



The BUZZ

Driving in another country can be a (sur)real experience!

I was reminded of this during my recent trip to *Prague, Bratislava, Vienna, and Budapest*. During my years in the wine business, I drove extensively through France, Italy, Germany and Spain, but it had been 20 years since my last trip to France, so definitely far in my rearview mirror. Since the *Czech Republic, Slovakia, Austria,* and *Hungary* are only a few hours apart, it made sense to rent a car for our long weekend excursion, even with gas over \$9/gallon—talk about pain at the pump!!!

As someone who especially enjoys driving in Europe as I've found that Europeans in general are much better drivers than Americans, I have several observations.

As usual, European drivers generally excel at driving in the right lane, using the left lane only for passing. That's because speed limits are largely disregarded on European highways, composed of the French *Autoroute*, German *Autobahn*, Italian *Autostrada* and the rest, so it's common

to find luxury German sedans or Italian sportscars charging up your bum *well* in excess of 100mph/160kmh! Highway accidents are not very common in the EU, but when they do occur, they are nearly always fatal, so survival of the fittest means staying in the right lane until you can safely pass, and you best triple-check your mirrors before doing so!

When we encountered road work, eye-catching dashed orange lines next to the standard white lines alerted drivers to reduced speeds in construction zones, which *ARE* enforced. That seemed clever, and just last week I noticed a section on the 5 North where they did the same.

I thought this was cool: traffic lights went from green, to green and yellow, to red, then red, to red and yellow, to green, so you were always prepared for the light change. On the other hand, I was mystified when I occasionally saw stop lights with stop signs posted above them: clearly it was meant to get your attention, but talk about mixed messages!!

My favorite thing was an almost total absence of stop



signs. Instead, most minor intersections had Yield signs on the secondary road, so as long as no vehicle was coming, you didn't have to stop. This struck me as not only a great time saver, but also much kinder to your engine and passengers. It always strikes me as pointless to come to a complete stop when there's not another car anywhere in sight!

We enjoyed many outstanding meals over my 11-day vacation, but one of my favorite stops was *James Dean* restaurant in *Praha* (Prague) near *Old Town Square*.



This classic American diner features seating inspired by *Chevrolet Bel Air* armchairs from 1952 and other vintage autos. Images of *James Dean, Marilyn Monroe*, and *Elvis Presley* oversee a genuine *Coco-Cola® cash register* that chimes "cha-ching!" when opened, and a well preserved, fully functional *Seeburg Coca-Cola® jukebox*. The diner attracts photographers by the score, eager to see the memorabilia and "unique" urinals—you'll have to google them, they're a bit too *risqué* for this family publication—but I suggest you do!

Not having traveled to Eastern Europe before, I was curious to see what the mix of cars would be. Besides the ubiquitous Skodas and many Toyotas and Hyundais, all of which are manufactured there, I saw an abundance of Mercedes, Audis, "Beemers" and Range Rovers, in addition to plenty of Porsches-mostly 911s, with many Taycans, *Macans*, and a handful of *GT cars*. There were *Lamborghinis* and Ferraris, Corvettes and Coopers, even a few Bentleys and one purple McLaren 765LT Spider, a real head-turner. All in all, it was a magnificent trip, and I can't recommend Prague and Budapest highly enough. Now...back to the **REAL** world!

Call to order at 7:03 P.M.

President's Message

The board will hold an Executive Session tonight after tonight's regular meeting.

Anastasia spoke about the National Meeting: Drones will be allowed at events with stringent rules, which are being defined. There will be rules such as strict controls over who gets to drive the drone, what sort of license will be required, etc.

National Membership is up over 6% last year. This is quite a jump. Anastasia noted we are on track to do better this year. She thanked Eric Shooks, who is giving a PCA card to everyone who buys a car at Porsche San Diego.

Board members are calling new members and forming good bonds. We had a German woman who met Loxie on Instagram. She offered to be host to anyone who is going to Germany to pick up their vehicle, providing support such as where best to stay, which restaurants to try.

