



August already—this year is moving right along, as they all seem to do these days. A hazard of getting older, I fear. Spring is long since behind us, and it was capped off by the Palm Springs Parade, hosted in La Quinta. For those unfamiliar, the Parade is our national PCA convention, which moves around the country each year. It was supposed to be here in 2020, but, well, I don't need to say much more about that. So it came this year instead. It was a good event, with all the usual activities: Concours, Autocross, TSD Rally, Gimmick Rally, Driving Tours and the Tech quiz, as well as all kinds of seminars and social events. We had 98 entrants from the San Diego Region, which was around 10% of the parade attendees, and by far the largest number from any individual region. WE ARE SDR! We even got lucky with the weather, it was mid-90s, when the week before and the week after it was triple digits all the way.

Speaking of cool, something very cool happened this year. History was made at the TSD Rally by SDR members! Two cars, one piloted by Paul Young Sr. and Paul Young Jr., and one by Lisa Gould and Jessica Toney, each got 0 points! (Lower is better in a TSD Rally.) And in the same class, too! This is triple history, really—the first time anybody has had a zero score at the Parade, the first time two cars have tied for best overall score, and the first time an all-woman team has won best overall in the Parade rally.

These are indeed the right people for this honor—75 % are from San Diego Region, 75% are "former" Parade Kids. (Lisa, Jessica, and Paul Jr. all grew up going to Parades), and all four have a long history with rallies as well as the Parade itself. The two Pauls even joined that exclusive club of winning best overall multiple times, having won it now with each as navigator and with each as driver.

In other Parade news, we had a terrific region party there, and I need to thank David Cardone for donating the wine, Anastasia Berta for obtaining the snacks and setting up the event, and Eric and Krishell Marc-Aurele for providing the space.

Looking forward, I'm very pleased to announce the return of Autocross and the Performance Driving School. We are signing contracts as I write this, intending to have several events before the end of the year at the amphitheater in Chula Vista. A big round of applause to Jason McClure and his team for making this happen!

Also up and coming is the return of our Concours on October 14 at our traditional location, Spanish Landing. Afshin Nayeri and Chris Waizman have taken over this challenge. I hope you support them by entering your car to be judged or bringing it down to display in the corral, and, of course, by volunteering!

Our social team (Emily Dearborn, Karen Garcia Raines, Marc & Christina Correll, Malcolm Jarvis, Janie de la Sierra, Anastasia Berta, and myself) will bring you many more events this year, including a Mystery Weekend, an additional Progressive Dinner, Last Tuesday Socials, and more tasting events as well.

SDR: Who We Were-Who We've Become

I've been the club historian for several years partially because I've been a member for 55 years, and have had the opportunity to serve on the BOD more times that I can remember, including SDR President twice. Susan, our Witness Editor, has asked me to write about our history. My column will cover six months at a time. As you'll see, SDR has always been an active and vibrant region.

SDR was chartered into the Porsche Club of America on December 26, 1957. It was the 7th region chartered, the first one on the West coast. As a side note, PCA was first started in September of 1955. The first meeting of PCA was held at Blackie's Grill in Alexandria, Virginia with thirteen prospective members. That became the Potomac Region. The club magazine "Porsche Panorama" that we all receive monthly was first published in December, 1955. But, enough about National PCA—back to our region.

Sadly, all of our region charter members are no longer with us. I feel honored to have known some of them, because the Region was only eleven years old when I became a member. They were truly dedicated members to the idea of driving Porsches (356 models) and the Porsche Club.

From 1957 to 1960 we really had no newsletter. The events were just talked about between members. There was always a faithful 10 or 12 cars that would show up at gatherings.

It was decided to put out a newsletter starting in 1961 to try to get more member participation. In March of '61 the name "Windblown Witness" was suggested and stuck for the newsletter. The cars were air cooled, so "Windblown" and "Witness" referred to getting information out to our members. The newsletter was just typed 2 or 3 pages and copies run off. Most of the info was about events or tech stuff like, wheel bearings, clearing fuel lines and carbs of water, carb balance with a tool called a Unisyn, or ignition timing. At that time, we had no advertisers in the Witness.

