all three generations of Cayennes and a new Macan were raised up on the shop lifts, as well as a prior year Macan. Those who were interested and had eaten enough of the good food, hung out in the shop examining the undersides of the SUVs, taking a look at and discussing the suspension systems, wheels and tires, as well as the underbody protection panels that help the Cayennes make it through rougher terrains. It was interesting to compare the changes between the three Cayenne generations, with the New Cayenne being a completely different machine compared to the fairly similar first and second generation Cayenne models. And it was also interesting to compare the Macan's chassis layout to its bigger sibling. The event was a great time for everyone: it was educational, it was entertaining, and did I mention the food was incredibly delicious? Thank you to Porsche of San Diego's Shawn Evans and shop foreman Chase Stephenson, as well as everyone that made the event possible, and made it a great one!



After the tech session, the next Porsche SUV-focused event in the San Diego Region was a Cayenne and Macan Off-road Adventure Tour held on December 8th, 2018. The event was held about an hour and a half from Coastal San Diego on off-road trails in the Anza-Borrego Desert State Park. Leading up to the event there was some excitement and possibly anxiety about the weather, since two weeks prior, as well as two days prior, there was considerable rain in the Borrego area. Fortunately for our event, the day prior and the day of the event were clear and sunny, making the terrain and surroundings perfect. The recent rains made for an overall spectacular event since the air was clean, the trails were damp so they were not dusty, and the very sandy loose areas were fairly well packed, so getting stuck was less of an issue. Thanks to the rains, this was one of the few times I could do the entire off-road drive with my windows down due to the lack of dirt flying in the air. Unlike driving on paved roads, rain can and usually does completely change the shape and surface of the trails, making existing ruts deeper while creating new ones, exposing rocks, as well as feeding the bushes so they grow wider, making some areas quite challenging to maneuver without getting scratches along the doors.

This event had 19 vehicles show up with numerous different first and second generation Cayenne models: there were Base, S, Turbo, and GTS Cayennes and even an S-Hybrid Cayenne in attendance. There were three Macans which did extremely well despite their road-focused tires and limited ground clearance. On some of the looser surfaces they'd slide around, grabbing for traction, but overall they performed impressively and didn't need any help. The Cayenne S-Hybrid had a bit of a challenge climbing a steep loose section of the trail and initially got stuck, but after using some momentum gained from starting off with a back tire against a big rock, we were able to get the economy-focused Cayenne up the trail. There were several non-Porsche vehicles that joined in the fun, though they might have had even more fun if they were driving in a Porsche instead!

For this tour, the trails were a fantastic mix of slow climbing and descents where careful tire placement was necessary while crawling at 1-2mph at times. Then there were the sandy wash regions where speeds of 40-50mph could be attained if your tires and suspension did not rattle your teeth to pieces. Along the trails there were areas of rocks to avoid, bushes and sticks to dodge, and in one section there was even a Cayenne headlight on the ground that couldn't be avoided. The rough trails apparently dislodged an incompletely installed headlight which unfortunately got pulverized by the rest of the pack that was moving a rapid pace. Checking that the modular headlight assemblies are properly locked in place if they've been recently removed is one more thing to add to a pre-drive check list!

The event was designed in two parts, with about 3 hours of off-road driving for the first part which was the more technical and varied part of the Adventure. Then after a short pavement drive we arrived at the second part of the drive which was a fun and fast 4 mile drive to a viewpoint called Fonts Point, which overlooks the Borrego Badlands and the Salton Sea. Everyone enjoyed the brisk drive up to Fonts Point where we stopped and had a picnic lunch while enjoying the view. At the conclusion of the event, the drive back down the 4-mile sandy wash from Fonts Point was just as fun, especially as I watched a Cayenne GTS having its last off-road hoorah doing donuts in the dirt before returning to the pavement to head home!

If you have a Porsche Cayenne or Macan and are interested in experiencing its off-roading abilities while exploring back country roads in areas most cars or people can't access, bring the entire family and join your PCA-SDR friends on an upcoming Adventure Tour!