Ian addressed income and expenses, noting they are shown in his report by class or event group. The total column shows a healthy net income so far, but it's largely attributable to pre-payments for Porsches and Parks, and the Wine Tour; expenses for the two major tours are yet to come.

Still, if those are taken out of the picture, we still have a decent profit. The Time Trial was just this past weekend, so hasn't figured into the report yet.

The club CPA has filled out the taxes for the 2021 year. A lot of expenses that were included before the books were closed were included into last year, so the fed and state taxes are down to a nominal amount. Ian requested approval to pay the taxes.

Loxie Shooks has joined the Social Committee and is our Social Media chair

Anastasia is sending out an email requesting someone step up to be our Last Tuesday Social-North Chair

New Business

Name badges here! Anastasia handed out badges for the board and chair persons who were in attendance. More are on the way. Discussion led to agreement that the previous badge style will continue to be used for new members that join the club.

VOTE: To approve using the old badge types for new members: M/S/P

Anastasia still has to send out the email listing the chair liaisons for the board.

Chair Reports

Social

Victoria wants approval for four events:

a. 3/30 - Porsches and Pours 6PM TBD (working on a cidery)

b. 4/17- Progressive Brunch (like the dinner but daytime on a Sunday, 12PM start 4PM end.

c. 5/31 - Movie Night: Top Gun – Maverick

d. 7/16-7/17 - Mystery Weekend (Joint event with Vineyard Region)

Discussion about conflicts ensued. The Progressive

Brunch would be on Easter, Movie night would be on Memorial day. Tiffanie called Victoria with this result. They proposed new dates for the first three; retained the Mystery Weekend date. See near the end of the minutes for the result.

Victoria also requested Board approval to advertise the Vineyard Region installation dinner on the PCA-SDR calendar.

VOTE: To approve putting the Vineyard Region installation dinner on the PCA-SDR calendar: M/S/P

VOTE: To approve July 16-17 date for the Mystery Weekend: M/S/P

Tom addressed the Wine and Food event, providing the budget to the attendees. He noted the need to move it to March 28.

VOTE: To move the Wine and Food event to March 28: M/S/P

He addressed the budget for the event, noting it was close to break even, but unless something comes up, there should be a little net profit at the end. It would be held at the same location as the last Wine and Food event, Wendy's home.

VOTE: To approve the Wine and Food event budget: M/S/P

Victoria asked for board approval to advertise the Vineyard Region's April 9 installation party.

Tom initiated discussion, noted that he agreed, there is no threat to the San Diego region from the Vineyard region; his only concern is that our membership may be deluged with too many emails about Vineyard events, since they've already expressed some issues with San Diego region events. So, while we would agree with advertising Vineyard events, it should be limited to significant events and driving tours. Since driving tours are so incredibly popular and we can't hold enough of them, providing more to all members would be of value.

Tom suggested that since both the Vineyard driving tour and installation Dinner are in April, maybe we could combine them in a single notice, perhaps a President's message. Maybe do a combined set of announcements...

Tom said he would figure out how to support Vineyard announcements such as these, since Victoria asked him to help with this.

VOTE: To approve advertising the Vineyard Region's

installation party to SD Region, with some ad grouping as proposed by Tom: M/S/P

Tom provided a short update on the California wine tour; it has sold out and, as Ian stated, the money flowing in. Tom is working to wrap up the final details.

Richard Trang: Orange County Cars and Coffee Tour: Richard recapped the main points, proposing April 2 for the tour.

The board agreed that this should be subject to the same caveat as Vineyard advertising; put it into the combined advertisement. Rick Richardson has agreed to support the tour itself. It will start at the Starbucks in Carlsbad. He will get release forms to be signed before the start of the tour, and provide wrist bands to the participants. He also has to obtain insurance.

VOTE: to approve April 2 for Cars and Coffee OC Tour: M/S/P

Tiffanie addressed the 2022 Wounded Warriors golf tournament. Last year, 15 PCA-SDR people were involved in the golf tournament for wounded warrior homes. Tiffanie brought a copy of the flyer that Mia intends to have for the Porsche club to be more involved. The golf tournament will be held on Sept 18, 2022. They gave us 2 rows to park our cars. The flyer she brought was reviewed; and we noted that they should change "Region 8" to "PCA-SDR".