Picking up in 1961, some of the events on the schedule were a "Rally School" and "Economy Run" to the desert (Palm Springs). Others were a Mt. Palomar drive and a "Slalom" (Autocross). We were even autocrossing back then, all 356s. The Slalom was held at the Electro-Instruments Co. Kearny Mesa parking lot with 16 cars. A member named Dick Bauer had TTOD, with Tom Hauseur Sr. second. Tom would go on to chair the 1977 Porsche Parade here in San Diego. It was acclaimed to be the best Parade to date, and the only Parade to give two new Porsches away. Oh, I'm getting ahead of myself.


The President in '61 was Roland Johnson, Vice-president was Bill Blanchard, Joel Naïve was Treasurer, and Secretary was Wally Cole. His wife Bea Cole would go on to be our first woman president of SDR years later. Bea was wonderful, I have many fond memories of her I'll share in the future.

Stuttgart Market Letter

If we're taking the market's temperature, June would appear hot as we achieved 2023 highs in our dollar volume and unit volume, thanks to \$20m in sales and nine new auction records at Broad Arrow Auction's 75th Anniversary Porsche sale held in Atlanta mid-month. But take out this once-every-five-year auction event, and the market looks as cool as it did in May, with a 70% sell-through rate and just over \$30m in sales.

Highlights from the 75th Anniversary sale were plenty, but one real standout was the sale of a 1999 996 Coupe for \$1.2m. This car wasn't just any 996 for that kind of money, but the 996 Classic Club Coupe project dreamed up by the Porsche Club of America and Porsche's *Sonderwunsch* department. Built to showcase what Porsche's "Special Wishes" program is capable of, the Classic Club Coupe features a GT3 engine and drivetrain, a custom interior, and an exterior designed with nods to the 911 Carrera 2.7 RS and Carrera GT. And the buyer of this world record 996? None other than Jerry Seinfeld.

We also saw this auction buck the trend of historic Porsche race cars failing to sell this year, with a 1964 904 Carrera GTS selling for \$2,535,000 and a 1984 962 in Coca-Cola livery with both 24 Hours of Daytona and 12 Hours of Sebring history selling for \$1,270,000. One notable no-sale, however, was a 1967 910 that failed to sell at a final bid of \$2,300,000. \$200,000 short of the recent 910 sale on Bring a Trailer.

The Carrera GT market continued to soften as two examples crossed the block this month. The first, a 2005 example with 16,765 miles, sold for just over \$1m at \$1,028,000, about \$200k shy of where comps with similar mileage were not too long ago. And the second, a 2004 example finished in Speedster Blue by Porsche Classic partner Porsche North Houston sold for \$1,462,500. An impressive number, but considering rare colors were all \$2m cars this time last year, reasonably light.

Also showing signs of softening for the second month in a row is the 992 GT3 market. Save for the one example that sold at the Broad Arrow sale for \$300,000, all others continued to slide with an average selling price of \$255,000 and a market low of \$177,250. We also saw the first 2023 992 GT3 RS come up for auction, failing to sell at a high bid of \$415,000. GT4 RS' also continued its downward trend, with one example failing to sell at a high bid of \$230,000 and the other finding a home at \$245,000.

On the classic side of the market, 356s showed mixed results with a 64% sell-through rate compared to last month's 88%, but those that did sell kept the momentum going pricewise as they continued to trend up. Notable 356 auctions this month include a 1964 356 SC Cabriolet that sold for \$215,600 and a 1958 356A Sunroof Coupe built by Rod Emory that failed to sell at an eye-watering \$699,356.

The modern classics, especially the 993 market, were the biggest mover in June, with a 993 Turbo S selling for an above-average price of \$560,000 and your standard 993 coupes averaging \$100,000. We also saw a new five-year record for 993 Turbos, with a 645-mile example selling for \$486,000 on Bring a Trailer.