VOTE to approve advertising the Wounded Warriors Golf Tournament on 18 Sept 2022: M/S/P

Tom had looked into locations for a PCA-SDR concours, and found an unprecedented demand for locations that would be appropriate for a concours. He would normally go to rent it in March, but is finding the venues are already rented. We will need a new venue if we're going to have one. He hasn't done any research into that. Any ideas welcome.

John and Katie addressed the La Jolla Concours, noting that all 36 spots have been taken up by members. We have people on the waiting list if others drop out. In addition, they are now sending out emails to sign up for a visit to the hospitality tent.

Mark Curran: Short update on DE/TT. The DE/TT event we just had this past weekend was a success. The track was completely repaved and is now one of the favored tracks. It is as smooth as it could be; Mark got positive feedback from everyone who attended. The reconciliation report still pending. He will bring it to the board next month.

He noted we have not yet reached capacity for the upcoming Chuckwalla event, but there is still plenty of time for people to sign up.

Anastasia had a happy announcement to make about the great turnout and lots of students for the Willows event. During the weekend we just had, thanks to the CDIs' great work, we now have 6 new instructors. Well done, Rob and other CDIs. Other qualified drivers are now willing to go through the process of becoming instructors.

Lana: Membership update. She noted it was the usual standard report, but did notice our numbers went up significantly this month. Eric Shooks has been telling people who walk into the dealership to join the SDR. We got 36 new members this past month.

Steve and Lana discussed creating, by next month, little business cards that say "own a Porsche, join the club". We got a bunch of those from national, last month. Steve replied that the ones he and Lana were creating show more about the activities we have, where to sign up, etc. The ones Lana has prepared are worth doing in addition to the ones national sent us. They would also get them to Eric, to provide Porsche San Diego customers.

Anastasia discussed going to the EVOC with Bill and Mike. It will be a fabulous facility. They are ironing out the contract details with the attorneys. The month of May is a good possibility to start using that venue for AX.

Tours, Ian: Ian noted that he kept the February tour registrations at just over 100 drivers signing up. Requested anyone that expect not to make it would cancel, and those who did who did not make it mostly complied and canceled on motorsportreg.com to let him know. This allowed him to assign several spaces to waitlisted registrants. There were over 80 cars at the drivers' meeting. They used a new

route, going through Bonsall and Fallbrook, Temecula and Sage, which, by all reports, was well enjoyed. Ian noted he had an excellent group of tour leaders who worked it into manageable groups.

Question on a schwag request, to get hats or something for the tour leaders. Anastasia routed him to Rhonda's email/ website for the goodie store. He ordered badges for the tour leaders for those who did not already have one for another reason. He intends to order hats for tour leaders, so they're noticeable in the tour crowds, and will submit a budget request for that next time.

Ian will submit a May tour plan next time as well.

Social revisit: Carmen had talked with Victoria about changing the requested dates, so the votes were held on new dates

Tom also noted he had been having trouble setting up new events in Motorsportreg this week; he would be working with them to figure out a solution.

President's Message

National has a new emphasis on PCA Juniors and is addressing it with newsletter, social media, and event presence. PCA Juniors includes kids under 21, and can participate at 15.5 years old; kids younger than that can participate in non-driving events. Anastasia is interested in finding a chair for this

Anastasia noted that PCA members from other regions can now receive our Calendar emails

Drone use at events now allowed with very stringent rules, must be on insurance, licensed pilots only. If anyone interested in doing drone work for the events, she will be glad to give you the giant checklist.

Secretary

VOTE: To approve March minutes: M/S/P

Treasurer

The current status is, overall, very positive for YTD. Things to consider are revenues received vs. expenses not yet accounted for; this occurs in the latest DE/TT and in the Porsches and Parks tour.

VOTE: To approve March financial report: M/S/P

Old Business

Tom Brown gave Victoria Varon a gift for serving on the 2021 board. All other board members received their gifts at the Installation Dinner in January.

Zone 8 is planning their Zone 8 Grand Tour 2023, most likely to occur in October 2023. They will stop in every region for a day. We are looking to provide one or two (preferably two) PCA-SDR members as committee members. These representatives should be very familiar with the zone, and willing to be involved for an hour or more each month. These representatives would suggest restaurants, hotels, and activities (such as driving roads and other

group activities) for the committee when staying in our region, anticipating 50-60 people on each leg. The tour itself should take a total of 15 days for 15 regions.

Chair Reports

LJ Concours

John & Katie: Update on Hospitality tent 4/24

They got a \$500 grant from national, accompanied with a request for a budget. John noted they had never done that before. He requested guidance and support on how to proceed.

John presented a map of the entire concours site. Parking spots for the entrants will be adjacent to the grassy field. Porsches will be left and right from the entrance. They may also put tents between the cars.

There will be 38 cars. 56 people have signed up for the hospitality event. Everyone who signed up, should have gotten a package in the mail, with ID tag, tickets, instructions (e.g., where to get your car located). Katie has a couple volunteers lined up, but will likely ask for volunteers on the day. Anastasia suggested requesting twice as many people as we think we need.

John noted they have most of what they need, including a parker and a pourer. Cars have to come through a check-in gate on Coast Blvd. going away from the cove from there. The other side of the street will have traffic.

Charity

Bev, Item #1: update on Virtual Food Drive: We have \$1,175 at this point. To get that much in donations in such a short amount of time is amazing.

Item #2: Ronald McDonald House: Bev talked to their coordinator about creating a wish list drive for the families who reside at the house, displaced from their home. The proposal was to have a wish list drive from May 20 to July 23. We would collect all the acquired items, tour to the

Ronald McDonald House on the morning of 23 July, give them the physical items, and do a photo op. The House coordinator thought it was a great idea. We would then tour to the 65th anniversary party after that.

Bev asked for support, rather than trying to do this all on her own. We could set up an Amazon wish-list for this drive. We would also need marketing, graphics, and an email contact and social media contact. Martha McGowan said she would be willing to help to collect items in various locations.

We would also need a tour leader (or leaders) to the house, then to the anniversary party.

Bev also addressed the national subsidy: she is looking into using their subsidy for both this and Wounded Warriors or, if we have other support, then leave the national subsidy for WW.

VOTE: To approve the wish list drive from May 20 to July 23, ending with a tour to Ronald McDonald House: M/S/P

Item #3.

Ronald McDonald's Director of Philanthropy is also planning a poker run. In the past, this was typically a motorcycle run. This year, they are asking the Porsche cars to join in. Victoria is "retiring" as Social Chair at end of year, so we need a new Chair. She is creating an opportunity for a new person to do this next year, after having done this for 9 years. A team of people might be a better solution going forward, given the number of events we are creating post pandemic. She is asking the board to please support me at this endeavor.

Tom Brown provided a review of the French Wine & Food event. He joked that the Porsches & Wine events seem to be curing the drought; in both Dec and this past one, they were both on the rainiest days of the month. 





What Porsche did NOT tell you about the PCM

My 2022 Cayman GTS 4.0 arrived without two expected features: sensors to open the luggage compartments and a PCM Wi-Fi internet signal. Everything else worked as expected, including the PCM "apps."

Porsche deliberately excluded the sensors without informing buyers, and it appears that the "demo mode" of the eSIM card only provided a Wi-Fi internet signal for a couple of months. I set out to determine how to get PCM Wi-Fi.

Here are some things I learned on my journey that are not provided by the owner's manual. (My ignorance will shine through here, and that embarrasses me.)

The PCM's apps (including weather, parking, fuel prices, news, and Amazon music) rely on a telephone connection to the Internet. This telephone connection provides a "hotspot" for the PCM's Wi-Fi Internet signal. (I must've thought that the PCM Wi-Fi signal came from the heavens above, as I was not "cognizant" of the fact that it came from the phone line until I realized it couldn't come from anywhere else...)