With no headlining auctions on the calendar for July, it will be interesting to see if the market stays consistent at its ~70% sell-through rate and \$30m in sales before we head into the summer heat of August with Pebble Beach where all major auction houses will be bringing out the big guns. We'll see our first 911 reimagined by Singer we've seen in a while, crossing the block at RM Sothebys and a 1966 906 at Bonhams.

Soon it was time to head for our next destination. Everyone gathered in front of the house where Emily gave us instructions on how to make our way to our next destination, the home of Michael and Gail Chobotov. She reminded everyone to be sure to make the final turn up the driveway to their home. We applauded and thanked Craig and Maya, then mounted up for the drive to Michael and Gail's.

The Chobotov's home was located in a gated community on a hilltop in Carlsbad. Porsches were lined up at the gate, where, after every few cars, the gates would close and the memory of the driver was tested. Did they remember the gate code? Some needed help. Despite Emily's warning to make sure to turn up the hill to the Chobotov's, at least one group toured a little more of the neighborhood than expected, which amused some of the locals out walking their dogs. Eventually, everyone found their way, parked and walked the last few steps to the lawn where a mobile gourmet pizza oven was being minded by the staff from **Buona Forchetta**.

The Chobotovs moved to Carlsbad from Santa Rosa a few years ago, after they lost their home in the wild fires that devastated some of California's finest wine country. Gall said this new home reminded them of their home in Santa Rosa. It is gracious and beautiful.

They have a panoramic view of San Diego, east from Encinitas and Rancho Santa Fe and sweeping westward past downtown San Diego, all the way to Laguna Hills in the north. 
The sun had set, so we missed some of their gorgeous view. Their house is built into the hillside which allows you to feel surounded by the countryside.



In the United States, most people know how to swim. They took lessons or learned from their parents when they were children and are safe in pools and calm water. Those who lived near water or whose families participated in water activities, became better swimmers by watching others and practicing their skills. They are good swimmers who can safely navigate longer distances, and larger, calm bodies of water. Most people in the United States also know how to drive. At age 16 they learned to drive from their parents or Driver Education in high school. With practice and experience many became good drivers. Those who lived in northern states even learned car control as they drove on snow and ice. These good drivers are safe in normal road conditions, but have not been trained to react to emergency situations or extreme weather conditions.

Many teens take swimming instruction to become life-guards or swimming instructors. These classes teach advanced swimming techniques and include training to make the students stronger swimmers. They learn how to save themselves and others in water emergencies, how to recognize unsafe conditions, apply safety measures, and how to react to dangerous situations at any swimming venue. Porsche drivers can learn advanced techniques and how to react in emergency situations at a Porsche Driving School, Autocross, or Driver Education event sponsored by PCA-SDR. These events teach proper car control using a variety of exercises that allow students to feel how their car reacts as it reaches and, sometimes, exceeds its cornering and braking capabilities. These exercises are done at low speed in

large open areas that minimize the possibility of damage to you or your car.

Those who really enjoy swimming may choose to further their swimming ability on a high school team. Here they receive advanced training in the most effective way to swim faster, further, smoother, and with less effort. High school teams compete with other teams, but the primary focus for most of these swimmers is lowering their personal best times in each event. PCA drivers who have completed the required PDS, AX, and/or DE training can also graduate into competitive driving via the Time Trial program. TT events are held on dedicated racetracks with professional corner workers and safety equipment. Drivers are assigned to one of three groups based upon their speed and experience. Although there could be 25 cars on the track at one time, drivers are NOT racing each other to get to the checkered flag. Passing on the track is strictly controlled, and the goal is to improve your personal best lap time and to return to the paddock with your car in the same shape as when it left. PCA-SDR holds 7 of these events a year at tracks in Southern California.