After several months, literally, of back-and-forth between the Porsche dealers, AT&T, and the Porsche Car Connect operation (all of whom pointed their fingers at one another), AT&T sent me a hardware SIM card. It took over an hour on the phone with AT&T to get it activated properly, but finally I had a PCM Wi-Fi Internet signal.

My elation was short lived: fairly extensive testing showed that download speeds are 10 times faster on the "naked" smartphone (iPhone 12 in this case) than on the PCM Wi-Fi...about 80 Mbps vs. 8 Mbps download speeds. With no available evidence to the contrary, I will assume this is because the PCM's telephone signal is shared with the PCM apps. In retrospect, since Porsche might reasonably expect its owners to have smartphones and that those users might easily use the phone's Wi-Fi hotspot, it might make sense for Porsche to disable the PCM's Wi-Fi capability after an introductory period. (If only they had told me!)

Thinking that I had finally resolved this issue (if only to wind up where I had begun) I began using my cell phone's Wi-Fi hotspot to power apps like My Porsche. Yesterday I realized how stupid that was: the apps on my smart phone could simply use cellular data and avoid the Wi-Fi "hotspot" conversion.

In summary, here's what I learned:

Background:

- 1. If you want your PCM to have Wi-Fi, you may need to add a hardware SIM card.
- 2. Cellular data download speeds are 10 times those of the PCM's Wi-Fi,
- 3. App POIs displayed in the PCM depend on "Favorites" created on a smartphone in the My Porsche app, and PCM Wi-Fi is required to access them.
- 4. Apple CarPlay apps (and perhaps others) use Wi-Fi if it is available but may use cellular data if it is not. Problem:
- 1. How do we enable Apple CarPlay, etc., to use the faster cellular data download function, while still having access to the App POI's?

Solution:

- 1. Enable cellular data use for Apple CarPlay (and other) apps requiring Wi-Fi.
- 2. On the smartphone, require PCM Wi-Fi to "ask" to be enabled (rather than "auto-join").
- 3. Only enable PCM Wi-Fi when access to My Porsche "Favorites" or other apps is required.

Note: If you do not do Solution item #2, you will likely be using the slower download speeds afforded by the PCM's wi-fi.

I'm embarrassed to confess that it took me several months to figure this out. And, BTW, the PCM Wi-Fi had no internet signal "at all" until I added a hardware SIM card, which was another item that took several months to figure out. And my final note: for the PCM's App POI's to be available, you must disconnect Apple CarPlay.

Major League Baseball calls August 'the dog days of summer.' They've already played 120 games and have been at work for six months with only a few days off. And, it's the hottest and most humid time of the season!

PCA-SDR track junkies are experiencing their own 'dog days of summer.' After 4 exciting TT/DE weekends, we are in limbo as the temperatures at our desert tracks soar. In the last few years several of us have braved the heat and signed up with independent groups that offer track days on those courses that are still opened. Mornings are usually tolerable but, in the afternoon, you need to watch your gauges and cut your sessions short if the engine temperatures get too high.

With only one event, Willow Springs on May 28-29, to report on this quarter, I have decided to interview one of our long-time members and veteran drivers to learn about the Club's racing history, and get some tips on how to move up from the back of the pack.

Mike Avitt is a San Diego native, who went to school here and started drag racing a 1970 Ford Maverick in AHRA in 1972. He raced throughout the West Coast and traveled as far as St. Louis for the Gateway Nationals, setting several class records along the way. He eventually modified the car to compete in NHRA competition when the tracks in the West were converted to NHRA. After being competitive for a few years, a rule change would have required a \$10,000 engine rebuild to continue to be competitive. After drag racing for about 12 years, it was getting too expensive to continue

racing, the Maverick was sold to a racer in Texas, and Mike left the world of the straight ¼ mile drag strip.