The best high school swimmers are already, or soon will be, joining a swimming club that trains all year round. The coaching is, generally, at a higher level, and the swimmers are still trying to improve their times, but also are racing their competition. The best swimmers move on to college teams where they remain amateurs, but may race against professionals in national and international meets. The top

professionals compete at the highest level of the sport and may earn millions of dollars. The best Time Trial competitors may decide to move up to real, wheel-to-wheel racing. PCA, SCCA, NASA, and POC provide additional training to prepare experienced drivers for rolling starts, open passing and racing for the checkered flag. Drivers in these club events can move to higher levels of competition, just like the swimmers, and drive in PRO/AM and international, professional racing series.

Hopefully this series of analogies helps our new PCA-SDR members understand the driver training opportunities available to them and the importance of progressing beyond being a "good driver." Anyone can be a Porsche owner, but it takes additional training to be a Porsche driver!

When you receive this magazine, registration for the September 16-17 Time Trial at Willow Springs International Raceway will already be opened. Sign-up as soon as possible if you want to get a spot on the grid. The next event that will include a DE session with the TT will be October 21-22 at Chuckwalla Valley Raceway. Go to our website at www.pcasdr.org. Under the heading COMPETITION, sub-heading DE/TT, you can find all the information you need to register, classify your car, get tech inspections, and get on the track. You can also contact the people listed on the registration form for individual help with the registration process. There are plans for a PDS and maybe an Autocross in Chula Vista in the fall, but you should definitely begin getting yourself and your car ready if you want to take advantage of the great instruction provided by the club's excellent driving instructors.

I have just learned that DK Precision Driving School will be offering their excellent program at Willow Springs on September 15. Dwain Dement and Martina Kwan are professional drivers and instructors who actually live on a ranch just outside of the Willow Springs main gate. They have done over 100,000 laps on the Big Willow track and share their experience with drivers of all levels from beginners (Level 1) who have never been on the track to experienced drivers (Level 5) with more than 20 Track Days. I have taken this course more than once and always learn something new whenever I have Martina or Dwain in my car. Willow Springs, April 22-23 Results

On Saturday morning we welcomed 8 students to the Big Willow track at Willow Springs Raceway. Four of them had participated in the DE program before and 4 were new to the big track experience. All 8 of them spent the first driving session in the classroom, learning the rules and procedures of racetrack driving. These 8 drivers were assigned to the Green Group and were the only drivers on the


track during Green Group sessions. Their first 20-minute session was a low speed, Ducks in a Row exercise. They followed a lead instructor, with their instructors in the car, as the leader modeled the ideal line around the track. In the next session they practiced proper passing technique and etiquette. In the following 3 sessions on Saturday and 4 on Sunday, each student drove with their instructor and worked on learning the line, experiencing how their cars handled at speed, and building speed as they became more comfortable with their driving ability.

This was one of the best weather weekends we have had at Willow Springs. The temperatures and winds were moderate, and the number of entries was low. My Yellow run group had about 20 drivers which was not bad for a 2.5 mile, 9-turn road course. Last May I did my best time, 1:40.80, at this track but have not been able to crack 1:40 in my last 4 visits. I always seem to run well on the first half of the track, through turn one and the Rabbit's Ear, and then fail to stay on throttle through turns 8 and 9 or run well on the back half and over-slow on the entries to turns one and two. My best time for the weekend was 1:42.85. The winning time for my Class was 1:35.95 by Eric Marc-Aurele. Even if I get to 1:39, I still have a big gap to close before I am competitive. That is why this article is called The View from the Back, and why I can't wait to get back to Willow Springs in September!

We did have some Yellow group drivers that won their class at Big Willow—Blake Bastain was first in Class CC05 driving a 1999 Boxster and his father, Mark, was first in CC07 in his 2004 Boxster S. Michelle Huxhold won Class CC10L in a 2014 Cayman S, and David Aberizk rounded out the Yellow group winners with first place in SS08, driving his stock 2020 Carrera S.

After a weekend off, most of us loaded our cars and embarked on a trip to Chuckwalla Valley Raceway near Desert Center, California. The town is aptly named, since it is located 50 miles west of Indio and 50 miles east of Blythe, in the middle of the desert. The track is 2.68 miles long, has 17 turns and can be run clockwise or counterclockwise. Sixty-seven drivers recorded times in the Red, Orange, and Yellow time trial groups, and 6 DE students, with instructors on board, drove in a fourth, Green Group.

Some of us took advantage of a track sponsored Test and Tune day on Friday, May 5th. A Test and Tune day is not a part of our PCA-SDR DE/TT weekend. It is an opportunity for anyone who wants to pay for an extra day of track time to test different suspension and engine settings, learn the track, experiment with different track lines, or just get more racing experience. Chuckwalla scheduled Open Passing sessions on the hour, starting at 9:00 AM, and Point by Passing sessions starting on the half hour. You can drive as much as you want to. Drive a few laps, come in and make a change, and go back out to test the effect of the change. For the past several years I have searched to see who is renting



a track on the Friday before each of our events. If I am going to tow the car for several hours to get to the track, I like to get 3 days of track time whenever possible. The extra track time has helped me move from the bottom of the Yellow group to the middle, but I still have a long way to go to reach the Orange group.

We drove clockwise this weekend and had 19 drivers that had lap times under two minutes which shows how much our drivers have improved over the years. It was great to see PCA Club Racer and former club president, Dan Carusillo, back at the track. He took advantage of the \$100 SDR Award he won in the 2022 Awards Banquet raffle to lower his entry fee. Also, great seeing Club Racer Phil Strong get a full weekend of racing from his rebuilt 2003 996 C2, and to welcome back Diane Cafferata who was instructing a new student driver. Finally, we were all glad to see Steve Grosekemper return from an extended illness and place ninth overall in his 1982 911SC.

The fastest time of the 20 Red group drivers was shared by Daniel Fefferman driving a 2020 SR3XX and Walter Vasquez in his 2021 992 GT3 Cup car. They both did a 1:45.88 in the practice runs. Bryant Nguyen was third in his 2005 996 GT3 Cup at 1:47.77.

Top times in the Orange group were Victor Murray, 1:52.32, 2019 Cup; Lee Schwartz, 1:56.95, 2021 718 GT4; and Skip Motsenbocker, 1:57.75,2021 GT4. There were 23 drivers in this group.

Leading the 24 Yellow group drivers was Kevin Morse, in just his third TT weekend. Kevin did a 2:02.47 in his 2011 997.2 GT3. Mike Jennings, in his first Time Trial, recorded a 2:05.93 driving a 2021 BMW M2C, and Oliver Weber, also in his third TT, drove his 2018 718 Boxster GTS to the

third fastest Yellow Group time of 2:06.56. It is great to see these new drivers getting up to speed so quickly, and we hope they will continue to compete and bring some of their friends with them.

And, finally, I have some swell news for Autocross Drivers. Autocross chairman Jason McClure received board approval to rent the North Island Credit Union Amphitheatre parking lot in Chula Vista to evaluate it as a potential AX site. On May 28, about 25 AX instructors, starters, and timing volunteers assembled to test two track configurations designed by Marcus Kramer and Andrew Simmons. The facility has two separate parking lots joined by narrow connecting roads, ample space for a paddock area, first-rate, permanent restrooms, and a sloping area that creates a nicely banked turn. The instructors spent the day driving one course clockwise and another course counterclockwise. They stopped frequently to make safety adjustments and work on slowing the cars sufficiently to make a safe transition from one lot to the other. By using both lots they were able to produce fastest lap times in the low 50 second range. Not as good as Qualcomm but still much longer than the autocrosses that some other clubs are running. The instructors and CDIs agreed that this facility has potential as a PDS and AX site. The only caveat is that is not available until the fall. If you are an AX fan or would like to get started autocrossing, SCCA and some other groups are hosting AX events at the Storm Stadium in Lake Elsinore.

Hope to see some new faces at the track in September and October. If you have been persuaded by these articles to improve your car control skills and become a safer, more aware driver, introduce yourself at Willow Springs or Chuckwalla, and I will have a nice surprise for you.