Twelve years later, in 1994, he was driving an '85 Carrera near the 'Jack Murphy' Stadium and noticed something going on in the parking lot—a PCA-SDR autocross. His wife Angela said, "That looks like fun. You ought to try that." I am very proud of our wives and the support and encouragement that they provide when their husbands want to go racing. And I am especially proud of wives like Angela and my wife Kathy who go further in their support and join us at the autocrosses and at the tracks. They make racing feel like a family endeavor, not just a personal hobby.

Mike learned to AX from our excellent PCA-SDR instructors, as we all did, and soon was competitive in his class. After one year he felt that the stock 911 did not offer the opportunities to work on and improve the engine as he had done in his drag racing career, so he selected a 1986.5 Porsche 928 for its front engine configuration that matched his experience with the Maverick. "I knew it would not be much of an AX car, but I wanted to get into TT and Club racing. I added a race seat, a roll bar, headers and a chip and was ready for PCA Time Trials at Holtville and the stadium parking lot."

In 1997 he went to a POC TT at Willow Springs in his stock 928 with automatic transmission and street tires and did a 1:39 lap. (Side note: 25 years later in my Boxster S track car, I am just starting to do 1:39 laps on that track.) He continued to improve his TT times, switched to better tires and, in

1999, enrolled in the POC Racers Clinic and qualified to drive in real, wheel to wheel racing. After several years of POC racing, he decided it was time to convert the 928 to a real race car. He worked in his own shop with a friend, and they stripped out all of the extra weight from the car, removed sheet metal where they could, fabricated their own pieces and parts as necessary, added Lexan windows and a roll cage. "If I was going to do this right, I needed to replace the automatic transmission with a 5-speed manual. I worked with Mark Anderson at 928 International, and he said that I was just the second person that he had heard of that completed that conversion."

His first PCA club race was at Fontana in 2002. "To slow us down going into NASCAR Turn 1, they added some movable barriers. The problem was that the barriers were too light, and the wind caused by the cars going past the barriers moved them so there was only room for one car at a time through the barriers! They soon decided that it was safer to remove the barriers and let us go through turn 1 at racing speed." In 2002 he raced in both the PCA club races on the West Coast Series and the POC races. It was, "the busiest year of my racing career."

I asked him to go back to his early years on the track and recall some of the experiences that helped him become a better driver. He commented that he had a group of friends that went to the track with him and were doing about the same times. They worked with each other and compared ideas to help each other improve their times. He said that learning correct braking technique and "gaining the confidence to not lift going into the turns" were challenges for him in the early years. I found this very interesting since I have had the same problems and am still working on improving in these 2 areas. Also, I started improving my lap times when Kevin Sechrest, Brian Fraser, Alisha Wray and other members of the Boxster Brigade started going to a variety of TT events together and ran in the same run groups. Mike was 20 years ahead of us, but it was good to hear that we were on the same path and experiencing some of the same challenges that he did.

I also asked what advice he had for new Porsche owners or current owners that had just purchased a different Porsche. "Go to school," was the reply. "Get to the best school that you can find and learn what the car is capable of. The cars are far more capable than we are. You need to have someone show you those capabilities, so that when you get on the highway and something happens, you know how to get yourself out of a bad situation." After that first PDS, autocross, DE, or Porsche Experience event, further training is up to the individual. Some people will choose to progress through AX and DE to Time Trials, and even to Club Racing. But, "A lot of people will not want to beat up their very expensive cars by going to the track. If they went to an AX or a DE event every year or two, they could refresh their

skills and be prepared to handle emergency situations, like a spare tire from the SUV in front of you dropping in the middle of your lane on the freeway as you are driving at 70 mph!"

When I began participating in driving events in 2013, Mike was Time Trialing in a 2004 GT3. In 2015 he upgraded to a new GT3, and last year he moved up to a 2019 GT3RS and broke the track record for his class twice in his first two outings. With his history of starting in a stock 928 with no ABS or stability management systems, I wanted to know if he preferred driving 'no nannies' or drove with the latest stability controls engaged. Mike said he had no desire to return to the old days and always drove with the PASM engaged on his GT3RS, but that use of the nannies was dependent on the skill of the driver and the effectiveness of the system. "There is a big difference in the system on GT cars and what is available on the standard 911 model of the same year. When you begin driving, you should use the PASM to help you find the limits of the car and to 'save' it when you make mistakes. As you improve, the PASM will activate in a corner that you know that you can negotiate at a faster speed. When the system becomes intrusive, it is time to turn it off. The GT3 system is so efficient that only a professional driver would find it intrusive and turn it off for a better time. Once you learn to drive within the parameters of the system, it only makes you better. There have been several occasions where I have made a mistake (turn 8 at Willow Springs) and felt the rear end get loose, and the PASM made the corrections to keep me on track and saved me a lot of money. PASM is my insurance policy."

Finally, I asked for a single piece of advice that all of us could use to get better and improve our times. "Review the fundamentals," was the reply. "We all learn them, but just forget them from time to time. Sometimes it takes an instructor to sit with you and point those things out. I was driving at COTA with a pro-driver in the car, and he said, "You're not looking at the apex." We all know that we need to look at the apex, but sometimes we get so focused on looking further up the track that we forget the fundamental rules." When the dog days of summer are over, I am definitely going to spend a session or two concentrating on the fundamentals.

DRIVER EDUCATION AND TIME TRIAL AT BIG WILLOW

Our last racing event of the spring was held on May 28 and 29 at Willow Springs. The temperature was not a problem, but the winds were formidable. I helped Kathy walk across the paddock to the restrooms to keep her from being blown over by the 35+ mph gusts, and lap times were generally slower due to the winds. With only 48 drivers, the traffic was light in all 3 of the TT groups. The DE group only had 4 drivers, so they really had a great opportunity to work





on their car handling skills without being concerned about passing cars.

Several of us took advantage of DK Racing School's DK Precision Driving School held on Friday, May 27. Dwain Dement, who has driven over 100,000 laps at Big Willow, and his Co-Chief Driving Instructor, Martina Kwan run an excellent program of small group instruction geared to first-time drivers through experienced Time Trial drivers. The program included 3 hours of track time, an excellent track walk, detailed debriefings after each session, and lunch and dinner. For the past 2 years I have tried to find a group that was renting the track on Friday before each of our Time Trials. Getting an extra day of driving for each trip to the track has helped me improve my times and get used to sharing the track with cars that are much faster and, sometimes, even slower than mine. Getting an extra day at the same track, plus an excellent instruction program featuring professional drivers, was a double bonus! There will be another DK Precision Driving School before our September 17-18 DE/TT at Big Willow.

My Yellow Group (for the slower cars) had just 16 drivers. Newcomer, Jake Stone, coached by Mark Curran, had the fastest practice time in the group – 1:35.45. Another newcomer, Kirk Fertitta, with Terry Barnum's instruction,

recorded a 1:37.37, and Alberto Abreau in a Spec Boxster had a best time of 1:36.24. Victor Burns did a 1:41.11 in practice and won class CC08. Rory Davis ran a 1:39.08 with instructor Grant Graber and won class CC14. For comparison, the TTOD was 1:26.52 by Murray Wunderly, and the tenth fastest time was recorded by Vinh Ly in Class CC10 –1:33.58. I have included a picture of myself and my "almost twin brother," Harry Sullivan. Harry was born 3 days before I was and, when we are on the track, we raise the average of the Yellow group substantially! We may be older and slower but we are faster than the billions of drivers who have not attended a driving school since high school. Anyone can be a Porsche owner, but only attending a driving school, learning the limits of your car and how to control it in an emergency makes you a Porsche driver.

If you have made it all the way to the last page of this issue, I have a few requests: be sure to read Belle DuCharme's article on the Mystery Weekend, look for hidden Gulls in this issue and enter the contest, get registered for Big Willow in September, submit your votes for new board members, and watch your email for news of the return of PCA-SDR autocrosses! No matter what events you choose to participate in, you will always be a winner because, 'It's not just the cars, it's the people.'
